Take an autumn walk on the Cathedral Ranges

Autumn is a great time of the year to get outdoors and take up the chance to explore the Cathedral Range State Park on a guided walk, hosted by the People and Parks Foundation and Parks Victoria on Friday 18 May.

The next walk will head to the top of South Jawbone peak, where participants will be rewarded with spectacular views of the surrounding area. Be warned, the walk is not for the faint hearted.

According to Amanda Daw from the People and Parks Foundation, the regrowth is lush as the park recovers from the 2009 bushfire and there are many special sights to see after recent wet seasons.

The guided hike and other planned walks are supported by People and Parks Foundation, which is working in collaboration with Parks Victoria on projects in the park.

A main project at the Cathedral Range is the construction of a new walking track expected to open later this year. It is one of two 'Green Connections Projects' aiming to connect the community with nature through fire rehabilitation works within the Shire of Murrindindi.

"Autumn is a great time of the year to get outdoors and breathe in that crisp fresh air," said Amanda.

"People who took part in the last guided walk to North Jawbone delighted in the amazing views and enjoying each other's company on the walk," said Amanda.

"Spending time in the natural environment is fun and good for our health - physically, mentally and emotionally," said Amanda.

Cathedral Range State Parks offers visitors a range of walks, from a relaxing stroll along the river, to hiking and rock climbing to scale the highest peaks.

Councillor Comment

As we move into the winter months it is beneficial to consider ways to become more energy efficient.

Within our Shire we have voluntary community groups who are helping others to be more sustainable; they are to be congratulated, in particular the Murrindindi Climate Network.

Voluntary Green Code of Practice The Murrindindi Climate Network (MCN) through the Environment Protection Authority Victoria, was successful in funding two test areas (Marysville & Triangle and Yea - 3717 area) for Green Business Assessments and the establishment of a Voluntary Green Code of Practice. MCN was motivated by the Economic Leadership Group of Marysville and Triangle area, to assist local businesses in achieving environmental outcomes and to position Marysville and Triangle as an environmentally sensitive tourism destination.

MCN designed a program that offers concrete benefits to participating local businesses in the form of free business assessments. Business owners will also be invited to actively participate in the formulation of a Voluntary Green Code of Practice.

A training program for assessors was established including the areas of energy efficiency/energy saving, green procurement, waste management/recycling and environmentally sustainable cleaning products and processes. With input from expert organisations (Moreland Energy Foundation, Resource GV, Fresh Green Clean) a team of local Green

Business Assessors were trained and have now begun conducting business assessments.

This initiative is also benefitting the Murrindindi Shire Council – as the Yea Shire Hall, Yea Shire Offices, Marysville's new Community Centre and Rebuilding Advisory Centre are currently being assessed in order to achieve energy efficiencies, save money and reduce their environmental footprint.

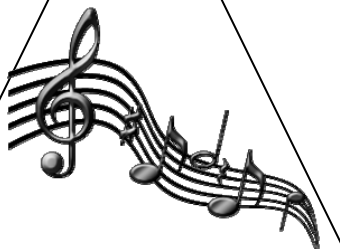

After losing their home and businesses back in 2009, Sharen Donovan said she and her husband, Terry, "weren't going to be a victim of this damn fire," rather they chose to be survivors.

"We decided we wanted to rebuild start away. As soon as we were allowed back in to the town and on our block, we set about clearing the dead trees (of which we milled many big trees) and then began to reconstruct and plant our garden," Sharen said. "

"After much hard work and emotional turmoil, we are now finished and ready to open for business! It is a celebration for 'Dalrymples' returning, but also a celebration for Marysville as it is another step forward in the rebuilding of this beautiful town."

Sharen said they are thrilled to have John Bertrand and Gary Pert there to mark this exciting occasion. "We met John Bertrand and Gary Pert at the Greg Norman Golf Day at Heritage Golf Course, which was a day held for the people of the fire affected towns. We have become very special friends and enjoy their company immensely."

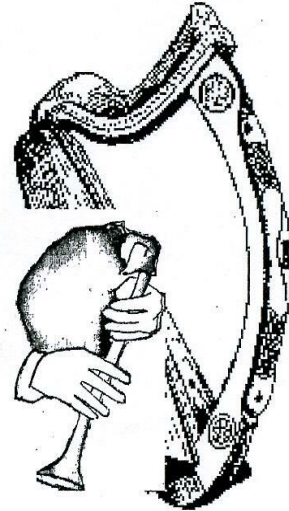

Planning and Environment Act 1987 MURRINDINDI PLANNING SCHEME Notice of Approval of Amendment Amendment C39



The Minister for Planning has approved Amendment C39 to the Murrindindi Planning Scheme.

The Amendment comes into operation on the date this notice is published in the Government Gazette.

The Amendment rezones the land at 32, 34 and 42 Murchison Street, Marysville, to Special Use Zone (SUZ) and introduces a new Schedule 2 to the SUZ to promote the use and development of the land for a major tourist facility. The Amendment also amends the schedule to Clause 52.03 to provide specific controls for the land contained in an Incorporated Document. Clause 81.01 is amended to introduce the Incorporated Document titled 'Major Tourist Facility, Marysville, March 2012.'
