1000 Hands: A place of reflection, hope and community spirit

Marysville's Gallipoli Park has been transformed with a sea of colourful hands projecting the wonderful spirit shown by so many in rebuilding the Triangle region.

The 1000 Hands Project, developed by the Triangle Arts Group, has had the final tiles put in place adding yet another dimension to the popular park.

Cathedral Ward Councillor Christine Challen joined arts group members Siobhan Kelly and Lisa Nolte as the final tiles were installed.

"This is truly a symbolic project that represents a hand of hope, support and effort in rebuilding Marysville and Triangle," Cr Challen said.

"1000 Hands is an inspirational project derived and developed by the Triangle Arts Group and it celebrates and acknowledges the efforts of all community members in the rebuilding process following the 2009 bushfires.

"The landscaping and colour make a spectacular sight around the Gallipoli Park Memorial Lake."

The special place of reflection has seen the construction of a series of low curved walls around the memorial lake, that have had the tiles mounted on them with capping provided to allow for visitor seating.



"The final result is testament to the outstanding work and participation of the Triangle Arts group and the recognition of the importance of the project from Gallipoli Park Committee of Management, Marysville Lions Club and Council," Cr Challen said.

The project was managed by Justin Staggard with the installation undertaken by Densal's John and son John O'Neill.

The project has been made possible through kind donations made to the Victorian Bushfire Appeal Fund together with the

Helen Macpherson Smith Trust.

**.Planning scheme changes proposed to protect
our heritage**

Protecting the shire's significant heritage has taken a further step with Council supporting an amendment to the Murrindindi Planning Scheme to include nominated places identified in the Murrindindi Shire Heritage Study.

The heritage study was adopted in February 2012 and nominated places of significant heritage value for on-going protection through a heritage overlay. The proposed changes to the planning scheme will be sent to the Minister for Planning seeking approval to exhibit the changes for public comment.

Mayor John Walsh said the planning scheme controls proposed by the amendment would provide Council officers with an important suite of tools to assist in the protection of places of heritage significance within the shire.

The amendment applies to approximately 140 properties throughout the municipality, comprising 83 new heritage places identified in the 2012 study. These new places include five precincts containing 66 contributory or significant properties, as follows:-

Alexandra Main Street Commercial and Civic Precinct.

Yarck Main Street Precinct.

Yea Station Street Precinct.

Yea The Parade Precinct, including part of The Parade, Yea;

The Tallarook-Mansfield/Alexandra Railway Precinct, including the land comprising the former railway line commencing at the western municipal boundary near Trawool, through to Merton Gap at the northern municipal boundary, and the branch line from Cathkin to Alexandra.

"We have systematically worked through the staged process of identifying sites with heritage potential; researching, assessing and documenting all the places identified and now implementing the Heritage Study and Planning Scheme amendment," Cr Walsh said.

"The amendment to the planning scheme will give all members of the community, including people with properties directly affected, the opportunity to lodge a submission to the planned changes," Cr Walsh said.

"Should concerns be raised by way of objections to the inclusion of a particular property in the overlay, the Planning Scheme amendment process will provide an opportunity for those to be heard and assessed by an independent Panel appointed by the Minister for Planning.

Council will now write to the Minister for Planning to seek approval to exhibit the proposed changes.

Copies of the Murrindindi Shire Heritage Study are available for viewing at all Council offices, libraries and at www.murrindindi.vic.gov.au under the Your Property tab. The amendment documentation will be available when the Amendment has been approved for exhibition and at which time all affected property owners will be notified by mail.

Councillor comment

The one constant is change, and now it's faster and more unpredictable than ever before.

The Goulburn River Valley Holiday Planner was recently launched at Mitchelton Winery. What an impressive document.

It's a perfect coffee table book and it includes year round events, markets, maps, eating and drinking information, walking trails, adventure playgrounds and accommodation options.

All of Murrindindi Shire features prominently under the headings of Mother Nature's Wonders and Great Outdoors, The Rail Trail, Let's Get Active and Let's Get Shopping. There are pages dedicated to Alexandra, Eildon, Yarck, Acheron and Marysville, Buxton, Narbethong, Taggerty, Lake Mountain as well as Yea, Hazeldene, Murrindindi and Flowerdale.

With each segment is a Quick Response (QR) Code. This is similar to a barcode used by retailers to track inventory and price products at the point of sale. The key difference between the two is the amount of data they can hold or share. QR Codes are 2D matrix barcodes that can hold thousands of alphanumeric characters of information. Their ability to hold more information and their ease of use makes them practical and fun.

When you scan or read a QR code with your iPhone, Android or other camera-enabled Smartphone, you can link to digital content on the web; activate a number of phone functions including email and SMS and connect the mobile device to a web browser.

The ability of QR codes to connect people with each other and to multimedia digital content is incredibly useful for businesses, tourist operators and consumers alike.

Welcome to virtual tourism!

Back in the real world, for the year ending March 2013, Murrindindi Shire received 262,000 domestic overnight visitors – up by 30.3% on the previous year – and spent an estimated \$51 million in the region – an average of \$88 per night.

Murrindindi Shire received 745,000 domestic day trippers – up by 16.5% on the year ending March 2012. Daytrip visitors spent an estimated \$68 million in the region – an average of \$91 per visitor.

More overnight visitors to the region were male (63.7%) than female (36.3%) and the 15 to 24 year olds was the biggest age group, followed by the 35 to 44 year olds.

For the day trippers, the statistics tell us 54.8% were male and 45.2% were female. The largest group was the 25 to 34 year olds.

How can these statistics guide our marketing strategies and how can we add on to the visitor experience and increase the amount of spending per person?

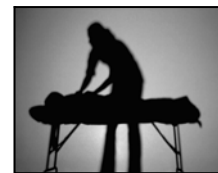

The New Marysville Pharmacy - Opening July 24!

Having never managed a pharmacy, he had minimal experience in retailing and so began a search for a manager with retail experience to help turn things around and allow him to go back to full time consulting. He found the right man in Alex Puthenpurackal who has proved to be a wonderful choice for both Andrew and the Marysville community. Alex has had experience both in Australia and overseas in all the areas needed to make a success of the business and the decision has seen the business grow into a viable pharmacy. Apart from working well together, they share a common vision, enthusiasm and faith in the future of Marysville and the Triangle, and are now equal partners in the business. Their primary focus on customer service and the lowest possible prices given the size of the pharmacy should ensure both their success and the provision of a valuable service not previously available to residents, tourists and visitors.

The intention has always been to eventually move the business up to the main street if and when a suitable shop became available and this is now the case. So Andrew and Alex are delighted to announce that the pharmacy will be moving to **Shops 2 and 3, Village Walk, 19 Murchison St.** A more visible presence combined with more stock and a larger floor area - more than triple the size! - will enable further growth and consolidation.

Naturally, Alex and Andrew have a personal interest in making a success of the business but equally see it as an important part of the fabric of Marysville. They see a very bright future for the town and have every confidence that the rebuild will continue so that it again becomes a vibrant and healthy community. Council will progress some parts of KFT Plan

Murrindindi Shire Council will progress some sections of the Kinglake Ranges, Flowerdale and Toolangi (KFT) Plan and Design Framework despite the document yet to be signed off by the State Government.

Mayor John Walsh said there were aspects of the plan that the community wanted to see progressed.

"There is certainly a desire in the community to see improvements to the attractiveness and functioning of the main streetscapes, particularly in Kinglake, Kinglake West and Pheasant Creek in order to strengthen the identity and appeal of the town centres," Cr Walsh said

"What we want to do is to work with the community to further develop ideas and concepts in the KFT Plan for the way the streetscapes can be enhanced into the future. This includes things like street furniture, connections and linkages, plantings, artworks, traffic calming, signage and guidelines for development that enhances character and identity."

It is intended that these streetscape planning frameworks will be progressed with the community in the near future.

Meanwhile Council has written to both the Member for Seymour Cindy McLeish and Deputy Premier Peter Ryan in an effort to have a decision made on the future consultation and implementation of the KFT Plan.

The Department of Transport, Planning and Local Infrastructure is still to consolidate bushfire hazard assessment and mapping into the plan, however Council wants to have the plan progressed.

"While Council is disappointed that the plan has stalled, it acknowledges the assessment will form an important part of the document," Cr Walsh said.

"The process has been frustrating and sits outside of Council's control." Cr Walsh said it was time for State Government action.

"Council continues to lobby the department to progress the next stage of the plan," Cr Walsh said.

"We are extremely mindful that the residents of the Kinglake Ranges, Flowerdale and Toolangi have waited an extraordinary amount of time to see this progressed."

The KFT plan outlines community's issues, desires and aspirations that would assist in the long-term sustainability and development of the Kinglake Ranges, Flowerdale and Toolangi region.

The draft plan proposes a development framework to strengthen the sustainability of existing towns and preserve the environmental values of the region in a way that enhances community safety in the future.

It is proposed that the revised KFT Plan be publicly exhibited for further community input once the bushfire risk assessment and related work is incorporated.

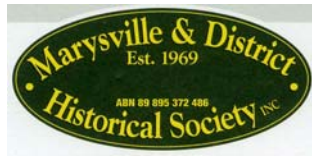

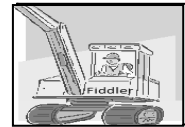



Mayor's Chair

A cheap, but misleading, trick in debating a proposition is to attribute an unlikely and extreme outcome to the proponents and to then show how unlikely and extreme the outcome is, thus implying that the original proposal is weak or unworkable.

Opponents of the referendum on the financial recognition of Local Government in the Constitution have presented false claims that Councillors have been duped into believing rivers of gold will flow if the Yes Case is successful.

We all know that regardless of which party wins the Federal election, there will be no rivers of gold and no Councillor in the shire has ever made such statements. We are supporting the Yes Case not to get new rivers of gold but to ensure current funding streams continue without which our communities will suffer.

The House of Representatives voted 133 to 2 to have the referendum to make the change to the Constitution.

The vast majority of our representatives from all sides, clearly saw the need for the change, which is unsurprising given Federal Governments of all persuasions have provided

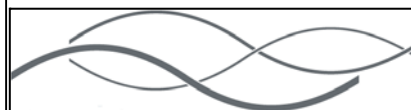
direct funding to Local Councils for the past 40 years.

The change formalises practices that have worked well but which Constitutional experts have advised could be stopped because of recent related High Court cases.

Under the rules, changes to the Constitution must rightly jump high hurdles. The foundation of our Government should not be able to be changed willy nilly. However it is important to make sensible change that brings our Constitution up to date - to take it from a time more than 100 years ago when Local Governments were very much smaller and had far fewer responsibilities. The proposed change is a small one confirming existing successful, effective, funding arrangements.

Opponents to the change have provided no offer or efficient mechanism to make up the difference if the Commonwealth's funding is successfully challenged in the High Court. That only leaves much higher rate increases if we are to maintain services.
