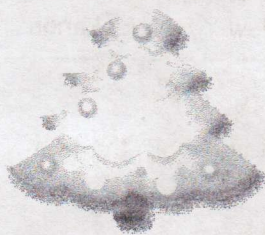

Narbethong will lead triangle trail construction

Construction of the Narbethong Nature Trail will commence early next year
following the appointment of the Triangle Community Trails project manager
recently.

DSE project manager Simon Gough will lead the implementation of the \$1.5
million project which will see the construction of three new trails in Buxton,
Taggerty and Narbethong.

Mr Gough has previously managed DSE's fire recovery project in Marysville
and surrounding areas.

"Preparations and planning are progressing well and we are anticipating that
works on the Narbethong trail will commence in the near future," he said.

The Triangle Community Trails project is being jointly managed by the De-
partment of Sustainability and Environment (DSE) and Murrindindi Shire
Council and is funded by the Victorian Bushfire Appeal Fund (VBAF) and
Department of Planning and Community Development (DPCD).

Murrindindi Shire Cathedral Ward Councillor Kevin Bellingham said much
work had been done behind the scenes in preparedness for the commence-
ment of the project, including a community consultation plan.

"As the project rolls out we will be making contact with a range of stake-
holders to inform them of the construction schedule," he said. "Throughout
the life of the project residents, visitors and other stakeholders can also seek
information about the project by emailing any questions they may have to a
special email address which has been established."

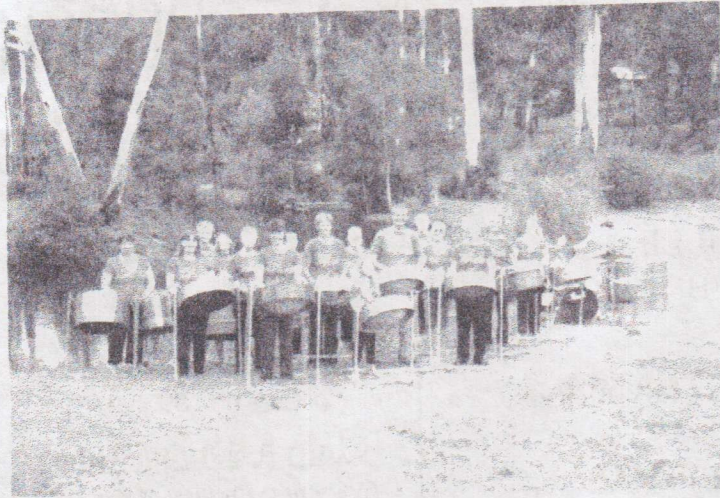

Cr Bellingham said good progress had been made in preparing the Narbe-
thong leg of the project for works.

"The Narbethong works are ready to commence in the new year, and we will
continue to progress the approvals for the Taggerty and Buxton works, in-
cluding cultural heritage assessments. "The trails will provide easy and ac-
cessible infrastructure for health, fitness and enjoyment.

"There will also be a significant tourism aspect as the trails take in some of
the wonderful natural attractions of the triangle area," he said.

You are invited to join **PANS ON FIRE** to celebrate the launch of their first CD "*Recovery*" on Tuesday, December 27th at the RAC building in Marysville, starting at 2 pm.

Formed in early 2010 as part of a bushfire related community music project, the 23 band members rehearse once a week and have a repertoire of varied musical styles that include Calypso, Afro, Samba, Gypsy folk music, Classical and Jazz.

During the past two years *Pans on Fire* has actively contributed to events throughout the Triangle area. As their popularity and 'fame' has spread they have been invited to play at a number of events outside the area including the BMW Edge in Federation Square, the Benalla Summer Festival and more recently at the CaribVic Family Day in Fairfield, Melbourne, which was an invitation from the Association of the Caribbean Community of Victoria – a great compliment. They have made two television appearances on Vasilis's Garden and Great Stories, both Channel 31 programs.

The launch of the *Pans on Fire* CD "*Recovery*" will start the fundraising for the first National Steelband Festival of Australia to be held in Marysville in March 2013. Preparations are well underway and contacts with other steelbands around the country and in New Zealand have been established.

Recovery by *Pans on Fire* features a number of "non-pan" cameo performances; local musician Joe Talia on guitar; Trinidadian legend Courtney Leiba on percussion; Josh Licht on drums; Peter Gill on tambourine and sleigh bells; Chris Muir on saxophone; and Lisa Nolte on vocals.

We would like to thank Di James and the Brandragon Morris dance group who won the RRR Radiothon Band Prize of a free day at the NewMarket recording studio in Melbourne and who then donated it to Pans on Fire. A big thank you also goes to Joe Talia who completed the recording at his studio in Taggerty and Luke Donovan for his design of the CD cover and poster.

"*Recovery*" will be available before Xmas for just \$15.00 from the Marysville Visitor Centre, the Marysville Lolly Shop and other fine retailers in the Triangle area. You can also contact the band via the band's website, www.trianglesteebands.com to obtain a copy.
