TOP ENTERTAINERS PART OF ALEXANDRA TRUCK UTE & ROD SHOW

Local Laws Review

Murrindindi Shire Council is conducting a review of its Local Laws which aim to provide:

- Peace, order and good government of the municipality;
- A safe and healthy environment so that the community can enjoy a quality of life that meets its expectations;
- The safe and fair use and enjoyment of public places;
- The protection and enhancement of the amenity and environment of the municipality;
- A fair and reasonable use and enjoyment of private land; and
- A uniform and fair administration of the Local Law.

Consistent with State Government Guidelines, council has combined its existing local laws (excluding its Governance Local Law) into a new format Community Local Law. This is to make the laws easier to access and follow by the public, and more efficient to administer by the Council.

Council is conducting an initial public exhibition of the new draft Community Local Law. This consultation is to identify any further issues from a community perspective that may need to be considered before a final 'Community Local Law' is prepared and exhibited.

Subject to Council endorsement at its meeting on 28 May, a draft copy of the proposed new 'Community Local Law' will be on display from 1 June to 30 June 2012 at the following locations:

Community wellbeing should be focus of bush-fire funding

Murrindindi Shire Council has called on the Victorian Bushfire Appeal Fund (VBAF) to redistribute its latest funding allocation to community support programs and to help cover the costs of new bushfire assets.

Mayor of Murrindindi Shire, Councillor John Walsh this week wrote to Deputy Premier Peter Ryan to express concern about the latest VBAF funding allocation for two administrative positions in the Kinglake Ranges and two community foundations for the Shire.

Cr Walsh said at a time when there were real concerns about the mental health and wellbeing of members of bushfire-affected communities, VBAF funding should be focused on extending community mental health and wellbeing support.

"After the recent trauma faced by members of the Kinglake Ranges community, residents need to be working together to overcome their difficulties. Instead, we understand the recent VBAF allocations are creating potential conflict because the decisions are not in line with what residents need right now," he said.

"We ask that VBAF reconsider its current funding allocation and direct it towards community support programs and helping to meet the operation and maintenance costs of new bushfire recovery assets which are putting a severe financial strain on Council."

Cr Walsh said Council had raised the following issues with Mr Ryan in the letter:

- Funding allocated to two largely administrative positions for the Kinglake Ranges area was not aligned with current and ongoing community needs.
- The proposal to distribute funding to two community foundations to cover the eastern and western parts of the Shire was not feasible with such a small population base. It would also lead to duplication in administrative and legal costs and resources and divisions within the community.
- There should be measures in place to ensure there is full transparency and accountability in relation to funds from VBAF, so the community can be assured that those funds are being spent in the most effective and appropriate way.

"The health and wellbeing of our residents is the highest priority - we need to be providing people with the support they need to be able to heal and recover from the fires," Cr Walsh said.

"Our other priority is addressing the additional operating costs of new and updated infrastructure in the wake of the fires.

"All rate payers, whether they were fire-affected or not, are being asked to pay increased rates with no new services, because of Council's increased financial commitments.

"We need to be doing everything we can to minimise the financial impacts on our ratepayers.

"We are concerned that there has been no consideration of the wider impacts on our communities of VBAF's funding decisions, some of which are struggling to reunite in the wake of the fires.

"Re-establishing community cohesion and wellbeing remain our Shire's greatest challenges to overcome after the fires and that's where our focus should be at the moment."

Mayor's Chair

Last week, I chaired the first meeting of the Murrindindi Shire's National Emergency Medal Committee. The committee members comprise of Peter Rice (CFA), Neil Beer (CFA), John Newlands (SES), Graeme Lowe (Red Cross), Chris Jackson (Rotary), Ruth Crockett / Therese Clue (Lions), Robert Gill (Ambulance Victoria), Des Deas (SES) and Councillors Peter Beales and Kevin Bellingham. I thank all members for volunteering their time.

The Committee's aim is to ensure that all those who are eligible for the National Emergency Medal, as a result of their service to the community during the initial response phase of the 2009 Bushfires, are identified and properly recognised for their efforts.

It must be remembered that the National Emergency Medal is akin to a Campaign Medal rather than a bravery award. I raise this because many of the volunteers who did such a great job have expressed the view that they didn't do much and that others are more deserving. The medal is to recognise all contributions. It enables the wider community and the Nation to express thanks to those who helped out in times of extreme need.

Information on the National Emergency Medal together with nomination forms will be made available on Council's website and publicised throughout the local media in the coming weeks. I encourage everyone to look at the criteria for the award and to nominate those whom you believe are eligible. Nominations can be forwarded to Murrindindi Shire Council.

Many nominations have already been made through our Emergency Services and Community Service Groups. If you think that someone who you believe is deserving of recognition has already been nominated but aren't sure, then please nominate them again. Through the representatives on the Committee we will check all nominations against those already submitted to avoid duplication. Better we do that than have someone miss out because it was incorrectly assumed they had already been nominated.

I stress that the National Emergency Medal is open to all who volunteered their help for the community at our time of greatest need.

Yea Wetlands Centre Progressing

After some initial delays, the design and development of the much awaited Yea Wetlands Environment and Visitor Information Centre is progressing.

Murrindindi Shire Council Chief Executive Officer Margaret Abbey said tenders have recently been called for the design of the interpretative elements to be used in the Centre.

"The aim of the tender is to establish the type, scale and technical requirements for the displays and interactive features that deliver the interpretative story, within the budget available for the construction and ongoing operation of the Centre," said Ms Abbey.

"This work will support the ongoing financial viability of the project and provide clear direction to the architects appointed to design the building on the building's space, layout and fit out requirements.

"Once a preliminary building design is prepared it will be placed on display for community input," Ms Abbey said.

The Wetlands Committee and Trust have been the major community drivers behind the Centre's establishment.

Yea Business and Tourism Association Chairman (YBTA), Rod Clue said that this Centre, together with the opening of the Goulburn River High Country Rail Trail will create opportunities for local businesses.

The Centre is to be located at the intersection of the Melba and Goulburn Valley Highways and will become a must see attraction, information hub and educational resource for both visitors to Yea and passing traffic.

The \$1.75 million Centre received capital funding through grants from the State Government and Melbourne Water's Regional Benefits Program.

The Yea Wetlands Trust has also raised and contributed a further \$200,000 toward the interpretive content and environmental learning programs that will be delivered through the Centre.

Whilst the Centre's construction does not require a financial contribution from the Council, a commitment has been made by Council to support the ongoing operations of the visitor information centre with one staffing position and assistance to meet the initial start-up costs.

"Consistent with Council's recent services review, the aim of the Council and all project partners has been to minimise the need for significant Council resources to run the Centre and we continue to review the progress of the project to ensure this outcome is achieved, said Ms Abbey.

Yea Wetlands Trust Chairman Mr Russell Wealands expressed his support for the project.

"It is terrific that after 10 years of dedicated hard work our vision is transforming into a reality" said Mr. Wealands.

"We are really looking forward to the opportunity to raise awareness and understanding of our precious water resources and wetland ecosystems," he said.

With representatives from the Trust, Committee, Yea Business and Tourism Association and Council, the Project Control Group will continue to develop the project and see it through to completion.

Fox control – Toolangi State Forest

The Department of Sustainability and Environment and Parks Victoria are committed to protecting and enhancing the natural values of parks, reserves and state forests across the state. Examples of this conservation management are the control of introduced plant and animal species which can impact on these values.

As part of an ongoing strategy, notice is hereby given that the Department of Sustainability and Environment will be laying buried baits containing sodium fluoroacetate (1080 poison) on public land for the control of foxes. Baits containing 1080 poison will be laid from **Tuesday 12 June** until **Friday 14 December 2012**.

Baits will be laid at strategic sites and other known areas of fox habitat within the parishes of **Granton, Woodbourne, Mohican, Glendale, Tarrawarra North, Nar-Be-Thong** and **Monda**.

1080 poison signs will be posted throughout the baited areas and members of the public who are living, visiting or working in the above named parishes are advised to take particular care not to disturb or interfere with bait stations. Domestic dogs and cats are particularly susceptible to 1080 poison and should be under effective control, muzzled or kept away from the poisoned areas.
