LIONS TRIANGLE TOOL LIBRARY

The Lions Triangle Tool Library has moved and is operating at its new address. You will now find us setup in the containers at the back of the El Kanah Property - Turn off the Buxton-Marysville Road into the joint driveway with Camp Marysville follow the signs and look for the two shipping containers and there you will find us.

The Tool Library was set up to help you, the people of the Triangle Community with your recovery after the 2009 fires. The Marysville and District Lions Club feel there is still a need for the tool library and are going to assess the ongoing requirements of the community.

The continued operation of the library will mean that the management of running costs will need to be assessed. To this point the costs have all been covered by the Marysville and District Lions Club, however we believe that by asking those using the library for a small donation on each loan would be a great start on alleviating the financial pressure these costs have placed on the club.

There are many tools that have been loaned to community members that are due (or overdue) to be returned to the library. If you have any tools from the library, we ask that you ensure they are returned in a timely fashion to ensure that all of the community have the opportunity to benefit from them.

A roster has been set up for the volunteers that man the library. The library is open 9am - 10am Friday - Monday for you to borrow and return items, but it is best to phone ahead. The library phone is managed at other times by the volunteer who is on duty and they will answer when you ring and make arrangements with you to get you what you need. Remember that it is best to plan ahead as we are all volunteers with other commitments as well.

MAYOR'S CHAIR

On the weekend, Councillors and the Executive Team commenced work on the development of the Council Plan for the next four years. Based on the outcomes of the Community Visioning Day held in August 2012 and the extensive feedback from the community survey, it will contain the major activities that will need to be undertaken to provide a foundation for the achievement of our long term aims. It covers all aspects of Council's operations.

One of the essential pieces of work will be the revision of the Municipal Strategic Statement (MSS) which, when linked to State Planning Policies, provides the rationale for the use and development of land within the shire. With support from the Department of Planning and Community Development, the current MSS is being reviewed to identify where the plan can be updated and improved.

The shire needs to increase its rate base to provide high level of service to the community without excessive rate increases. In the community feedback we have received, the community places high value on maintaining our country lifestyle with expansive native forests and broad acre farms. We need to re-examine how areas are used to maintain

farming production and to preserve the natural environment while providing industries, housing and utilities for an increased population.

We also have to recognize the changes being brought about when a revised Bushfire Management Overlay is implemented, as it has a stronger level of control over development standards in bushfire prone areas. And of immediate concern we must also plan to overcome the removal through the Buy Back Scheme of more than 80 properties from the rate base.

While they are still important, the region is no longer mainly geared for sheep and cattle production. Our area is increasingly recognised for the development of intensive horticulture industries. There have also been transitions in the timber industry and the potential for carbon farming plantations must also be considered.

The new MSS must address all these issues. It will not be a simple job but just as clearly it must be done and we all need to be involved. I look forward to your contributions.

Works to improve rail trail experience

Works to enhance the interface of the rail trail with major roads across the Murrindindi Shire are scheduled for early February.

The sealing works will add to the safety of the rail trail and the comfort of users.

Council's General Manager Sustainability Michael Chesworth said the sealing works were in response to user comments.

"The rail trail is getting outstanding use. More than 90 per cent of the feedback received is very positive and constructive," Mr Chesworth said.

"An area of concern that has been raised is the approaches to major roads and the need to improve the surface. It can get slippery on occasions with loose gravel, so in conjunction with Mitchell and Mansfield Shires, works will be undertaken to improve those access and egress points across the length on the trail.

"Works across the Murrindindi Shire are expected to start on 4 February – weather permitting – and will take about two weeks to complete.

"We do not expect any delays to highway traffic, however there will be some minor inconvenience for users."

The works are planned for:

Maroondah Highway, Koriella

Goulburn Valley Highway, Cathkin

Goulburn Valley Highway, Homewood

Melba Highway, Yea

Whittlesea - Yea Road, Yea

"We do ask people to take care on the trail during this time. The works will enhance the overall experience of the trail and importantly add to the safety of all users," Mr Chesworth said.

Final decision needed for Taggerty Community Project

The Taggerty community is being given the opportunity to have a final say on two projects proposed for the locality.

At the last meeting held in September 2012 a working group was formed to investigate the feasibility of two project proposals put forward by the community - a community park or a walking trail.

Murrindindi Shire Council's Chief Executive Officer Margaret Abbey said that the working group will now report back with its findings.

"A decision needs to be made on a suitable community project for the township. This meeting will be the final chance for the community to vote on their preferred option based on the findings of the working group," Ms Abbey said.

The Taggerty community made the decision in mid 2012 to look at alternatives to the proposed Taggerty component of the Triangle Shared Trails Project.

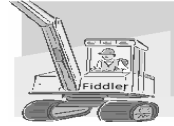
"We have the opportunity to create something really special for the town and if a decision is not made soon, we may risk not meeting the funding deadlines," Ms Abbey said.

"This project is being funded by the Victorian Bushfire Appeal Fund (VBAF) and the Department of Planning and Community Development (DPCD) and if there is no resolution it is unlikely any project will be funded into the future."

The community meeting will be run by a facilitator and will take place on Sunday 17 February at the Taggerty Primary School at 2pm.

The project is being jointly managed by Murrindindi Shire Council, and Department of Sustainability and Environment.
