And then there was light !

Liberal Member for Seymour, Cindy McLeish, together with the Marysville community celebrated the completion of the Steavenson Falls bushfire recovery project.

Ms McLeish was joined by locals young and old who walked with lanterns from the Marysville township to the Steavenson Falls Reserve for the community celebration.

Steavenson Falls is one of Victoria's most spectacular waterfalls and prior to the Black Saturday bushfires attracted an estimated 150,000 visitors per year.

Declaring the \$2.7 million project completed, Ms McLeish remembered those who lost their lives as a result of the fires, and invited residents and guests to walk to the base of the Falls and witness the switching on of the hydro powered light system for the first official time since the 2009 fires.

"This is a very special celebration for the Marysville community," she said.

"Steavenson Falls has a special place in the hearts of the local community, and it is wonderful to see the work that has been undertaken to not only restore the facilities following the fires, but also enhance them."

The project was funded through the Government's Bushfire Recovery Program following Black Saturday.

Works were managed by the Department of Sustainability and Environment (DSE) in partnership with the Murrindindi Shire Council, Steavenson Falls Committee of Management and the local community.

"Steavenson Falls is an important part of the social fabric of the community, and redeveloping the reserve following the fires has been a major priority for the Government."

Major works at the site has included the construction of new viewing platforms at the base and top of the Falls, new visitor facilities including toilets, shelter and interpretive signs, improved access and car parking, restoration of the network of walking trails and the reserve's hydro power lighting system.

DSE Murrindindi District Manager, John Steer, said: "I think everyone would agree that the works that have been undertaken in stages at the Falls have resulted in a wonderful asset both for the local community and the people of Victoria."

"The Steavenson Falls Committee of Management wanted to ensure that today's opening was a community celebration in recognition of the resilience which has been demonstrated during the recovery process."

An estimated 250 people attended the celebration, many of whom walked all the way, including the children with their lanterns. Also among the lantern-carrying walkers was MP Cindy McLeish.

A great celebration for the redevelopment of our beautiful reserve!

Survey for bushfire memorials

The proposed Murrindindi bushfire memorials will be for everyone touched by the 2009 fires.

A memorial can be seen and touched, visited on special occasions, creating a reminder of people and events in physical form for all to experience. It should be a place for personal remembering

This second stage of the consultation process will explore the different options for where the memorials should be sited, and discuss initial ideas for their design. This will result in more community engagement.

The consultant team continues to seek input of what form people perceive as appropriate: maybe a sculptured wall with name plaques, maybe a private grotto or a rocky waterfall, or maybe an avenue of trees. The options are numerous, but the team would like to know your thoughts.

Jenny Branton of Branton Consulting said at the recent bushfire memorials community meeting in Marysville that 'the memorials are not just for us now but for people who come to remember in the future.'

Whether there are two memorials, one in Kinglake and one in Marysville or more in the smaller fire affected towns is up to the community. It was generally felt that they should be in public places.

The form of the memorials and what information they provide is yet to be determined. The consulting team would like to the communities thoughts as to where they should be placed, the form they should take, and what information they should provide -- maybe the name, age and position in the community of the people who perished or, if they were a visitor to the town, their place and country of origin.

The bushfire memorials consulting team is running a **survey** on <<http://murrindindibushfirememorials.wordpress.com>> that has been very popular amongst the community. The web-site offers all updated information on the process and readers are encouraged to take a look.

Council Fire Restriction Period starts

Murrindindi Shire Council's fire restriction period has started which means property owners wanting to reduce fuel loads must obtain a permit to burn.

Council's General Manager Sustainability Michael Chesworth said it was important people continued to actively reduce fuel loads on properties but they must follow the guidelines under the fire restriction period.

Council's 'Fire Amnesty' period in residential areas has ceased and no burning off will be permitted in any residential or rural area without a permit.

"If you are planning a burn off you are required to obtain a permit, unless it complies with a range of criteria. This also applies to the burning of windrows," Mr Chesworth said.

During the municipal restriction period, residents should contact the Municipal Fire Prevention Officer (MFPO) Andrew Daly, to discuss their situation and an inspection can be arranged for a permit to be issued.

"It is very important that residents, landholders and visitors obey the fire restriction period. People who light fires without permits can face fines of up to \$2,000 given the significant risk fire posed to life and property," Mr Chesworth said.

"Council is playing its part as we are finalising our annual slashing and fuel reduction program for works on Council roads and reserves. "In fact we have started slashing some roadsides."

Council will start property inspections in and around settlement areas in mid November to ensure owners have completed fire prevention works.

"It is important that everyone plays a role in fire prevention," Mr Chesworth said. "Failure by owners to maintain their property could lead to enforcement action."

During the fire restriction period, permits are required in rural areas to burn-off any tree, stump, log or vegetation in excess of 75mm (3 inches) in diameter.

Permits are not required for the burning of stubble grass, bracken or vegetation under 75mm (3 inches).

For any fire lit under these provisions, the following conditions apply;

- (1) an adult person must be in attendance whilst the fire is alight, such fires are lit between the hours of 3pm and 11pm on any day until the commencement of the CFA fire restrictions. All fires must be extinguished by 11pm of the same day the fire is lit, adequate means are at all times available for extinguishing the fire, the person who lights the fire, or allows a fire to remain alight, must extinguish the fire upon being directed to do so by an authorised officer, member of the Victorian Police, or authorised Forest Officers of the DSE.

The municipal fire restriction period will end at the commencement of the CFA's Declared Fire Danger Period which will be determined by the Country Fire Authority.

"It is important to note that after the commencement of the CFA Declared Fire Danger Period no permits to burn will be issued by Council," Mr Chesworth said.

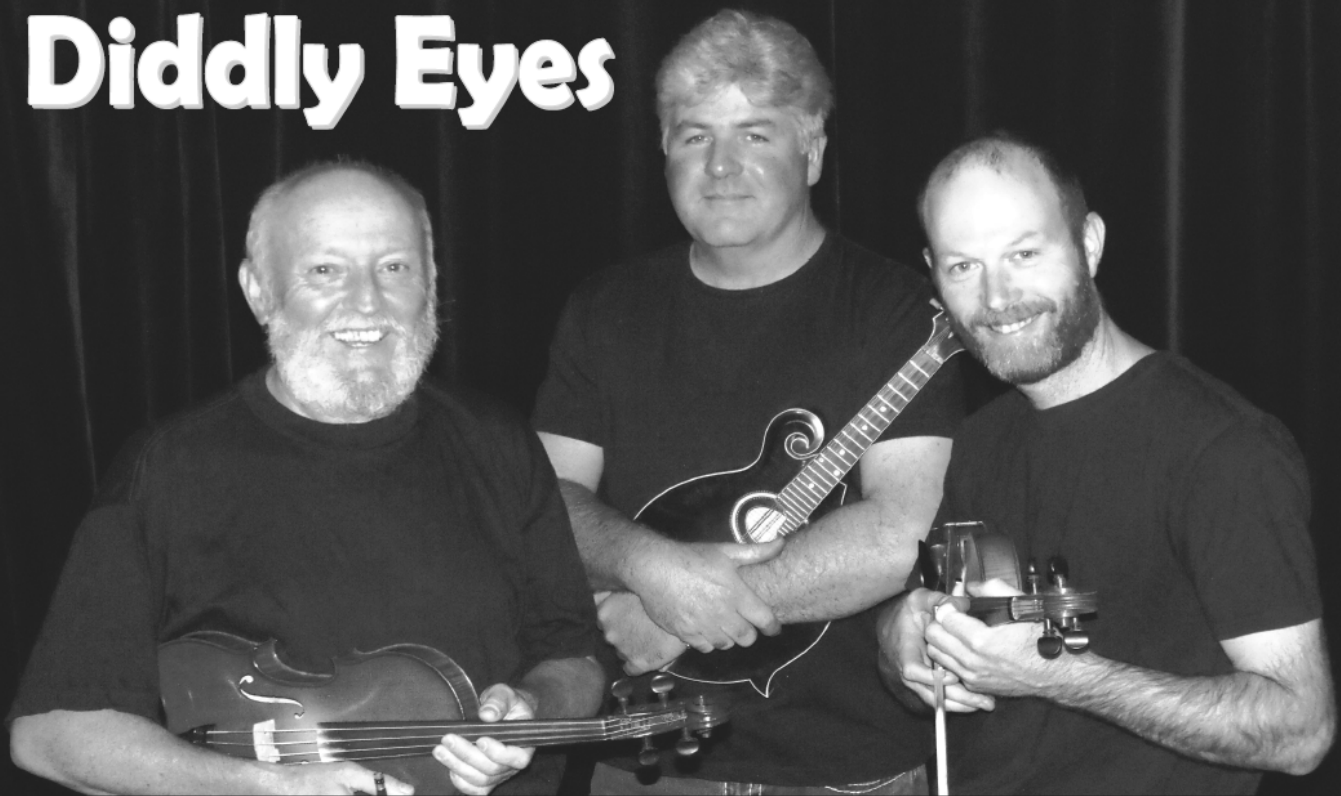
