Wandering stock a major safety concern

Wandering stock on the shire's roads is creating concern leading into the Easter and school holiday period.

Landholders face fines of up to \$1,000 if their stock are found to be wandering on highways, council managed roads and road reserves.

Council's General Manager Sustainability Michael Chesworth said more than 13 cows were found roaming near Strath Creek last week, and Local Laws officers had been called out after hours on a number of occasions in the last month to remove stock from roads.

"It is disappointing that the message to keep stock under control has been waning," Mr. Chesworth said.

Most recently, Council Officers have impounded and sold stock to ensure the message is received by landowners.

"With what is expected to be one of the busiest times on the roads in our area – Easter and the school holidays – it is important that we make the area as safe as possible for all motorists.

"This is a major safety issue, particularly with increased traffic across the shire.

Mr. Chesworth said it was also a warning for motorists to take extra care on the roads.

It is the responsibility of all landowners to ensure that when placing stock into paddocks adjacent to highways or roads that the fencing is of an adequate standard so that stock remain enclosed.

Failure to securely confine stock to properties may result in stock being impounded. Associated costs and a possible monetary penalty of up to \$1,000 may also be incurred.

Council could also consider the issuing of a fencing notice on the property owner which requires them to bring fencing up to a reasonable standard.

Owners and occupiers of grazing properties are also liable for any damages or injuries that may occur as a result of stock wandering outside the property boundary.

"We ask landholders to do the right thing, we do not like imposing fines, but this is a significant safety issue and has to be addressed," Mr. Chesworth said.

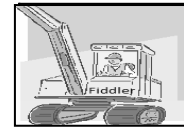

Plan your trip with care following storms

Parks Victoria is urging visitors to plan their trip with care when visiting Victoria's River Red Gum parks in the North East of Victoria this weekend.

Some parks, reserves and public land along the Murray and Goulburn Rivers have been affected by strong winds and storms. However, most areas from Wodonga to Yarrawonga and Tocumwal to Barmah are open.

Parks Victoria River Red Gum District Chief Ranger Daniel McLaughlin said the main parklands affected are between Cobram and Koonoomoo.

"The River Murray River Reserves at Cobram were the hardest hit with some changed conditions," said Mr McLaughlin.

"If you're planning a trip over the weekend or during the Easter break, check the latest conditions before you travel and take extra care during your visit."

According to Mr McLaughlin, the main message is to be aware of hazards such as fallen trees, branches and road damage.

"We expect strong winds will have weakened trees and branches so proceed with caution when walking or driving through affected areas.

"Remember to avoid seeking shelter, camping or park under large trees as they may fall unpredictably to cause serious injury or block roads," he said.

Following heavy rains in the Alpine region upstream and with more rain forecast, visitors are reminded of some safety tips:

Avoid seeking shelter, camping or park under large trees as they may fall unpredictably

Drive carefully and stay on formed roads and tracks

Look out for tree branches and woody debris floating on the river

Avoid camping close to low-lying areas and waterways

"There are still many fantastic places to visit in Victoria's River Red Gum parks for camping, bushwalking, fishing, cycling and boating over the long weekend," said Mr McLaughlin.

Visit visitor information centres for more information on interesting sights and camping areas, or activities run by local licensed tour operators.

Council seals deal on road resurfacing works

Road conditions across the Murrindindi Shire will be improved with Council supporting more than 40 locations to undergo a range of resealing works.

Council is responsible for approximately 490 kilometres of sealed road network. Each year the annual bitumen surfacing program renews approximately 30-35 kilometres of this network.

Under the current program some \$735,000 will be spent on 42 projects.

Council's Infrastructure and Waste portfolio holder Cr Bernie Magner said the works were targeted across the shire.

"The works relate to bitumen surfacing works which are important in the management of Council's road network," Cr Magner said

"There is a process for determining the works which are delivered under Council's annual capital works program.

"They are derived from an assessment from Council's asset management systems that takes into consideration road conditions and requirements outlined in Council's Road Management Plan.

"We also take into consideration community input via Council's customer request management system, correspondence received and Councillor input."

The works will commence (weather permitting) at the end of March and are expected to take four weeks to complete. Primal Surfacing Pty Ltd has been selected to carry out the works.

One of the major objectives of all Councillors is to advocate on behalf of the shire and community groups. We do this by taking advantage of every meeting with politicians, officers of government departments and community and business groups to discuss and promote our community's objectives.

This has been recently highlighted with our efforts to encourage a positive outcome to the state education dispute which has had significant impacts on our outdoor recreational facilities.

While we are not always successful, we don't let up.

I have been considering how we can achieve greater success from our advocacy efforts. As I have stated many times before I believe we will only be successful if we all invest some time in considering the needs of the shire and our wider community as well as looking at the needs of our local individual communities. To that end, I believe that a strategy used by other councils could serve us well.

Some other councils use a whole of shire team approach when advocating for major initiatives. A position is developed or

a project is defined and then representatives from community groups as well as Councillors undertake a well planned offensive to promote the idea or project through all the channels of influence available to them.

Team advocacy depends on a consistent approach from all the team members and must be backed by a consistency in the way in which the Council and community representatives are seen to be working together.

The community contributions to Vision 2030 demonstrated how we can do good work together. The fact that we are developing such a long term vision demonstrates that we are working positively to be masters of our own destinies and not sitting back and leaving it up to others. But we do need to build the momentum. The forthcoming draft Council Plan provides another opportunity to bring ideas together as a basis for an agreed future for the Shire.

I will be working with the other Councillors, the CEO and community groups to consolidate a revised advocacy approach and I encourage your involvement in the Council Plan reviews.
