'East Meets West'

A hugely successful networking meeting was held last Tuesday evening at the Narbethong Hall. Organised by the Marysville & District Chamber of Commerce along with the Kinglake Ranges Business Network, the 'East Meets West' meeting provided the opportunity for business operators and staff from all corners of the Murrindindi Shire to come together to share ideas, know-hows and experiences with each other.

Besides the networking opportunities, the meeting was addressed by several keynote guest speakers including Dr Greg Welch, Chairman of Champions of the Bush, and a representative from NBNCo. Dr Welch, who is certainly not a stranger to the Triangle region, gave a very upbeat presentation explaining the many successful stories of rural and regional businesses in Victoria and beyond. He also outlined the

challenges ahead for regions such as Murrindindi Shire. The representative from NBNCo also gave an overview and update on the NBN roll-out; something that will probably eventually affect all of us.

Funding and support for the evening was provided by the Bendigo Bank and the Murrindindi Shire Council and some great food was supplied by the Lions Club of Marysville.

Door prizes and raffle prizes for the night were very generously donated by Rob Cousins Furniture Pty Ltd, Saladin Lodge, the Outdoor Education Group and Rochford Winery. It is to be hoped that the Marysville & District Chamber of Commerce will be organising other networking opportunities such as this one next year.

Council implements service review outcomes at Alexandra Library

Murrindindi Shire Council is implementing a number of recommendations as part of its on-going services review that will create a library service across the shire that will be sustainable in the long term, applies best practice systems and continues to serve the community.

Council CEO Margaret Abbey said the current restructure was a difficult decision.

"Three positions have been made redundant and while those affected staff have been offered redeployment across the organisation, it is still a stressful time for those members and their families," Ms Abbey said. "We appreciate that this review has taken sometime and the patience and participation of our library staff in the review process has been greatly valued."

Under the review:

Current library service openings across all three (Alexandra, Kinglake and Yea) branches will remain the same.

There will be no impact on staff hours at these branches. Further analysis on the mobile library will take place over the coming months, but it will continue to deliver its current service level.

A Library Coordinator has been seconded through Yarra Plenty Regional Library Service for a six month period to oversee operation and compliance.

Library headquarter functions will be absorbed at the library branches and the coordinator.

There will be no impact on program funding.

New book stock will remain above the best practice standard.

The changes are expected to save Council \$50,000 pa.

The Services Review has resulted in Council developing a four-point Action Plan to rectify the current infrastructure gap as a result of the 2009 fires, provide a sustainable cash flow and limit rate increases over the next decade.

Council's Action Plan provides a framework to build a secure financial footing for the future, while minimising impacts on ratepayers and the broader community. It is expected to achieve more than \$1.6 m in savings every year, as well as providing a one-off capital injection of \$4.45 m.

Action Plan includes:

1. Disposing of some land, buildings, plant and equipment considered to be surplus to needs
2. Assessing fees and charges to bring them in line with those of other comparable Councils
3. Introducing policies that will deliver cost savings
4. Streamlining Council services and operations including restructuring Council

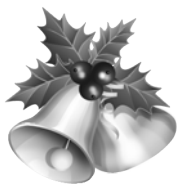

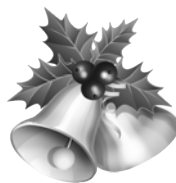

MAYOR'S CHAIR

Two elements are essential if individual property rates are to be mimimised. Firstly, costs need to be reduced and kept under control and Council has started this process through the Services Review.

Unfortunately that has meant, in some cases, positions have been made redundant. There have been recent changes to our library operations that have resulted in the loss of three positions from the Alexandra Headquarters.

It has been a difficult decision, but we will continue to deliver a similar standard service and importantly we have retained hours and positions at all three branches. I would like to thank those headquarters staff who have given much to the community and Council.

Secondly we need to broaden the rate base to have more properties and businesses to share the load. The latter can be achieved through having more people living here; by expanding existing businesses; and through new businesses being established within the shire. Council's Planning and Economic Development units focus on these three objectives but there must be strong community support across the shire if we are to be successful.

Another element in the mix is that additional people living in additional houses and working in new and expanded businesses require expanded services and amenities and all these factors need to increase together. If we expand one area but neglect another, we create further problems.

For example, we are currently experiencing problems that arise when additional community facilities are developed in areas without sufficient people to support them.

The Council Plan is the document that Council develops to coordinate all its services over the four year Council term to meet the rate base broadening objectives amongst others. Drafts will be developed, based on Vision 2030, in January and February 2013 before being presented for public comment.

There are ups and downs in this job. Last week on the fire ground at Whanregarwen I again witnessed the willingness and effort of fellow CFA volunteers and was also struck by the beauty of the scene to the north across the Goulburn looking up the Home Creek and Spring Creek valleys and despite the fire, thought, "why would you live anywhere else?"

Then I was told of the theft of the memorial bench from the Tall Trees Trail whose opening I attended a couple of weeks ago. Thankfully there are far more volunteer types than thieving types.

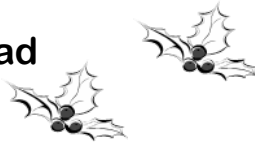

**Seed Production Area supporting threatened woodlands
across the north east**

A group of organisations in the north east of Victoria have teamed up to produce seed for threatened woodlands in the region.

The Department of Sustainability and Environment (DSE), North East Catchment Management Authority (NE CMA), Park Lane Nursery, the Australian Plant Society Wangaratta and GOTAFE are working together to restore grassy woodlands through producing seeds and replanting.

Through the federally funded Threatened Grassy Woodlands Project, DSE has supported the development of a Seed Production Area (SPA) at Park Lane Nursery in Wangaratta. The area has been rabbit fenced, mounded and weed matted and planted with indigenous woodland plants with help from Park Lane and DSE staff, and volunteers from APS Wangaratta.

"The aim of developing a local seed production area is to produce good amounts of easily collectable seed that can be used in the restoration of our local grassy woodlands," DSE project officer Mary Anderson said.

"Many plants normally found in our grassy woodlands are missing, or in very limited numbers and others are just difficult to collect seed from. Enough of the right seed is essential if we want to continue improving our important woodland areas".

Park Lane Nursery Manager Scott Grant said the SPA at the nursery was a perfect opportunity to link what the nursery does, growing plants, with the on-going conservation of local plant communities.

"It's also a great learning opportunity for nursery staff, TAFE, schools and the community."

The Threatened Grassy Woodlands Project has provided incentives and management support to protect over 600ha of woodlands on private property throughout the north east catchment.

Firewood collection season closed 30 November

Firewood collectors take note – the last day of November marked the end of firewood collection on public land for 2012.

The Department of Sustainability and Environment advises that the Spring firewood collection season closes Friday 30 November at 5pm and anyone collecting firewood in state forests or parks after this time will face heavy penalties.

DSE Land and Fire Regional Manager North East, Alan Dobson, said firewood collection seasons combined with collection limits helps ensure that firewood from public land is managed sustainably and distributed in an equitable way.

“Firewood on public land is a limited resource that needs to be actively managed,” Mr Dobson said.

“The two statewide firewood collection seasons aim to minimise risks to people, the environment and infrastructure by avoiding firewood collection during periods of highest fire hazard and during winter.”

Mr Dobson said heavy penalties apply to a number of firewood offences, including collecting outside the designated firewood collection seasons.

“People collecting firewood after the Spring season closes this Friday will be very visibly doing the wrong thing,” he said.

“Those operating outside the law will be liable to a maximum penalty of a \$7042 fine, one year imprisonment or both.”

“People purchasing firewood should also check that they are buying it from a legal source, such as someone who has a commercial forest produce licence from the Department of Primary Industries,” he said.

The next opportunity to collect firewood from public land, for personal use only, will be the start of the Autumn firewood collection season on 1 March 2013.

Rules and regulations apply to firewood collection and penalties apply under the Forests Act 1958, Wildlife Regulations 2002 and Land Conservation (Vehicle Control) Regulations 2003.

Council aims for inclusive community

Ensuring the widest range of Murrindindi Shire residents and visitors are able to participate in all aspects of our community; the Murrindindi Shire Inclusiveness Access and Equity Committee has been formed.

The committee - which comprises Council staff and community members – has been meeting since July and is developing its terms of reference as well as getting on with the job of preparing an action plan.

The role of the committee is:

to develop an Access and Inclusion Action Plan.

- monitor and report on the implementation of the Access and Inclusion Action Plan;
- provide advice to Council on issues and policy matters and/or other relevant documents relating to the access and inclusion of people with a disability to all Council facilities and services;
- promote the Access and Inclusion Action Plan and Positive Ageing Strategy initiatives throughout the Murrindindi Shire;
- provide advocacy on accessibility related issues;
- encourage community inclusion of people with a disability;
- connect with the community and relevant service providers to ensure that the needs of people with a disability are represented;
- to liaise with appropriate bodies around issues of accessibility and inclusion of people with disabilities in community activities.

“We look forward to developing the access and inclusion plan, and making a real difference to our community,” Ms Abbey said.
