Wirreanda Children's Festival

The word Wirreanda means different things to many of us. To some, it's a smash-up derby, to others it is fireworks, a parade, open gardens, and art show. You may remember the photographic competition or a fish-out.

A search of the web suggests Wirreanda means 'place where wallabies meet under tall trees'.

Last Saturday, Wirreanda meant children.

This year's Wirreanda Children's Festival focussed entirely on our young people. Guided by a local Wirreanda Advisory Group, Berry Street's Community Support team co-ordinated a festival that they hoped would bring joy to local children and create positive memories for the future.

The day-long festival was introduced by local Kids and Mum's steel band, Jammin'. Uncle Roy gave a welcome to country and encouraged involvement in a smoking ceremony. Sharen and Glenys from the advisory group then spoke from the heart about the importance of the local festival.

The Mad Hatter invited everyone to

his Tea Party and was ably assisted in pouring-out duties by Alice, the superbly dressed Queen of Hearts and a rather excitable White Rabbit.

Triangle schools Marysville, Taggerty and Buxton each contributed an act for the audience of proud families and friends.

Marysville's circus was a joyful, upbeat show that had everyone wanting to join in. Taggerty delighted everyone with their skills on the steel pans and Buxton showed great confidence and talent on voice and ukulele with the 'Tree Song' they had penned for the Year of the Forest.

Artist and children's book illustrator Katz Cowley wowed the ELF crowd with her engaging rendition of the Wonkey Donkey and then joined Bruno to judge the adults colouring competition with charm and wit.

The hat parade was well supported, with around 40 entrants competing to win books for the hat-makers schools.

The Banana Brothers skilfully wove their magic around performers and audience to keep the atmosphere bubbling.

The Marysville and District Lions Club provided a festival menu while the guides and pre-school families were kept busy with raffles, slices and ducks.

In the main community marquee engaging activities included hat making, indigenous



facepainting, sand art and boomerang etching.

Up on the lake the Surrey Park Model Boat Club delighted kids of all ages with some large remote control boats, at the horse yards the Saddletramps gave a riding display, across the playspace the market added to the festive atmosphere and the surrounding parklands looked great.

Pans on Fire closed the festival just in time for the running of the annual Pre-school duck race.

Dog and cat registrations are due as at 10 April 2012.

The State Government via the *Domestic Animals Act, 1994*, places a requirement on Council to ensure that all dogs/cats within the municipality are registered.

It is very important that owners of animals register their pets after the age of three months and ensure that the animal is micro-chipped, for future identification and to assist Council Officers returning animals to their owners.

Renewal notices have been sent out to all residents that currently have animals registered on Council's system to renew their animal's registration.

Fees for dog and cat registration are as follows:

- Unsterilised dog or cat \$96.00
- Sterilised dog or cat \$32.00 (proof of sterilisation is required)
- Pension Concession-Unsterilised dog or cat \$48.00
- Pension Concession-Sterilised dog or cat \$16.00

If your animal has been micro-chipped; over 10 years of age; a working dog (rural properties only), discount fees apply of \$16.00

If any circumstances have changed in relation to your animal or should you have any queries regarding animal registration, please contact Sharon Webb at Council's Alexandra Office on 5772 0366.

New patients welcome

Beyond Bushfires is a 5-year study working to understand how people and communities are getting by after the February 2009 bushfires and what helps them through this process. The study focuses on health and wellbeing in rural communities across Victoria. We need to include people who have and have not been affected by fires to get a full understanding of impacts and experiences.

The main areas we are investigating are:

- how people and communities are getting by after the Victorian 2009 bushfires
- how community members support each other
- the links between individual and community wellbeing

To make the results of this study as useful as possible for your community; it is really important that as many current and past residents (2009 onwards) as possible participate. We would love to hear from everyone; adults, secondary aged children and parents/guardians on behalf of primary school aged children.

Certain communities have been selected to be invited to be part of the study to reflect a diversity of experiences and exposure to bushfire. We will send letters about the study to people on the electoral roll in these areas (see attached flyer). The letters will be posted in April and May and surveys can then be completed over the phone or online. There will also be opportunities for some people to be involved in interviews at a later date. Please help us to spread the word about the research to make sure everyone has an opportunity to participate. We are very disappointed we do not have the resources to work directly with all affected communities but for those who are not part of the selected communities there is still an opportunity to be on the study mailing list to receive regular updates to the study, contribute to facebook discussions and send in photos and images for our website. We will be providing information back to participants and communities about the research findings throughout the five years of the study and beyond.

Mayor's Chair

The four community information sessions covering the Council's Services Review have been interesting and informative. People have properly sought clarification on costings and the process and have raised concerns relating to the level of rates and the operations and services of the Council.

We have taken all the matters on board and we anticipate other issues will also be presented up to 31 March 2012 when we will be consolidating all responses as part of our budget development.

Clearly we need all the help we can get to manage the upgraded stock of buildings and other community facilities. At Marysville we were asked how the Community can assist Council in its endeavours to gain more support from other tiers of Government.

Firstly, we will achieve the best outcome if we speak as one community and concentrate on the major problem. It has been acknowledged that it is not realistic to expect the resi-

dents of Murrindindi to carry the whole burden of operating, maintaining and providing funds for long term renewal of all the new assets. But now we need Government to implement an assistance package as recommended by the KPMG report. This is the basic message that we all need to get across. The simplest and quickest way is to write to your local State and Federal representatives outlining the problem as described in the information sessions and letters to residents and to ask for early support. Please also take any opportunities, as we Councillors do, to raise the issue during meetings and visits by Ministers and Departmental heads at official functions.

In doing the above, it is best to keep your arguments clear and precise. From recent experience I know when a person's passion means their points are made within a spate of accusation or abuse, it is hard to concentrate on their underlying issues.

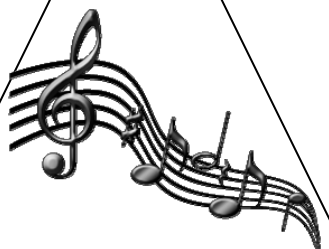

Buxton Reserve News

As you will have noticed, much has been happening at the Buxton Reserve in recent months with the Reserve upgrade. Most noticeable is that the road works have been done and bollards placed around the parking area. Bollards are soon to be placed along the Mareeba Ave side. Once this is done it will prevent cars from driving on the grassed areas. The next stage that the Committee is presently working on is the ordering and planting of trees and shrubs in the Reserve, partially to replace some of those lost in the storm last year, but also some new plantings to enhance the reserve.

Improvements to the toilets and the tennis shed have also been done in recent months and a solar security light has been installed near the play area.

Perhaps having the most impact on the Reserve was the storm last November when many of the large trees were blown down. The Council received funding for the removal of the fallen trees and for cleaning up the area. The contractors employed to do the work did an excellent job of clearing the area.

Of concern to many in the community was the fire hazard of the river conservation area that had been neglected for many years. Since the storm and the removal of much of the vegetation along the river by the contractors the Reserve Committee has had two very successful working bees to remove and burn much of the smaller debris along the river bank. We will need a further working bee in coming weeks to finish the job. On behalf of the Reserve Committee, I would like to sincerely thank all those friends of the reserve that have come along to the working bees to work hard for about an hour and a half and enjoy a BBQ at the conclusion. At the recent working bee last Sunday there were about 20 people present and a lot was achieved in a short time. The whole river frontage is now more accessible for people to be able to enjoy its beauty.

The Committee is presently exploring avenues to re-establish a conservation area along the river, and also will develop a management plan to ensure it remains safe. More details will be made public once they are known.

Amnesty period on open air burning in Residential areas

Murrindindi Shire Council and the Municipal Fire Prevention Committee has granted a two week fire amnesty period following the conclusion of the CFA's Declared Fire Danger Period, which concludes on 13 March 2012.

Council's 'amnesty period' will commence from 24 March until 10 April 2012 (includes the Easter holiday period) and this will allow residents to burn off any vegetation material such as tree limbs, cuttings and dried leaves accumulated over the summer period.

Residents in residential areas are encouraged to carry out controlled burning, fires are to be no more than 1 metre diameter by 1 metre high. Council Local Laws prohibit lighting fires that cause a nuisance, such as excessive smoke.

No windrows are to be lit without a permit.
