Payment of Rate Instalments

Ratepayers are advised that Murrindindi Shire Council's first rate instalment for the 2013/2014 period is due and payable by 30 September 2013.

Credit card payments, are now accepted at all Council offices and from a secure section on Council's website www.murrindindi.vic.gov.au.

If paying by credit card, you will incur the bank merchant fee (currently 0.75%).

If you cannot pay your rates by the due date please phone (03) 5772 0333 and ask to speak to a Rates Officer who will assist you with payment options.

Installment dates are:

- 1st instalment 30 September 2013
- 2nd instalment 30 November 2013
- 3rd instalment 28 February 2014
- 4th instalment 31 May 2014

If you prefer to pay your rates in full, this can be done at any time up until 15 February 2014.

For the first time there will be an additional charge on rates notices, with Council now the State Government's collection point for the Fire Services Property Levy. This levy will be an annual charge but is not imposed by Council. All amounts received relating to the levy must be passed on to the State Government. Council receives no financial gain.

Questions relating to rates, valuations or property classification used to determine your fire services property levy, should be directed to Council's rate department at msc@murrindindi.vic.gov.au or 5772 0333.

Mayor's Chair

Last week I attended the Regional Meeting of Timber Towns Victoria at Heyfield where we had presentations from Vic Forests, Australian Paper Mills and the Heyfield Mill.

Prior to the meeting I received a briefing from My Environment on the latest research on the Leadbeater's Possum and discussed the feasibility of the proposed walking trail through our State Forests and Parks.

Over the same time, residents of Rubicon, while acknowledging the need for a timber industry, have become concerned about proposed logging activities that will impact the amenity of the area.

The Department of Environment and Primary Industries (DEPI) has recently released research as the basis for a new approach to biodiversity management to ensure the survival of threatened species. A 95% chance of achieving the minimum survivability level of Leadbeater's Possum requires additional forest reserve areas of between 67,000ha and 171,000ha depending on different estimates of the frequency and impacts of fires in the area.

In all the above briefings and discussions there were obvious points of

contention. Species survival versus timber availability, with resident and tourism amenity versus areas and methods of harvesting, to name just a few.

With no direct legislative ability to decide the use of State Forests, Council's position is to advocate for a sensible long-term balance between the competing demands. To that end, Council will be attending a DEPI workshop looking at how the Leadbeater's Possum research should be implemented mindful of the potential impacts for the environment, residents, tourism and our timber industry.

Our presentation of National Emergency Medals to people of the Shire and beyond was easily the high point of my time as Mayor. It was a wonderful, happy occasion - a great outcome from a lot of work by the Committee, CEO and Council staff in undertaking what has been a unique exercise by our Shire to recognise those who contributed so much to our communities in February 2009. I am looking forward to the presentation ceremony for those nominated in the second round.

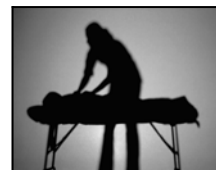

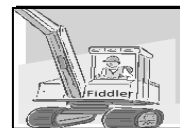

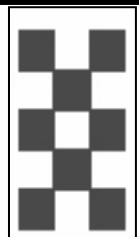

Community safety a priority for council

Potential life saving defibrillators will be located at Murrindindi Shire Council administration offices and the Yea Saleyards facility.

Chief Executive Officer Margaret Abbey said Council's Risk and Safety Committee had been proactive in identifying and purchasing the units due to the large volumes of people entering the offices each day and the large attendance at the regular cattle sales at Yea.

"Four 'Heartstart' Defibrillators have been purchased from St John's Ambulance Australia and free training was provided to a number of staff, including staff contracted at the Yea Saleyards facility. The Defibrillation training was delivered by a St John's Ambulance Officer and consisted of a four hour session that included a CPR component," Ms Abbey said.

The defibrillator units have a voice recording and give the operator advice when they are using the device.

"It is anticipated that additional training will be provided in coming months to ensure that more staff are familiar with the defibrillators and are confident in using them in the event of an emergency," Ms Abbey said.

Murrindindi Shire Council's Risk and Safety committee hopes to access further funding in the future to be able to install more defibrillator units across our communities.

For community groups considering the purchase of the devices, subsidised defibrillators are available from St John's Ambulance Australia at: www.stjohnvic.com.au/defibrillators-campaign.asp

Recent statistics show that the survival rate from Sudden Cardiac Arrest (collapse of a person, whose heart has ceased to function due to an electrical malfunction of the heart, disrupting the heart muscles normal rhythm) without a defibrillator is 2-5 per cent and the chances of survival reduces by 10 per cent for every passing minute without defibrillation.

"It is all part of our commitment in supporting safe and healthy communities," Ms Abbey said.

Amnesty supports fire prevention efforts

People need to control the size of their fires and ensure there is minimal smoke.

An alternative to burning off is a free green waste disposal being offered at Council's Resource Recovery Centres (Transfer Stations). This will take place from 1 October to 14 October. Inquiries regarding the amnesty can be directed to Council's Local Laws unit on 5772 0376 or 0408 576 712. The burning amnesty will end midnight 14 October 2013.

Reminder to renew your wildlife licence

The Department of Environment and Primary Industries (DEPI) is reminding wildlife licence holders to renew their licence before September 30.

Wildlife licences have a common expiry date of 30 September and are an important way to ensure protected wildlife are not being taken from the wild.

DEPI Statewide Manager Compliance Murray Rohde said wildlife licences allow the public to look after a variety of animals, but at the same time protects our native wildlife.

"DEPI Wildlife Officers often come across former licence holders still in possession of wildlife that is now kept unlawfully because they forgot to renew their licence," Mr Rohde said.

"It is a condition of all wildlife licences that licence holders maintain complete accurate and up-to-date records of their trade in, and breeding of, wildlife.

"This includes if people change their residential address, they must notify DEPI within 10 business days of moving.

"Wildlife officers regularly inspect wildlife collections held by commercial and private licence holders to monitor compliance with the relevant regulations and to ensure that wildlife is being obtained lawfully.

In cases where people are still in possession of wildlife without a current licence possible outcomes can be seizure of wildlife, court appearances and possible fines.

"It is a privilege for people to own and trade protected wildlife, and they should respect the licence conditions," Mr Rohde said.

In Victoria there are 11,683 basic licence holders and 1,941 advanced licences. An annual basic licence costs \$86.00 and an advanced licence costs \$159.20. Three year licences are also available.

Injured or orphaned wildlife must be handed over to licensed Wildlife Shelters and Carers for assessment and care.

Anyone who observes unlawful or suspicious activity involving wildlife should contact DEPI on 136 186.

Road management plan review highlights works priorities

Maintaining Murrindindi Shire Council's largest asset category - its local road network – has been outlined and prioritised in the latest review of its Road Management Plan.

Council's Infrastructure and Waste portfolio holder Cr Bernie Magner said the management plan was important as it described the way in which Council would fulfil its obligations under the Road Management Act 2004 in respect of those municipal roads within the shire.

"Importantly the review ensures that the standards and priorities given to the inspection, maintenance and repair of Council's roads are safe, efficient and appropriate," Cr Magner said.

"There is no doubt we face significant challenges in keeping our roads in a safe and serviceable condition. With more than 1,100 kilometres of sealed and unsealed roads we need to set priorities and clear targets for minor repairs and maintenance.

"We are committed to ensure safety, continued function and a level of service that is acceptable to the community."

The plan encompasses road user needs and expectations within an economic framework based on meeting reasonable maintenance operation targets relative to the road network function.

The network consists of arterial roads which are managed by VicRoads and municipal roads which are under the control of Council

Cr Magner said the plan had prioritised roads in terms of their use and importance across the municipality.

"Road inspection and maintenance is a significant component of the works program and the plan sets out how we determine our schedules. The shire's roads are prioritised according to road use including traffic volumes," Cr Magner said.

"The plan balances the needs of both business and community by considering factors such as risk management, road safety, social needs, environmental influences and budget priorities."
