Tumbling Waters make-over on the move

The on-going restoration and refurbishment of Tumbling Waters Recreation Reserve has resulted in a new fence being put in to protect the playground area.

The popular family and tourist destination is being developed in partnership with VicRoads and the Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority (GBCMA) and includes a designated carpark close to amenities, riverbank stabilisation and reinstatement and new play equipment.

Eildon Ward Councillor Bernie Magner said the works had created an improved safety precinct for families and fishers to enjoy the surrounds.

"The development of a designated carpark will improve safety in the area, with river access for vehicles limited," Cr Magner said.

"The installation of the fence around the children's playground will mean that vehicles and children will no longer be mixing."

"Until the construction of the fence, drivers still attempted to navigate through the play area in an effort to get to the water's edge, despite the designated carpark.

"Hopefully this will alleviate any mix of vehicles and pedestrians in or around the play area."

The reserve has also undergone a significant replanting program to provide privacy for residents in the area as well as park users.

Councillor comment

Our Budget, Strategic Resource Plan, and Council Plan have not only been put to bed, they have been tucked in as well. These documents will guide the Council in its operations and it is worth acknowledging the considerable time and effort that Council staff have given in putting all this together.

The arts history walk extending from Kinglake West to Kinglake is progressing and a meeting was held recently to bring all the involved groups together to kick off the various aspects of this and turn a vision into a reality. I was heartened by the enthusiasm at the meeting and I'm sure it will prove to be a real asset for the community and one that not only inspires interest by locals, but one that has the very real potential to be a tourist attraction. Hats off to the people involved, especially the historical society, who will be pivotal in the project's success.

Council has approved the planning permit for the petrol station at Kinglake, which also includes an extra 10 shops to be built in two stages. This development also includes up to 60 much needed car parking spaces and is being enthusiastically embraced by all in Kinglake. It will not only provide permanent fuel supplies in the town, but will expand the retail precinct dramatically, providing employment opportunities and further tourist appeal.

Well attended was the sod turning for the Y Water Centre at the Yea Wetlands. The centre adjoins the Yea wetlands and will offer an edu-

cational experience for school kids and adults alike as well as an accredited Visitor Information Centre. The Yea Wetlands offer a "nature" experience with its many intrinsic flora and fauna species. I would encourage people to take the time to visit the wetlands and take one of its peaceful walks.

We have also been brought up to speed (pun intended) on the progress of the National Broadband Network rollout in the Murrindindi Shire. I think I speak for all councillors in saying that it really will benefit the residents, schools and businesses of the shire and provide dramatic improvement in internet access for everyone. I sat in awe listening to its capabilities and potential. Yes it may take a few years to be completed but considering that it involves the layout of optic fibers, the installation of wireless hubs and even the placement of satellites, the wait will seem insignificant.

Just about everything I've mentioned is about people or the benefit of projects to people and it is worth noting that that is what Council is about - people. The Councillors and Council officers are very community minded and it is very pleasing to be able to contribute to the well being of the shires' residents and work with others who think the same.

Again I urge residents to take advantage of what the shire has to offer and to extol the shire's virtues to "outsiders".

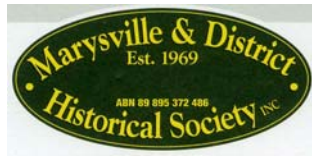

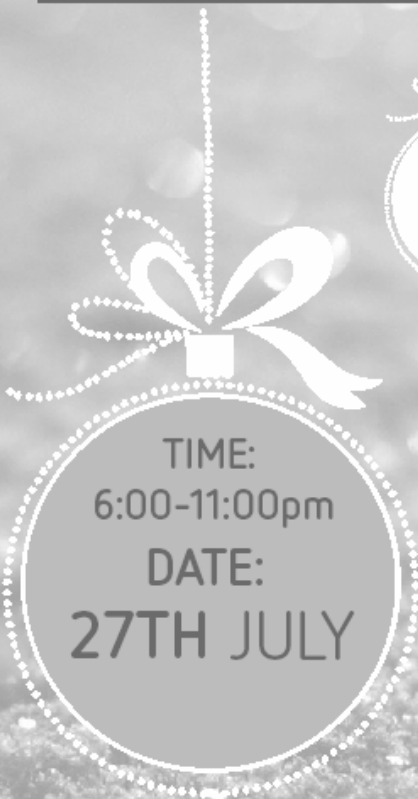

1000 hands, each an individual work of art, together a meaningful installation.

Following the 2009 Bushfires, local artists in the Triangle Arts Group (TAG) received VBAF funding and a Helen McPherson Smith Trust grant for a community project, to collect casts of hands of community members in clay to produce an installation to represent the community rebuilding their towns and lives together.

As the project evolved, the embellished and very personal clay hands were cast into concrete for extra strength and resilience.

Our concrete tile hands are now being installed as one complete work around the lake in Gallipoli Park.

For the last month the hands have waited quietly together under the community marquee. In the picture you can see them all lined up to be sorted and placed according to size, colour, content and style - a huge undertaking.

It has been like opening a time capsule as we wrap and unwrap each tile, sort, place, re-sort, re-wrap, shuffle and finally lay each hand on the wall. These hands are old friends. We know each and every one by name (even if we don't know who they might belong to) and hope you get as much enjoyment from their beauty and meaning as we do.

The Triangle Arts Group (TAG) would like to thank the Marysville & District Lions Club and all the other community members who pitched in to put up and take down the marquee, shift tables, boards and oil drums(!) and ship quite literally tonnes of concrete so that the tiles could be laid out yet remain shielded from the elements, necessary to ensure firm installation in our variable weather conditions.

We would also like to thank Ric, Justin, John, John, Mark and Siobhan for taking the care to treat the work with the utmost respect and for honouring each individual contribution.

As for each hand, this truly is a community project, with many workshop days spent creating, talking, sharing and enjoying the company of everyone as we work towards a common goal.

Now the installation is almost complete - due for finishing in spring when the weather improves. Keep a lookout for the celebration, perhaps early November, when we declare the project 'open'. In the meantime, pop down to the lake in Gallipoli Park to check out the hands that are gathered so far. You'll find they sit very comfortably in the landscape, as if they appeared there by magic.

The Department of Environment and Primary Industries and Parks Victoria are committed to protecting and enhancing the natural values of parks, reserves and state forests across the state. Examples of this conservation management are the control of introduced plant and animal species which can impact on these values.

As part of an ongoing strategy, the Department of Environment and Primary Industries is continuing to lay buried baits containing sodium fluoroacetate (1080 poison) on public land for the control of foxes. Baiting commenced Monday 14th January and will continue until Friday 13th December 2013. Baits will be laid at strategic sites and other known areas of fox habitat within the above mentioned forests and parks, within the vicinity of townships Eildon, Rubicon, Taggerty, Buxton, Marysville, Narbethong, Healesville, Warburton and Toolangi.

1080 poison signs will be posted throughout the baited areas and members of the public who are living, visiting or working in the above named areas are advised to take particular care not to disturb or interfere with bait stations. Domestic dogs and cats are particularly susceptible to 1080 poison and should be under effective control, muzzled or kept away from the poisoned areas.

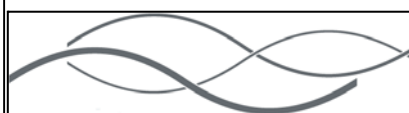
