Open Gardens in Buxton, Taggerty & Acheron

Five enthusiastic garden owners in Buxton, Taggerty and Acheron will open their gates to visitors as part of the Alexandra & District Open Gardens weekend on Saturday 27th and Sunday 28th October 2012. These gardens are a pleasant short drive apart, making it convenient for visitors to enjoy each one. In Buxton, Lois & John Hardham's garden is a favourite among garden enthusiasts. Straddling the Little Steavenson River are manicured lawn areas, a picturesque Monet style timber bridge, a footbridge via a Laburnum archway and tiered riverside areas. Following floods in 2010 impacting this garden, extensive replanting has occurred. There is much to admire in this lovely garden. In Taggerty there are three open gardens to explore. Ross and Gillian Thomson's garden "Balgowan" is located along the Acheron River. The property name "Balgowan" has South African origins and some species native to this country have been planted. Roses feature strongly along with a fernery, a Japanese garden and mature exotic and native trees. Ross's skills with wood are evident and Gill's exquisite quilts will be on display. Cottage by the Sea will be offering morning and afternoon tea at "Balgowan" during the weekend. Cottage by the Sea is a not for profit, registered children's charity offering seaside holiday camps in Queenscliff to over 1,000 children each year. Indeed children from the Murrindindi Shire have been hosted following the bushfires in 2009. The extensive grounds of "Balgowan" will be a memorable

venue for visitors. Also in Taggerty, "Weerona" is home to Nicola Woolford and Scott Bewley. A more recent focus on permaculture principles has been adopted to gradually increase this small garden's productivity. Home-made compost and organic weed tea boost edible plants and the garden in general. These gardeners have accepted the challenges of improving the soil, conserving water and utilising nitrogen-fixing plants. Expect to see recycling, chooks, worms, compost & edible plants. Of special interest is a new greenhouse made of recycled materials. A gradual but rewarding process to achieve permaculture values. The third garden opening in Taggerty is a two acre garden on the property of Phillip Williams and Suzy Van der Vlies. Lavender hedges, azaleas, apples, ornamental pears and olive trees are just some of the garden features. Proteas and leucodendrons are well established and a large enclosed orchard and veggie garden are productive elements on the property. With magnificent views of the Cathedral Mountain, this property will inspire visitors. The panoramic views of Jan and Larry Fallon's hill-top property "Neerimvale" in Acheron are also superb. The challenges of meagre top soil, abundant

rock and exposure to wind, caused the owners to redesign their garden. New plantings include exotic deciduous species, perennial garden beds, and arbours. Beyond the "ha ha", the stunning borrowed landscape features the Cathedral Mountain in the distance. A newly constructed car museum will surely entice some garden enthusiasts' partners to sneak away for a browse amongst the boys' toys. Remember in addition to the open garden weekend, there is St John's "Festival of Flowers" and the Alexandra Historical Society's History Week activities; all combining to ensure locals and visitors have much to look forward to. 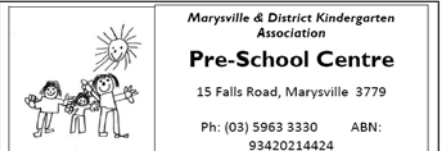

The Department of Sustainability and Environment and Parks Victoria are committed to protecting and enhancing the natural values of parks, reserves and state forests across the state. Examples of this conservation management are the control of introduced plant and animal species which can impact on these values.

As part of an ongoing strategy, notice is hereby given that the Department of Sustainability and Environment will be laying buried baits containing sodium fluoroacetate (1080 poison) on public land for the control of foxes. Baits containing **1080 poison** will be laid from **Monday 29th October** until **Friday 14th December 2012**. Baiting began in Toolangi State forest on 12th June and will continue until Friday 14th December.

Baits will be laid at strategic sites and other known areas of fox habitat within the above mentioned forests and parks, within the vicinity of townships Eildon, Rubicon, Taggerty, Buxton, Marysville, Narbethong, Healesville, Warburton and Toolangi.

1080 poison signs will be posted throughout the baited areas and members of the public who are living, visiting or working in the above named areas are advised to take particular care not to disturb or interfere with bait stations. Domestic dogs and cats are particularly susceptible to 1080 poison and should be under effective control, muzzled or kept away from the poisoned areas.

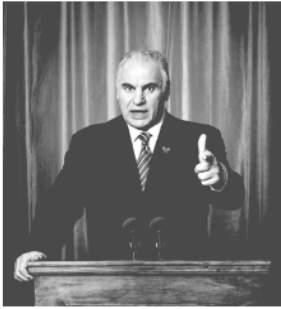

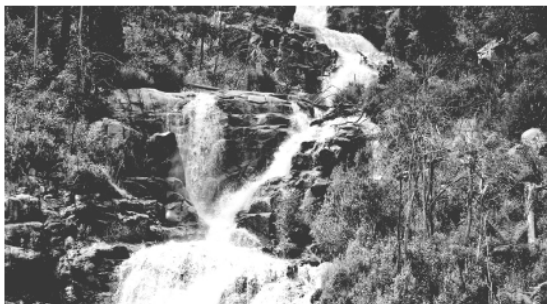

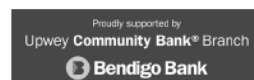

Enrolled residents may be fined if they do not vote - this includes homeowners and tenants.

You are encouraged to vote (but won't be fined if you don't) if:

- you are aged 70 years or over; or
- you live outside the municipality; or
- you applied to Council to be on the roll.

Memorial designs to engage community in a journey of healing



Creating a community memorial should reflect the experiences of their community and be responsive to their needs. That is the message of the team engaged to develop concepts for the next stage of the Murrindindi Bushfires Memorial project.

“Traditionally, memorials have been built by governments and were often staid monuments honouring those lost,” says community consultant Steve Pascoe, who led the development of the community bushfire memorial at Strathewen.

“But today, memorials have become community places where people can remember losses, reflect on their own experiences and recognise community spirit.”

This second stage of the consultation process will explore each community’s ideas about the specific nature of the memorials, where they should be sited, and what elements they should incorporate.

A good memorial aims to engage the community and visitors in a journey of memory and healing, says Jan Nowell, the director of Arterial Design, who is working with the Memorials Working Group on this stage of the Bushfire Memorials.

“It is not about making a grand sculptural statement, but about telling a story that allows visitors to reflect on their experience.”

“A memorial offers the opportunity to unify communities and for many different and personal experiences to be shared in a space that is reflective and offers the opportunity for quiet contemplation.

“The memorial becomes a destination that acknowledges shared loss on a significant scale and also acknowledges the strength and resilience that connects and rebuilds communities.”

High quality materials and a low-maintenance design are necessary to ensure that a memorial endures over the years. The memorial design should also be integrated with the landscape to create a place of contemplation in a place of natural beauty, says Jan.

“It’s not just about plonking a memorial marker in a park. The design of the memorial will respond to its setting and its landscape.”

Some of the more successful memorials have been the simplest, Jan points out.

“The beautiful memorial garden at Port Arthur in Tasmania is as much a place of reflection and hope as it is a commemoration. As well as the garden, it comprises a reflective pool, a simple wooden cross engraved with names, and a plaque that describes with compelling simplicity what happened on the day of the tragedy.”

To assist in the further development of a memorial’s concept two information sessions will be held either side of the shire on Sunday 21 October 2012. The venues are as follows:
