Visitors enticed to come and catch a big one

The Eildon Big Fish Challenge set for October has been spruiked far and wide at Melbourne's National 4x4 Outdoor, Fishing and Boating Expo held from 23 – 25 August.

Murrindindi Shire Council staff joined Alexandra Events Corporation representatives, local fishers and business people and Visitor Information Centre staff at the annual expo held at the Melbourne Showgrounds.

Council's Manager Economic Development Bob Elkington said that the Big Fish Challenge & Food and Wine Festival is generating a lot of interest and that this year's Fishing and Boating Expo was just the right environment to promote the event.

"Council were pleased to be able to support Alexandra Events Corporation by funding a promotional stand at the expo as it was the perfect opportunity to publicise the event.

"We had lots of enquiries about the region and Eildon in particular. It gave us much pleasure to be able to showcase Lake Eildon and the Pondage as it is looking spectacular with the water level at an optimum level for this time of year", said Mr Elkington.

The Friends of the Alexandra Library are sponsoring another Away With Words event. This time it is a discussion evening with author Tony Birch. Tony Birch is the author of *Shadowboxing*, a collection of stories set in the Melbourne suburbs, including Fitzroy. It is a touching, moving, and gut-wrenchingly gritty insight into the struggles of the urban working class in Australia some 60 years ago.

Birch, who has studied urban issues, clearly knows his material, exploring the shattered lives of his characters as they struggle against the city and against their own flaws and weaknesses.

The city frames the lives of the characters and provides a remarkable insight into the lives and issues of a fast-fading time in Australian history.

The main character is an ethnically marginal working class boy growing up in Fitzroy and you will feel both the street and its characters intimately as their lives spill out of rented houses.

Councillor comment

Economic development strategic planning involves accessing a multitude of information and resources and assessing factors such as the impacts of climate change to our region.

There's strong evidence to support the assertion that by 2050, the State of Victoria will experience a rise in temperature and decrease in rainfall. If we, as a Shire, can gain a thorough understanding of the likely impacts to our particular region, we can plan for these changes and adopt practices to future-proof our agricultural sectors.

Last week, Dr Robert Faggian, an agriculture and food systems academic from Melbourne University, came to Alexandra and gave us a presentation on climate mapping.

By using CSIRO climatic prediction data with an interactive geo-visualisation computer program, he's able to pinpoint ideal locations for climate ready crops. We hope to engage Dr Faggian, in partnership

with neighbouring shires and the allocation of a government grant, to investigate the possibilities associated with such comprehensive data and suitability models. Being able to share this information with all stakeholders will allow the Shire to plan for the most effective land and water use and appropriate infrastructure, improve our region's agricultural viability and provide potential investors with a prospectus for business opportunities.

Also, during this month, we've witnessed a bevy of Annual General Meetings by our community organisations and associations. It's testament to the commitment and enthusiasm of so many to brave the often inclement weather and participate in these important events and is a good time to affirm our appreciation to committee members and office bearers for their service.

Congratulations to those who've taken on official roles for the year ahead.

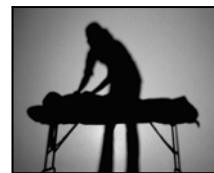

Mayor's Chair

At last week's Council meeting, the final report on the Council Plan for 2009-13 was accepted.

As the only remaining Councillor to have been involved in the initial drafting of that Plan it was a pleasant reminder to review what has been accomplished over the past four years.

Work on the Plan was started in January 2009 with an outline developed in the first week of February. In the second week of February that outline was thrown out and after many false starts while bushfire recovery and reconstruction was sorted out we agreed on the Plan in August 2009.

With only a few smaller fire related projects to be finished, the work on the Plan has been completed. Most importantly as a Shire we have survived and within Council a hell of a lot of work has gone into improving policies and practices and reducing costs. We have a solid foundation for the 2013-17 Council Plan which takes us from survival to expansion.

As a community we have also advanced. There is an increasing optimism within groups across the Shire

taking on projects with a view to working towards wider goals and being responsible for the long term success of the outcomes. The Y Water Centre, the Alexandra Timber Tramway, the Houseboat Industry Group and Murrindindi Training Institute are just some of the examples of teams of people working together to not only make an immediate impact but also taking responsibility for the on-going success of their ventures.

The projects also have benefits for wider sectors of the community. Community groups have shown and continue to show how we have the drive and initiative to run Emergency Services, sporting clubs, major events and environmental improvements, so there is no reason why we can't apply the same initiative and skills to improve the amenity of the area and grow the Shire.

The evolution of Murrindindi Vision 2030 will influence refinements to the 2013-17 Council Plan and I am sure that as the next Council team wraps that Plan up in August 2017 they will again be pleasantly reminded of the advances we have made.

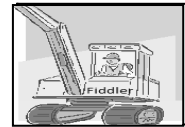

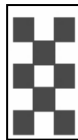

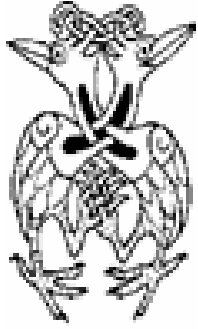
