“Hip, Hip, Hooray, for Yarra Valley Railway!!!.”

Healesville Chamber of Commerce has lauded today's announcement of funding for the completion of the Yarra Valley Railway, as the most significant tourism development in the region, in memory.

“Healesville Chamber congratulates YVR and the team at Yarra Ranges Council for their great effort in securing federal government funding which will virtually see the completion of this incredible project.” President Bruce Argyle said.

“This project will create jobs, add significantly to the tourism attraction of the Valley, and will make a major contribution to the local economy, by providing a tourist railway link between Healesville and Yarra Glen,” he said.

Federal Minister for Regional Services, Hon. Catherine King, today announced YVR had successfully tendered for \$3.56million dollars funding which will all but complete the budgeted \$9.1 million forecast to have the railway operating in 3 years.

Funding of over \$5million has already been secured through contributions by State and Local Government, Community, Corporate and hundreds of thousands of dollars raised by the railway volunteers themselves.

The YVR, in conjunction with Yarra Ranges Council, has implemented a restoration plan for the Yarra Glen to Healesville rail corridor including buildings and car park at Yarra Glen station, yard and mainline track restoration and bridge reconstruction.

Chamber Vice President, Graham Taylor, said independent research indicates ‘200,000 plus’ will travel the steam heritage railway on an annual basis.

“This is a major boost for the communities of Healesville and Yarra Glen, and for tourism in the region. It is a tribute to the YVR team of volunteers for the countless hours of work they have put in to this great project,” he said.

Healesville Chamber congratulates YVR President, Brett Morton and Vice President, Brett Whelan, their team of 350 volunteers, and Yarra Ranges Council staff who put many hours in to preparing the application for RDA funding.

Victoria's former fire chief recognised with prestigious Australian Fire Services Medal

Minister for Environment and Climate Change Ryan Smith has congratulated former Department of Sustainability and Environment Chief Fire Officer Ewan Waller who was recognised yesterday for his outstanding service to fire management, when he was named as an Australian Fire Services Medal recipient.

The Australian Fire Services Medal is awarded on Queen's Birthday and Australia Day to members of the Australian fire services who have provided distinguished service.

“I am delighted that Ewan has been named a recipient of the Australian Fire Services Medal, and I have no doubt all who know him will be pleased,” Mr Smith said.

“Only a handful of people receive this medal each year, which serves as further testament to Ewan's achievements.”

Mr Smith said Mr Waller had been influential in helping to shape and change the way bushfires are managed in Victoria.

“In his forty year career, Ewan worked in everything from forest management to land use planning, before moving into bushfire management,” Mr Smith said.

“Ewan had worked on the frontline as a firefighter for several years before becoming Chief Fire Officer, the most senior operational firefighting role within DSE (now the Department of Environment and Primary Industries).

“In the seven years that he was Chief Fire Officer, Ewan displayed outstanding leadership and direction, supporting the department and its staff through several tough fire seasons and bushfire events including Black Saturday.

“As Chief Fire Officer, Ewan made a commitment to expand the state's planned burning program to help protect lives and property. This commitment remains a priority for the department today, and the increase in planned burning has helped reduce fire risk for numerous communities,” Mr Smith said.

The Australian Fire Services Medal was introduced in 1988. The medal will be presented by the Governor General to recipients at a ceremony later in the year.

VicForests Community Support Program closing date approaches

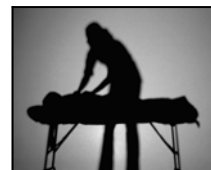

Mayor's Chair

The Referendum to change the Constitution to include Local Government in the list of organisations to which the Commonwealth may direct funds has generated some more claims for the No Case.

A false fear of the Commonwealth by-passing the States and supposedly undermining the Federal-State relationship has been raised by three former Ministers of the Howard Government, a government that established the major on-going direct funding program to Local Councils from the Commonwealth – the Roads to Recovery program.

The funds from this program are essential if we are to properly maintain our roads. Our allocations of rate funds would be insufficient to do the job without the extra money that the Roads to Recovery program provides. It is essential that we have certainty of this on-going support for the long term so the Shire may overcome the financial hurdles that we face.

In accepting such direct funds are we assisting the Commonwealth to undermine the relationship with the State Government? No - the funds mean that we, and the State, require less revenue to maintain roads – revenue that can be allocated elsewhere by State departments or to reduce the demand on Council rates.

Are there any areas of Council's operation which, if directly supported by the Commonwealth, could adversely affect the State Government? An alternate funding source doesn't allow Council to operate outside existing rules and regulation. Council would still be bound by State planning rules; environmental acts; road safety standards; health regulations; OH&S; and building regulations to name a few. Councils can still be sacked by the State Government and the wording of the proposed amendment recognises that Local Government Councils are created by State Government. There will be no undermining of the State Government if the proposed amendment is accepted.

In Australia, making changes to the Constitution is very difficult even for minor legal housekeeping as proposed here. Success will be dependent upon a major information campaign to which Council will be making a contribution in line with our relative size and budget.

It is good insurance to gain certainty for much needed support and thus achieve a far greater return on the investment.

Y Water Centre set to make a splash on Yea landscape

One of Yea's most significant developments has been given the construction green light.

The much anticipated Y Water Centre at Yea Wetlands will house a state-of-the-art interpretive centre as well as a regional Visitor Information Centre.

Mayor John Walsh said Council's approval of the construction tender and a decision to support the establishment of an incorporated body to manage the centre paved the way for the building to take pride of place on the wetlands fringe.

"This is a positive example of a community project that will be driven by the community, with Council playing an advocacy role," Cr Walsh said.

"The funding for the project has been externally sourced, however Council has made a commitment to support the ongoing operations of the Visitor Information Centre through staffing and assistance to meet initial start-up costs.

"We are supporting the development of an incorporated body that will oversee the operation and maintenance of the centre. They will be the key drivers of promoting this wonderful facility and ensuring its future financial sustainability.

"We believe this model will be successful in bringing the community together and taking pride in what will be a great community facility. It is looking at a range of uses for the building to support a range of activities."

The tender has been awarded to local building contractors, Darjelyn Constructions. The Kinglake-based company recently completed the Kinglake Medical Centre.

Capital funding for the centre has been secured through the State Government and Melbourne Water through the Regional Benefits Grants Program. Through the generosity and efforts of the local community, the Yea Wetlands Trust has raised an additional \$200,000 that will be put towards the interpretive content and environmental learning programs that will be delivered through the centre.

It is anticipated that works will commence in June.

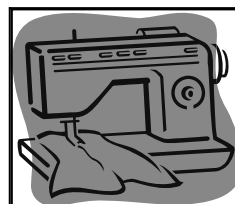

Cr Bernie Magner of Murrindindi Shire Council is a Director of Resource GV believes as residents we need to minimize what we put out or recycle because dealing with waste is a major cost for councils.

Those residents wishing to take advantage of the free stickers can request one from their local council service centre.

However, if you are happy to read the material delivered then you are encouraged by Resource GV to share or dispose of the literature in your recycle bin (taking the plastic covers off first) not the rubbish bin which eventually finds its way to landfill.

Resource GV is undertaking the waste avoidance campaign in an effort to lessen the staggering 7.5 per cent of garbage (by weight) that is sent to landfill each year which is advertising material.

The NO JUNK MAIL stickers are not anti-business, Resource GV believes they provide residents with a choice as many catalogues are available from an on-line portal such as www.cataloguecentral or www.Lasoo-Online-Catalogues.com.

The campaign aims to provide 15 per cent of the region's households with a sticker thereby avoiding unnecessary waste going to landfill.

Resource GV are asking people:

- If you like receiving junk mail – recycle it all
- If you do not wish to receive it – obtain a No Junk Mail sticker from your council
- Report irresponsible distribution of junk mail; and Make a 'digital choice' or share catalogues with others.

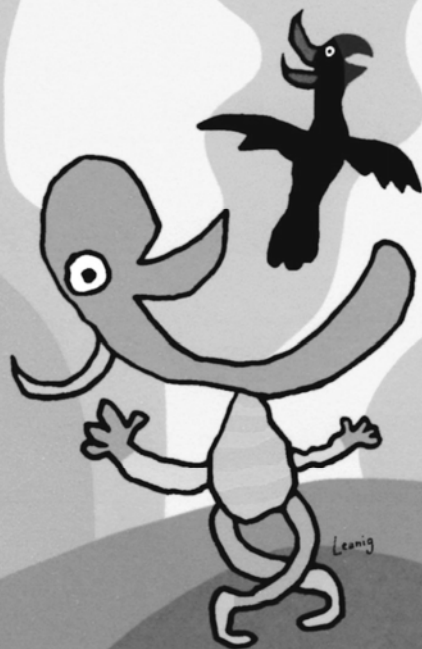
