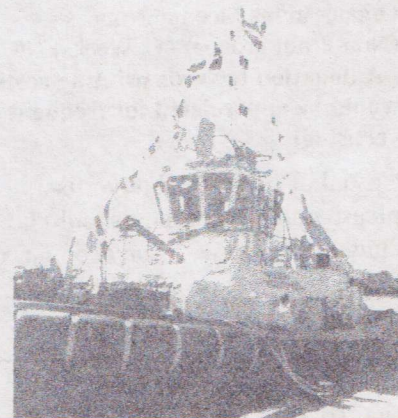
I am sure that Jesse, Shay, Mikela, Baden & Isaac will savor the meeting of the princess as will Ms Abbey, Mr &
