When Diddly Eyes are smiling



Marysville's Cultural Community Inc. started presenting shows in February 1998. The very first act was the Irish duo "To be sure, To be sure" featuring the musical talents and wit of one of the local electricians (Frank Murphy) and his Irish mate, originally from Belfast, Brian Mooney. There is a certain liveliness and celebration of life that is intrinsic to Irish music, especially when you experience it live.

The people of the Triangle region now have the opportunity to see Frank Murphy perform live again Friday, November 16th at 8pm sharp at the Marysville Golf Club in a new trio the "Diddly Eyes" featuring Anthony O'Neill and Andrew Cooper. Anthony O'Neill is one of Melbourne's elite traditional musicians. He spent many hours playing with his long time friend Louis McManus and the famous Fitzgerald family from County Clare. He has played with Ploughboys, Bushwackers, Purple Dentists, Idle Diddlies and

Saorise to name a few.

Andrew Cooper although classically trained, got interested in Irish music because he loved the sound of the fiddle, in particular the Donegal style of fiddling which grabbed his attention when he visited Ireland. He has since played with Tara, Too Rye Aye, The Ploughboys, The Borderers, Cyril Moran, The Sundowners. The Diddly Eyes have worked up a repertoire of foot tapping jigs and reels tempered with ballads and funny songs, poems and the obligatory handful of jokes. In honour of that first show back in 1998 we are including a segment where the audience members will be invited to tell a joke. This time there will be an one minute time limit strictly enforced! Could anyone forget the excruciatingly long joke that a member of the audience told last time?

Tickets for the Diddly Eyes are free and can be collected from Marysville Post Shop, Buxton Post Office or Café Alex. Seats are strictly limited

so if you already holding ticket(s) and find you are unable to attend PLEASE return your ticket to Marysville Post Shop as soon as possible so that someone else can attend. This show is supported by Arts Victoria with assistance from Community Arts Grant, Murrindindi Sire. Doors and bar open at 7:30pm and a light supper will be served at interval. Please arrive a minimum of 15 minutes before the start time.

The Diddly Eyes are the final show of the Café Culture Series for 2012 and MCC Inc will be launching the program for the 2013 Café Culture Series on the night. The shows have been offered free of charge for the past four years and there has been many a memorable nights worth of entertainment in that time. Having now fully expended the fire recovery funds, the committee now need to revert to selling Seasons Tickets for 2013 and will again rely on the support of the community to keep the shows coming to town on a regular basis. So, bring your wallets and purses if you want to take advantage of the especially discounted tickets on the night. You can scoop yourselves up a 2013 Seasons Ticket for the measly price of \$60 for all 4 shows, which equates to a saving of \$ 40 off full price tickets. This extremely generous offer will only be available on the night so get organized and come prepared.

Bill O'Shea

General Counsel, Alfred Health

Bill O'Shea was appointed as Alfred Health's first General Counsel in 2003. Prior to joining Alfred Health he was managing partner and head of the Commercial Law Practice Group of national law firm Hunt & Hunt.

Bill and Alfred psychiatrist Dr Steve Ellen have a weekly one hour radio segment on medical and legal issues every Tuesday night on 774 ABC Melbourne's evening show with Lindy Burns ('Bill & Steve's Radio Adventure').

Bill was the first public officer of the Marysville and District Chamber of Commerce and has also assisted in the setting up of Marysville Music and Arts with Pam Phillips and the Marysville Football & Netball Club with her brother John.

Bill and his wife Anne owned a house in Red Hill Road Marysville for a number of years – they sold it just before it was destroyed on Black Saturday and they have felt bad about it ever since.

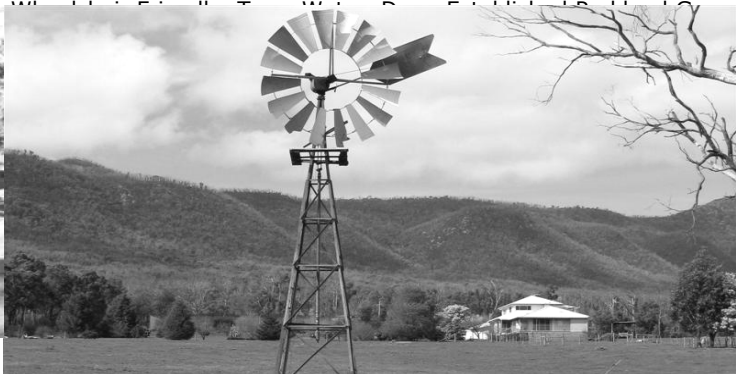

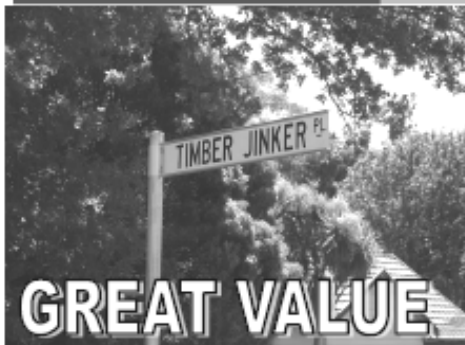


TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE FOR MARYSVILLE MARATHON

Ed said he was thrilled to receive the award, and paid tribute to the resilience of the Marysville Sparkling Wine Festival Committee, for their efforts in developing the ASWS format, since the devastation of the 2009 Black Saturday bushfires in the region.

"This wine show is unique in its concept being dedicated to Sparkling Wines only, and is now a feature on the Australian Wine Industry calendar," he said.

Other trophy winners on the night were 'Yellowglen Perle', 'Leasingham Classic Clare Sparkling Shiraz', 'Yarra Burn Vintage Rose' and 'Kirrihill Wines Moscato'.

The gala awards dinner was the culmination of 2 weeks of events in Marysville to celebrate the annual Sparkling Wine Festival, which had included a Marquee Breakfast at the base of Steavenson Falls, a festival Golf day at the Marysville golf course, the official judging day of the 176 wines entered in the wine show, and a Community Night where everyone from the town gathered to "taste the entries" in this year's Show.

The Australian Sparkling Wine Show in just three years has now become a feature on the national wine industry calendar, and next year will incorporate a conference of wine industry delegates from around the country.
