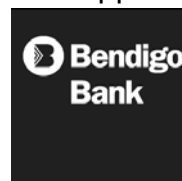

Major refurbishment will have minor impact on Breakaway Bridge

The works may be major in terms of the future longevity of Breakaway Bridge, but the look of the historic structure will remain the same.

Following the findings of a specialist bridge engineering consultant, Murrumbidgee Shire Council will be able to undertake refurbishment works on the bridge by reinforcing the structure with hidden steel beams.

Infrastructure and Waste portfolio spokesperson Cr Bernie Magner said the report by consulting engineer Peter Yttrup provided significant analysis of the bridge structure and provided the framework for future works.

"The Breakaway Bridge project reference group recently met and formed a unanimous agreement on the refurbishment option. The group agreed to keep the bridge in its original form with the agreed option to reinforce the bridge with hidden steel beams and to design a new handrail in line with the original bridge handrail," Cr Magner said.

"It has been an important collaboration between the Council and the working group to develop a positive outcome."

Reference Group spokesperson Samantha Gloury welcomed the minimal change option.

"The design is in line with the community's expectation to retain the feel of a traditional iconic type of timber trestle bridge," Ms Gloury said.

"Our community did not want a highly engineered bridge and the reference group has supported that wish throughout the consultation process."

Councillor Comment

A Happy New Year to you all. I hope that if you took some time off over the holiday period that it was pleasant and relaxing.

Reception staff at all three Council offices were kept busy during the days between Christmas and New Year with many taking advantage of our services remaining open.

Fire prevention works are currently being undertaken in the Kinglake/ Flowerdale/Glenburn areas. At the time of writing this contractors having completed slashing along National Park Road, Glenburn Road, Keith Street, Extons Road, Break O Day Road, Fanning Road and Captains Creek Road.

The recent hot weather has caused some unavoidable delays with slashing works having to be halted due to the high fire danger. Works will continue throughout the areas and we encourage residents who have any concerns about locations requiring attention to contact Council or submit a Customer Request Form which can be found on our website or at any of our three council offices.

On an exciting note, it's great to see preliminary works starting on the Kinglake East walking path.

The first stage is from the Kinglake roundabout heading east along the Healesville-Kinglake Road for about 185 metres. This section of the old path was rutted and difficult for pedestrians. A local contractor is carrying out the project and will construct the path using cement stabilised crushed rock which will resist rutting from future rainwater runoff.

Future works to the path will include extending it for a further 1.5km terminating at Edward Staff Drive via Koetong Street. The path will provide safe access for pedestrians and eliminate the need to walk along the roadway verge.

Tourism operators encouraged to Plan for visitor growth

Tourism businesses are encouraged to promote their products and services in the second edition of the Goulburn River Valley Tourism (GRVT) Holiday Planner.

The latest tourism statistics, released by GRVT, show significant growth in tourism numbers across the Murrindindi Shire.

Council's Economic Development portfolio holder Cr Christine Challen said the planner was a flagship piece of marketing collateral for the GVRT region that encompasses the Shires of Murrindindi, Mitchell and Strathbogie and the city of Greater Shepparton.

The most recent statistics (year ending September 2012) show Murrindindi Shire welcomed 743,000 domestic daytrips – up 24 per cent on year ending September 2011, while the shire supported 242,000 overnight stays - up 50 per cent for the same period.

"There is a real opportunity for tourism operators to partner GRVT in promoting the services and the wonderful attractions, of not only the Murrindindi Shire, but the greater Goulburn River Valley region," Cr Challen said.

The Holiday Planner is split into two easy to navigate sections. The first section features suggested tours, with detailed maps pinpointing business locations and allowing visitors to 'self navigate' the region, in the Heart of Victoria. The second section is dedicated to showcasing individual townships and what is on offer in each unique location.

"Significantly, the Holiday Planner is supported by a range of marketing tools including an online component via the Goulburn River Valley Tourism website as well as a free Smart Phone App with GPS and Google mapping capabilities," Cr Challen said.

"This will allow consumers to have instant and interactive access to the businesses promoted within the Holiday Planner and these features will be free additions for advertisers."

Visitor numbers on the rise and rise

Murrindindi Shire's reputation as a great place to visit is on the rise.

While the summer period has been attracting visitors looking to escape the heat and take in our brilliant waterways and tranquil surrounds, the latest round of tourism figures show that our vale as a destination is growing, particularly in the 25 – 34 years age group.

Council's Economic Development portfolio holder Cr Christine Challen said the figures – year ending September 2012 – were a wonderful set of numbers.

"Tourism is a key factor in our economic success as a shire, and the latest statistics provided by Goulburn River Valley Tourism (GRVT) has provided us with an insight into the visitor profile and the importance of their stays on the local economy," Cr Challen said.

"The Murrindindi Shire region received 743,000 domestic daytrips through to September 2012 – a significant increase of 24 per cent on the year ending September 2011. It shows that Council's decision to support GRVT and its Heart of Victoria campaign is paying handsome dividends."

The largest age group of day trip visitors to the shire was those aged 25 – 34 years (36.1 per cent) and over two thirds of the visitors were from Melbourne.

Rural Finance is urging citizens to take advantage of the Marysville and Triangle Investment Subsidy. Rural Finance CEO Mr Rob Goudswaard said the program is designed to support potential infrastructure development projects such as tourism and rental accommodation, retail and professional services accommodation as well as restaurants and food premises and light industry.

"The nature of the financial assistance provided under the program is a subsidy on loan interest payable where new borrowings are incurred to fund eligible infrastructure investment projects," Mr Goudswaard said. "To date we have approved a variety of subsidies to help restore the region and bring tourists back to the area which will help Marysville to rebuild. It will also assist with job creations and economic growth in the fire affected areas of Marysville, Narbethong, Buxton and Taggerty."

As a guide the applicant will be required to demonstrate:

The need for the development,

The suitability of the development in the region,

The impact of the development on local accommodation, job creation and/or economic growth.

The financial assistance available is an interest subsidy equivalent to 50 per cent of the interest payable on approved borrowings. The subsidy is paid annually in advance directly to the commercial lender based on the liability and stated interest rate at the time of application and subsequent annual review.

The maximum subsidy amount is \$75,000 per annum per individual applicant or per project.
