OEG Outline Future Plans

As you may have heard The Outdoor Education Group (OEG) has purchased the former Marysville Temporary Village. In February 2013 we will open as an accommodation centre for families and groups, and to the public on weekends – for the use of our Climbing and Abseiling tower.

Midweek in school terms the Village will operate as a school camp

On weekends and school holidays cabins can be individually booked

On weekends the Climbing and Abseil tower is open to guests and the public from 10am-4pm

The Village will provide an all inclusive tariff to groups and individuals who stay there, meaning that when they pay for accommodation - activities are also included.

A cycle/walk trail will be formalised on the existing path between Marysville and Crystal Journey, via El-Kanah and Marysville Village. This track will have a gravel surface and be about one metre wide.

The project is largely in the planning stage at present. Current (part time) staff are Tony Pammer - Project Manager, Caolan O'Connor - Program Design, Nicki Lund – Purchasing, Jackie Ashe – Food & Kitchen Garden, Graham Alman – Camp Manager. Each of our roles is to bring The Village “into action” and then when the place is open and running, hand our job over to a new, permanent – full time person, who will be employed in the latter part of 2013.

We will have an information evening later in the year if you are interested in attending. We are interested in meeting people in the Triangle who have an interest in art, story telling, history, community gardens, no-waste catering, permaculture, working with youth and so forth. We envisage the Village will have four themes:
Music and Musicians,
Timber and Adventure,
Wellbeing, and
Indigenous and European History.

Fire management plan puts certainty into bushfire response

A more strategic and integrated approach to fire management planning which aims to reduce the impact of fire across the Murrindindi Shire has been outlined in the release of a draft Murrindindi Shire and Lake Mountain Fire Management Plan.

The plan establishes a tiered system of state, regional and municipal plans that provide strategic direction to fire management. The purpose of the new plan is to address the overall risk of bushfire in the long term and facilitate improved community safety outcomes.

Deputy Mayor Cr Chris Healy said the draft plan was an important response to the recommendations of the 2009 Victorian Bushfires Royal Commission.

"The Royal Commission in its recommendations placed a high priority on the integration of emergency services. We have achieved this with the draft plan being prepared by the Municipal Fire Management Planning Committee which includes members from DSE, CFA, Council and Lake Mountain," Cr Healy said.

"The management committee has put considerable work into this document. It is comprehensive in its approach to bushfire management and importantly it will continue to be developed over its three-year life span.

"It addresses specific recommendations from the Royal Commission such as the need to develop procedures for the identification of hazard trees that may fall onto power lines and the procedure for notifying the organisation that is responsible for dealing with it. There are many other recommendations from the Royal Commission that are dealt with in other ways, including through the town planning system.

"The draft plan recognises, but doesn't duplicate, the extensive work already being undertaken in fire management and planning activities across our shire. It is a plan for improving integration of our existing networks and developing new ways of working together with our community."

Cr Healy said everyone had a responsibility to maintain their properties and conduct their activities in a responsible manner with respect to fire management.

"The effectiveness of this plan relies upon the community and the respective agencies accepting responsibility to ensure fire risk is managed and understood.

"The draft plan identifies a number of risks which have been assessed, with those risks to human life taking precedence. Treatments or procedures that address these risks have been prioritised and contained within the plan.

"It includes important reference to Township Protection Plans (TPPs) and Neighbourhood Safer Places (NSPs), which are important safety and pre planning elements for the community, especially for the settlement areas that are subject to bushfire risk."

A draft copy of the proposed Murrindindi Shire and Lake Mountain Fire Management Plan will be on display at all council offices and on council's website www.murrindindi.vic.gov.au from 1 September to 31 October 2012.

"It is important that we receive community feedback and comments on such an important document," Cr Healy said.

"We have a significant timeframe for submissions, and I would encourage community comment."

Councillor comment

The State Government's decision to abolish the insurance-based fire services levy from 1 July 2013 and move to a more transparent property based levy is sound; however, we have always said that because this is a State levy, the State Government should collect it through its own State Revenue Office.

In future your rate notices will likely bear the additional State Government charge – an impost councils certainly do not want to carry considering the cost of administering the scheme, problems in collecting unpaid levies and the obvious appearance on a rates notice of a charge that could be confused with a hike in overall rates.

The new property based levy will put all Victorians on an equal playing field and of course it will have enormous benefits in funding our very important CFA operations.

What is not so fair is the way the levy is collected and it puts councils in the cross-hairs of their communities. If there is to be equity in the scheme, the government should have worked harder, taken responsibility for its levy and consulted more widely with councils.

I can only hope that councils are provided with adequate administration costs and there is a clear delineation between the state "tax" and council rates. My real fear is that councils will be left carrying the burden of administering the scheme and will be out of pocket, which in turn creates more funding needed from ratepayers to collect the levy.

Time will tell if the State Government has created a truly level playing field that includes Local Government.

Council elections are fast approaching and while I am calling it a day in October, I still have the shire very much at heart.

To that extent it would be wonderful to see a great mix of new faces on the Council. I would like to see a higher representation of women and young members of our community put up their hands to drive the shire forward.

Yes it can be testing but the rewards are significant. Importantly our current Council has worked well as a team to prepare for a smooth transition to a new Council.

I encourage you to take up the challenge .

Council invites Federal Environment Minister to Toolangi

Federal Environment Minister Tony Burke will be invited to Toolangi to better understand the local eco system and the role logging plays in the economic sustainability of the shire.

Deputy Mayor Chris Healy said Council was supportive of the logging industry and the economic impacts it provided the shire, but was also concerned about the longer term sustainability of State Forests and the protection of endangered and unique habitat.

"The Murrindindi Environment Advisory Committee has made recommendations that are supportive of the logging industry, but would like to see Council advocate for greater scrutiny on areas that are deemed sensitive," Cr Healy said.

"The committee has also requested the invitation to Minister Burke.

"Council acknowledges the complexity of environmental law and its ability to protect threatened species and will invite Tony Burke, Federal Minister for Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities to visit the Toolangi area to view the habitat of the Leadbeater's Possum, a threatened species being impacted by logging."

Cr Healy said it was important that the Minister was aware of concerns of conservationists and environmentalists.

"By inviting the Minister to the shire, hopefully it provides an opportunity for constructive dialogue between environmentalists and industry in gaining a better understanding of each others needs," Cr Healy said.

"It is an emotive subject, but we are aware that there needs to be a balance in protecting threatened species and supporting one of our major industries."

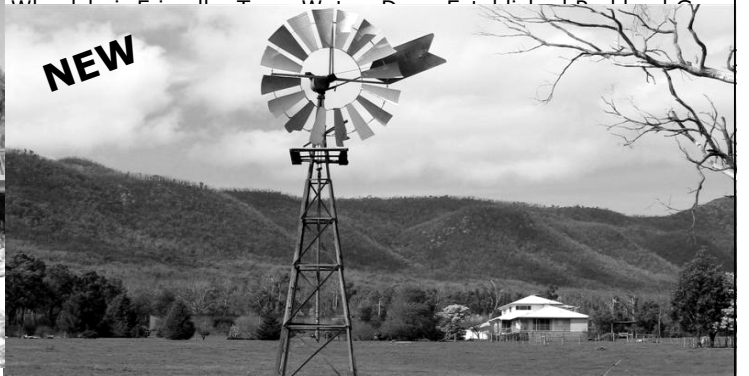

Council supports proposed planning zone reforms

Murrindindi Shire is backing a State Government proposal to change the state's planning zones that would see nine existing zones deleted, five new zones created and the amendment of 12 existing zones within rural, commercial, industrial and residential areas.

Council's Deputy Mayor Cr Chris Healy said the changes would streamline and simplify zones, encourage economic activity and widen a range of land uses.

"The proposals also open opportunities for further growth in the region by allowing a wider range of uses, but at the same time, there are provisions in place so farming land will continue to be a focus of our economic base," Cr Healy said.

"The proposals would also make it easier for accommodation providers looking at establishing or extending business opportunities across the shire."

Cr Healy said Council's planning staff had put a considerable amount of work into the submission that will be submitted to the Department of Planning and Community Development.

"We are also asking for government support if a number of the changes are implemented," Cr Healy said. "This would apply to changes to the business and commercial zones.

"We do not believe the draft reformed zones will have any adverse impacts and importantly they could make positive changes to zones that can enhance economic activity and widen the range of land use across the shire."

While Council will make a formal submission, members of the community are also encouraged to make comment on the proposed reforms,

The Department of Planning and Community Development is seeking comments, with the report available at <http://www.dpcd.vic.gov.au>, under the Planning tab on the homepage. It will remain on exhibition until 21 September.
