Funding success for youth projects

The Murrindindi Youth Partnership Group have been successful in their bid for funding under the Youth Bushfire Response Gift allocated by the Department of Human Services Office for Youth, and administered by Murrindindi Shire Council.

Community and Customer Services Portfolio spokesperson Cr Cris Ruhr said that the projects that have been funded meet specific criteria overseen by the Youth Partnership Group to create momentum with the Murrindindi Youth Strategy 2012-2015.

"The Murrindindi Youth Partnership Group re-formed in late 2011 to facilitate implementation of the youth strategy key findings," he said.

The successfully funded projects include:

A 12 month fund to support Berry Street with Artists in Cathedral

Cluster schools for mental health and emotional wellbeing.

Extension to Council's Coordinator Youth Development position for 12 months to focus on coordinating implementation of the recently updated youth strategy.

Funding for Kildonan Uniting Care to employ a Project Officer for 12 months to deliver a range of youth participation projects and engage with community and stakeholders based on guidance from the Murrindindi Youth Partnership group.

The 12 month engagement of a project coordinator for the Yea High School Wellbeing and Careers Hub. A project that will target disadvantaged students aged 14 – 19 and provide therapeutic counselling activities, careers planning and mentoring.

Alexandra Secondary School

received funding to re-employ the part time TRIBES Educator for the Cathedral Cluster of Schools during 2012. This person will work with school communities to reinvigorate TRIBES activities, re-embed TRIBES values and promote them within the broader community. TRIBES comes with a number of learning activities and the following shared values: mutual respect; attentive listening; appreciations/no put downs; personal best; and right to pass.

The Murrindindi Youth Partnership will continue to provide strategic direction and collaborative solutions to improve youth service delivery throughout 2012 and beyond. Council adopts Youth Strategy

Murrindindi Shire Council adopted the Murrindindi Youth Strategy 2012-2015 at its ordinary meeting of council on Monday 26 March.

The Murrindindi Youth Strategy will provide a framework for Council to facilitate and support the key priorities highlighted from consultation with young people and key community stakeholders.

Community and Customer Services portfolio spokesperson Cr Cris Ruhr said that the Murrindindi Youth Strategy will require a community-based approach that will involve young people, service providers, community groups, schools and parents working together to provide the best outcomes for young people.

"It is essential that communities continue to recognise the significance of young people within our Shire and work collectively with Council to build a bright future," said Cr. Ruhr.

"Crucial to this Strategy is the recognition of the continuing impact of the 2009 bushfires on young people, their families and their communities. The trauma, loss of life, homes and community infrastructure has had an ongoing effect on young people which should be carefully considered when planning for the future."

Cr Ruhr said the Murrindindi Youth Partnership group re-formed in 2011 to provide the governance structure to oversee the implementation of the strategy.

"The youth strategy has six key focus areas: Health and Wellbeing; Education, Training and Employment; Recreation, Activities and Events; Leadership, Participation and Citizenship and Effective Services and Supports and Transportation," he said.

The strategy has been presented in a series of three documents consisting of: Summary Document; Youth Strategy and Research and Data Collection. All three documents are available for review on council's youth website at www.youthmurrindindi.com.

Enjoy a guided walk at Cathedral

Locals and visitors are invited to explore the Cathedral Range State Park on a guided Parks Victoria walk on Wednesday 11 April.

The walk is not for the faint hearted and will take you to the top of North Jawbones peak, offering spectacular views of the surrounding area.

The Cathedral Range was severely impacted by the 2009 bushfire, however the regrowth in the park is lush and there are many special sights to see as the environment adapts and flourishes after recent wet seasons.

This walk and further planned walks are supported by People and Parks Foundation, which is working in collaboration with Parks Victoria on projects in the park. The main project at Cathedral Range is the construction of a new walking track that is expected to open later this year. This 'Green Connections Project' is one of two redeveloping fire damaged settings within the Shire of Murrindindi.

"People who took part in the last walk really delighted in getting out in nature and enjoying each other's company on the walk," said Amanda Daw from the People and Parks Foundation.

"Spending time in the natural environment is good for our health - physically, mentally and emotionally - as well as being fun."

Cathedral Range State Parks offers visitors a range of walks, from a relaxing stroll along the river, to hiking and rockclimbing to scale the highest peaks.

Further guided walks will be held in Autumn and Winter 2012 to explore other areas of the park.

Dog/Cat registrations are due as of the 10 April 2012.

The State Government via the Domestic Animals Act, 1994, places a requirement on Council to ensure that all dogs/cats within the municipality are registered.

It is very important that owners of animals register their pets after the age of **three (3) months and ensure that the animal is micro-chipped**, for future identification and to assist Council Officers returning animals to their owners.

Renewal notices have been sent out to all residents that currently have animals registered on Council's system to renew their animal's registration.

Fees for dog & cat registration are as follows:

- Unsterilised dog or cat \$96.00
- Sterilised dog or cat \$32.00 (proof of sterilization is required)
- Pension Concession-Unsterilised dog or cat \$48.00
- Pension Concession-Sterilised dog or cat \$16.00

If your animal has been micro-chipped; over 10 years of age; a working dog (rural properties only), discount fees apply of \$32.00

If any circumstances have changed in relation to your animal or should you have any queries regarding animal registration, please contact Sharon Webb at the Shire offices at Alexandra on (03) 5772 0366.

Mayor's Chair

The Council's Services Review has been undertaken with an aim of limiting any increase in the total rates revenue for the Shire to 6% or less per annum for the next ten years.

That limitation defines the size of the "pie". The share of the "pie", that is, the actual rate charged to each ratepayer, is determined from a consideration of the relative value of each property. With changes in property values there will be changes to the share of the total rates revenue to be paid by each rate payer.

Property values are, by law, revised every two years. 2012 is a review year and thus while the total rates revenue collected by Council will increase by no more than 6%, individual rate charges for 2012-13 may be greater or less than 6% more than last year depending on whether the property valuation has increased more or less than the average since the last review.

Without making provision for the operation, maintenance and long

term renewal of our assets we will repeat incidents such as the current high cost work to repair the Yea Hall and the Breakaway Bridge - two projects now able to be undertaken because the State Government introduced new grant programs to add to already available funds to assist with such repairs.

We can't continue to hope that our assets hold out until fortuitous grant funds are established. We need to have some control over our own destiny and that is the aim of building up our repair and replacement funds.

Our new assets provide opportunities to increase our social and economical well-being and to encourage more people to come into the Shire. We need to work together to ensure we make maximum use of them and achieve the great benefits they can provide.

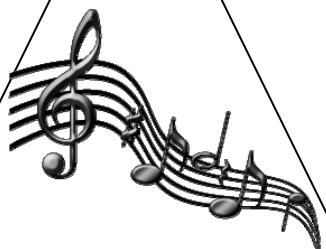

**Amnesty period on open air burning in Residential areas**

Murrindindi Shire Council and the Municipal Fire Prevention Committee has granted a two week fire amnesty period following the conclusion of the CFA's Declared Fire Danger Period, which concludes on 13 March 2012.

Council's 'amnesty period' will commence from 24 March until 10 April 2012 (includes the Easter holiday period) and this will allow residents to burn off any vegetation material such as tree limbs, cuttings and dried leaves accumulated over the summer period.

Residents in residential areas are encouraged to carry out controlled burning, fires are to be no more than 1 metre diameter by 1 metre high. Council Local Laws prohibit lighting fires that cause a nuisance, such as excessive smoke.

No windrows are to be lit without a permit.

## Councillor Comment

### Services your Council provides

As we are reviewing Council services I thought listing them would be informative. The services delivered by Council can be roughly divided into three broad types, although there is some overlap between categories.

Firstly there are those services or functions which Council has a legal obligation to perform as a responsible authority under legislation. These include:

Domestic animal control, building regulation by Municipal Building Surveyor, septic tank approvals and inspections, health inspections and food premises registrations, local law enforcement, municipal emergency management, fire prevention planning, land use planning approvals and inspections, planning scheme enforcement and amendments, subdivision control, rate collection and property valuation.

Secondly there are those services where Council has more discretion over the extent it is involved in the service, but is required to comply with legislation in the delivery of the service.

These include: Building approvals and inspections, strategic land use planning, construction and maintenance of roads, bridges, footpaths and other transport and community infrastructure, traffic control, provision of public buildings and facilities (for example public halls), quarry management, operation of recycle recovery centres and landfill, garbage and recycling collection, environmental management and animal pound operations.

Finally there is a range of services that Council chooses to provide where there is not a legislative requirement for Council to provide the service.

These include: Council reception/customer services, family day care, maternal and child health, health promotion, service eligibility assessments, care co-ordination, home care, meals on wheels, home maintenance services, respite care, social support groups, senior citizens centres, swimming pools, community bus services, leisure centres, youth services, fixed and mobile library services, library programs/events, parks and gardens maintenance including shelters and BBQs, playgrounds including skate parks, street lighting, litter bin collection, street cleaning, immunisation, saleyard operations, school crossing supervision, community grants program, tourism development and visitor information centre co-ordination, major event co-ordination, investment attraction, business support services, and regional marketing, media communications and public relations.

Some of the services in the above categories involve funding contributions by State and Federal Government and the Council is required to comply with the terms of funding agreements concerning the standard of service that is provided.

In addition to the above list, the council has a range of corporate services which are required under legislation, for example, financial planning, accounting and reporting, council planning and annual reporting, council elections, best value reporting, freedom of information requests, privacy co-ordination. Other corporate services include human resource management, risk management and information technology management.
