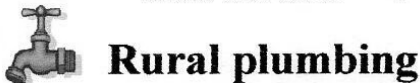

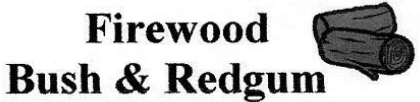

Mayor's Chair

I am soon going to have the privilege of welcoming Lions delegates to their conference in Marysville. Communities in the shire have long had the benefit of the work of our Lions groups; and during our recovery from the 2009 Fires, support from across the whole international Lions organisation was invaluable.

The most recent example of support from Lions was evident when I joined the folks at Murrindindi-Woodbourne Community Hub (MWCH) for the celebrations of the handover from Lions of a community bus. Like many of the Lions' projects this one will meet an immediate need and provide a long term community dividend. Not only is the MWCH providing trips for their older local residents but have also offered to help Murrindindi youth activities and as well as assisting with medical appointment transportation to Melbourne.

I thank Lions for their generosity and MWCH for their on-going enthusiasm in raising funds and for supporting their local and wider shire communities.

We will also soon be hosting a sec-

ond delegation of Chinese administrators from the city of Tianjin. The initial visit went so well that the next group is going to spend a day discussing Local Government finances and disaster recovery, and then stay overnight to enjoy our area before returning to Melbourne.

We'll be taking them to the cattle sales, Lake Eildon, and Marysville to give them a wide and varied experience of everything we have to offer. Overall we hope this small step will lead to greater numbers of visitors from China, soon to be the biggest source of tourism for Australia. Please make them welcome if you see them.

I also encourage all of us to be tourists in our own back yard. October in Murrindindi Shire offers so much to enjoy: Woodworking show, Sparkling Wine Festival, Taggerty dance, open gardens everywhere, Akedemos car rally at Rubicon to name just a few. Or just go for a drive, a ride or a walk in another part of the shire and see what's on the other side of the range. Take a break and have fun.

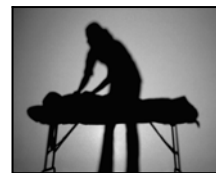

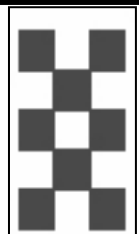

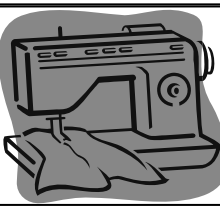

Councillor comment

This week I have been in a somewhat reflective frame of mind as I get close to the milestone of one year in the role of Councillor. What made me put my hand up to be a Councillor? What have I been able to contribute, what have I learned over this time, and how best can I meet my own and community expectations?

This has been triggered, in part, by the Local Government Electoral Review being carried out by the State Government which is seeking to find out how to improve the process of Local Government elections.

It asks questions such as 'Who should or should not be eligible to stand for elections?' 'What would you like to know about your candidates?' 'What would be the best way for additional information on candidates to be communicated to you?' 'Can the nomination process be improved?' 'Should candidates be required to reveal information such as education, committee and volunteer experience, employment, policies and political affiliations?'

These questions are relevant to potential candidates as well as voters. While candidates often have a clear reason for wanting to become a Councillor, they are often not familiar with Local Government and would appreciate information on expectations of them in that role. It is also true to say that many in the community feel they do not know enough about the candidates to decide who can represent their interests in the best way. I believe the

more information that is available early in the process for all participants, the better the outcome will be.

This might sound very theoretical and dull but, in fact, this review offers you a real opportunity to voice your opinion and express your wishes about how you would like to learn about candidates in the future, what sort of experience and commitment you feel they should possess and how the election process could be changed to give the best outcome.

What do you think would encourage good candidates to stand? What could have been done differently that might have encouraged you to stand for Council? What qualities, experience and qualifications do you expect your representatives to have?

There will be public meetings held to take personal submissions and written submissions can be made online or by mail. Full details, together with discussion papers, can be found at <http://www.dpcd.vic.gov.au/localgovernment/local-government-reform/local-government-electoral-review/how-to-get-involved>. Submissions close on Tuesday 5 November 2013.

I would really encourage all of you with an interest in improving Local Government representation to share your thoughts and ideas by putting in a submission. This is a real opportunity to get involved and to contribute.

KFT Plan: community comments to guide final plan

Murrindindi Shire Council has released a final report on the outcomes of the community consultation following the 2011 public exhibition of the Kinglake Ranges, Flowerdale and Toolangi Draft Plan and Design Framework (KFT Draft Plan).

Mayor John Walsh said the finalisation of the Community Consultation Report and the further development of the Draft KFT Plan had been on hold for some 24 months while awaiting the outcome of the State Government's bushfire risk mapping and policy development work, and advice concerning the level of support for the settlement planning and growth recommendations in the Draft KFT Plan.

In July 2011 an Interim Consultation Report was publicly released by the Murrindindi Shire Council which provided an overview of the submissions received and outlined interim responses to those submissions.

The Consultation Report was considered an "interim" report pending further work by the State Government in response to recommendations of the 2009 Victorian Bushfires Royal Commission. This work included state-wide bushfire risk mapping and the development of State Planning Policy directions governing land use in high bushfire risk areas, which would further inform Council's response to the submissions and the draft of the KFT Plan.

Formal advice in relation to the above work was received by the Council from the State Government in July 2013 enabling this Consultation Report to be finalised.

"The process had been long and at times challenging, however Council is now in a position to work towards the finalisation of the plan after we formally endorsed the contents of the Community Consultation Report," Cr Walsh said.

"While Council has been strong in advocating for the plan's progress, we now welcome the Minister for Planning's support of the draft plan taking into account his decision of not supporting recommendations pertaining to the expansion of housing development in areas of high bushfire risk.

"Discussions with the Department of Transport, Planning and Local Infrastructure (DTPLI) have confirmed that support for growth and development in the Kinglake Ranges will be limited to existing appropriately zoned areas (in-fill development) with no expansion of current settlement boundaries."

The contents Community Consultation report will guide the final KFT Plan.

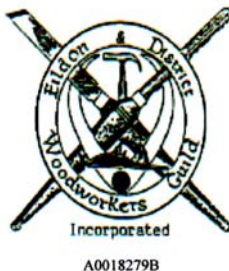
