What's almost three kilometres long, has hundreds of wheels and boasts thousands of horsepower? It's the annual Alexandra Truck, Ute and Rod Show.

There's plenty to see and do for the whole family at this classic event. Live music, children's amusements, trade displays, major woodchop tournament and a huge auction.

The 2012 event proved to be the largest show ever held, with an estimated 15,000 people making their way to Alexandra. 2013 marks the seventeenth annual event and is destined to be as good as previous years and the good news is that admission is free, making it a great family day out.

The success of the show in recent years has enabled the Truck Show to donate over \$100,000 to support many community organisations. This year the Truck Show will support the extension project for the Kellock Lodge aged care facility in Alexandra.

You will find all the latest, and not so latest, road-going rigs lined up in the town's main streets - giant interstate hauler's, timber trucks, logging and contractor equipment, plus a great showing of historic trucks - all of them the pride and joy of their dedicated owners. Many vehicles are specially prepared for show and shine and displayed with pride by their owners.

Adding to the day is an incredible array of utes that will line up in Alexandra's main street. The Ute section contributes to the huge following of these unique cars throughout the country by offering one of the largest ute displays on the Victorian circuit.

Plus there's a day full of great music entertainment on the main stage.

Adam Harvey will be bringing his ute and performing on the main stage alongside JR Williams, Tracy Killeen and Simply Bushed for what will be surely the biggest show yet. From 10am—4pm Sunday.

The Alexandra Truck & Ute Show event attracts thousands of visitors and is strongly supported by the local community and businesses.

Thanks to our sponsors in particular, the Truck Show is able to continue to support the local community as it has for many years by distributing funds to a number of local organisations. It is truly something by the community for the community.

The day is just not about trucks, utes and music.

There's a public auction including a large range of transport related items held from the main stage in Grant Street which gets underway at 2pm.

Trophy presentations follow from the same location at around 3.30pm.

The local Quilter's Guild will again hold their popular quilting exhibition in the Shire Hall near the main intersection in Grant Street, and this year have invited quilters from throughout Murrindindi to enter their quilts. Open from 10am-4pm Sunday.

Then there is a continuation of a feature of rural Australia since about 1870, the woodchop competitions. The last event of the Victorian wood chopping season, and one of the

biggest, is also conducted on the day. It features some of the finest, fittest and fastest local and interstate axemen in a tough series of competitions.

As we go to print, we are advised that there are forty eight axemen entered, including eleven from Tasmania.

But it's not just a bloke's event. There's event a couple of female competitors expected at the wood chop! With traditional handicapping there is always the certainty of exciting finishes.

The Woodchop Competition is sponsored by VicForests, the agency responsible for the sustainable harvest and sale of timber from Victoria's State Forests. From 10am—4pm Sunday.

The Alexandra Truck Show and Creative Ministries Network invite you to the first annual Victorian Truck Drivers Memorial Service, honouring the lives of those who have been lost in the trucking industry. To be held at Alexandra Rotary Park 2pm **Saturday 8th June**—stage behind the Visitor's Centre.

Honour rolls to return to former glory

Honour boards acknowledging the service and sacrifice of veterans from the former Shire of Yea will be refurbished under the *Restoring Community War Memorial Grants Program*.

Murrindindi Shire Council has been awarded \$7222 to undertake the project that will see the restoration and preservation of two Shire of Yea, Roll of Honor, AIF (1914-1919) boards located in the Yea Shire Hall.

Cheviot Ward Councillor John Kennedy said the boards were a lasting piece of Yea's history.

"These works will enhance the appearance and preserve the AIF Honor Rolls, more appropriately honouring the veterans who served and those who made the supreme sacrifice," Cr Kennedy said.

"The Yea Shire had a proud history of those willing and wanting to serve our country."

The boards will be restored and preserved to retain the original patina that comes with age. It will include the restoration and preservation of the timber panelling and lettering on both boards, they will be cleaned and re-varnished by a suitably skilled professional.

The boards have slowly deteriorated and have suffered some water damage as well as wear and tear common to varnished timber.

"This is a very important project that will preserve and commemorate the local service history for current and future generations," Cr Kennedy said. "We look forward to seeing the restored boards take pride of place in soon to be refurbished Yea Shire Hall."

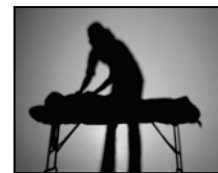

Mayor's Chair

Being more of a drowner than a swimmer, attending a swimming club meeting was a first for me. I appreciated the invitation to attend the Alexandra Swimming Club's AGM and medal presentation.

It was good to see the range of people from the youngest new swimmers to a life member with more than 60 years of association with the club. Trophies and medals were presented across the board indicating a strong culture of everyone getting in and having a go.

Swimming is obviously good for your health. There was no evidence of the obesity epidemic that we hear of daily. While the recent achievements in inter-club pennant competition might not have matched those of the past, the club has a proud strong record with, and is to be congratulated on, all the work they do in running activities for new swimmers. They are doing a great job for the community and I thank them for it.

Community attendance at the draft Council Plan and draft Budget briefing sessions has been almost as lean as the physiques of the swimming club, but like those in the club

it has been a case of quality coming through. I have appreciated the questions and feedback and I encourage written submissions by the 20 June deadline.

We are now turning our attention to getting into the carry over work and new matters listed for Year 1 of the Council Plan.

Completion of the initial version of Vision 2030 with a blue print of the way to make the vision a reality is high on the to-do list.

We can also finish the Rates Strategy Review over the coming months given the State Government's report has now been produced covering what can and can't be included in differential rates.

We'll also be pursuing options for greater community leadership involvement in a Team Advocacy approach for the shire. The Council Plan and Budget are just the start of the Councillors' work, not the end.

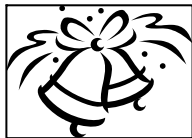

Councillor comment

I recently went to a meeting with the Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority where we discussed a number of issues affecting the shire.

One issue, raised by Geoff Hall, a guest speaker, was the infestation of our rivers and lakes by carp.

Geoff spoke passionately about the damage carp are doing to our waterways. Carp scour the bottom of the waterway where they suck up all the debris and blow out what they don't require causing our native fish to drastically reduce in numbers as well as killing off our water plants which are needed to support our macro-invertebrates, bird life, platypus habitat and the whole inter-connected environment.

A female carp can lay up to 1 million eggs in a season and live up to 20 years in the wild.

Anyone who is a regular fisher of our waterways will have noticed the carp and its growth in numbers and its destructive ways as will the many people in our communities who simply love the natural environment that we often take for granted.

It is important that resources are directed to eradicating this pest. Council is taking up the advocacy to state and federal governments on this issue and I urge you to write to the Federal Minister for Sustainability, Environment and Water, The Hon Tony Burke MP at Tony.Burke.MP@environment.gov.au and let him know how you feel, and that you want something done to get rid of carp from our once pristine waterways.

On another issue, Council is currently 'on the road' detailing the draft Council Budget as well as the draft Council Plan. Councillors, the CEO and Council officers have been on hand to explain the plans and take questions from interested residents.

The draft Budget and draft Council Plan are available on Council's website (see scrolling banner for documents), Council offices in Alexandra, Kinglake and Yea, Eildon Resource Centre and Marysville Lake Mountain Visitor Information. You are invited to read and comment on the documents. Submissions close at 5pm on Thursday, 20 June, 2013.

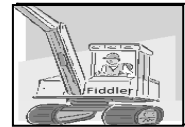

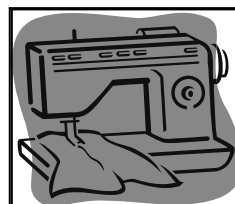

Welcome to the first edition of your local SES Unit Update – we thought after a number of years it was time to revive this regular run down on what our volunteers have been up to in the community. The Marysville SES covers the entire Triangle area for Road Rescue, Search and Rescue, Storm & Flood Events....and just about anything else we can help out with. Have a think about the last time you saw one of our volunteers out and about – we bet it wasn't all that long ago, be it at an operation, training or helping out with car parking or traffic control at a local event. Here's a quick rundown on what's been happening recently:

Last Sunday a combined team of Marysville and Alexandra SES members undertook a familiarisation hike up to Ned's Peak on the Cathedral, prompted by a recent two day Search & Rescue event in the area. Members took this opportunity to get to know the area and their neighbouring unit members better, and tested their fitness on the steep climb – we're pleased to report everyone made it to the peak, with only minor bribes of chocolate and lollies required! The unit will be continuing these walks on a regular basis, working our way through the Cathedral State Park and other local walking tracks, so if you see us around feel free to come and say hello.

A number of very successful operational jobs have been undertaken, including assisting the Ambulance with the carry out of an injured cyclist from the BMX track in Buxton, a Road Rescue at Cambarville, rescuing a horse stuck in a muddy dam, providing traffic control at the ANZAC day ceremony, the RCH Good Friday Appeal, a number of trees down on the highway and the above mentioned search – quite a variety of incidents to keep us busy! We've also had some fantastic training sessions, of particular interest were two sessions on Search techniques lead by Marysville Police Sergeant Greg Paul (you may have heard the whistles...!?), and an introduction to the equipment and procedures of Ambulance Victoria, lead by Alexandra Ambulance Team Leader Andrew Woollard. Both of these session and presenters brought an incredible amount of experience and knowledge to our unit in their fields of expertise, and were much appreciated and enjoyed.

The unit recently received a state funded Storm Trailer to add to our ever growing list of resources. This trailer has all the bells and whistles, including a mounted generator, light pole, slide out drawers, plastic tarp rollers, shadow boards, on-board water tank and will be fitted out with a list of equipment much too long to mention – it's well worth a look and an excellent compliment to our fleet of Rescue Truck, Support Utility, Transport 4WD and Lighting Trailer. If you're interested in checking out our shed, or having a look at how a training night runs, why not come along and say hello – everyone is welcome to drop in if you see us there. We have three members who've joined recently and are about to undertake their initial General Rescue training, so now is a fantastic time to consider volunteering as part of a supportive, friendly and enthusiastic team. Your local unit needs your support, and more members are needed now to undertake a variety of roles; the great thing about SES is you can choose what sort of operational or support role suits you. Give us a call or come along on a training night to have a chat about what part you can play – as an SES volunteer you will get to do some amazing things, and meet some amazing people – so why not get involved!

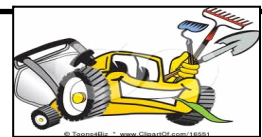

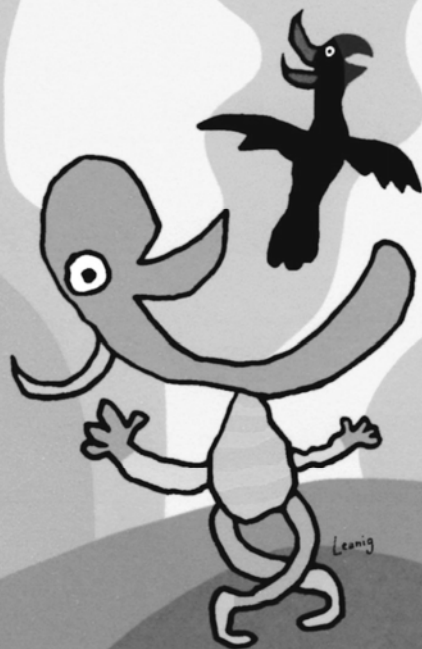

Marysville Police News

A small amount of cash was found in Marysville on ANZAC day, 25th of April. The finder handed it to police. We are looking for an owner. If you lost cash on ANZAC day, contact Senior Constable Collyer at Marysville Police - 59633222.

No fishing! If the owner cannot be determined, it will go to the finder.

From feedback, some frustration has been expressed that the Marysville police station is not always open for the purpose of signing documents etc.

There will be at least one member on duty each day until late in the evening, not necessarily at the station.

Police stationed at Marysville are responsible for Rubicon, Taggerty, Buxton, Narbethong, Lake Mountain, the Cathedrals and part of Big River State Forest - in fact most incidents requiring police attention in this area are not within the Marysville township.

While there are no police at the station, it is likely they will be working in one of these areas, or assisting in areas normally covered by neighbouring stations such as Eildon, Alexandra, Warburton, Kinglake or Healesville.

If the matter is urgent ring 000 - always. If you have no phone and are outside the locked front door of the station, push the button on the wall which makes a call to a station manned continuously. A police member will answer - explain the problem.

If not urgent, ring the station on 59633222. The phone diverts to the station mobile.

If the police officer is out of phone range or on another call, please leave a voice message.

Once again, if its **urgent** - **don't ring the station** - ring 000.
