Marysville Just Lose Thriller

On a perfect afternoon for football the crowd began to grow early as the Auskick kids took to the field and entertained with a great display of skills, and a with good crowd of parents and onlookers footy was alive and well in Marysville.

In the main game Woori Yallock won the toss and kicked with a slight breeze and started well winning the clearances but the villains defence held strong and scored the first goal to Frank Moate who was playing his first game for Marysville for 28 years.
