Sale Yards celebrations look to the next 20 years

Celebrations acknowledging 20 years of operation of the Yea Sale Yards have focused on exciting times ahead for the regional selling centre.

Mayor Margaret Rae said the yards had been one of Murrindindi Shire's great success stories.

"We have a regional selling centre that has undergone significant changes and a strong focus on the future," Cr Rae said.

"The present committee and those before them should be extremely proud of what stands here today.

"Having had a look into the future via the sale yards business plan, I can see this is only the beginning. While nothing is guaranteed, the business skills and expertise that the committee is bringing to future planning have great potential for the economic benefit of this area and for the whole shire.

"As a shire and a community we need to leverage off this success to maximise those benefits.

"On behalf of the Council can I say how proud we are to be involved in this – and I firmly be-

Yea Sale Yards Committee Chairman David McKenzie said the roofing of the centre and significant upgrades to infrastructure had seen the Yea Sale Yards evolve into one of the state's finest facilities.

"As a committee we have a strong vision for the future. With increased throughput and the

opportunity to expand in international markets the sale yards will attract more buyers, sellers and agents which in turn will have a positive impact on our economy with people travelling to the region to attend sales.

"We look forward to working with agents, producers and buyers to build on our success."

Sod Turn Event - Friday 29 November 2013

Marysville Community Golf & Bowls Club have been working with Melbourne architects, Spowers, to redevelop the club's facilities after the devastating 2009 Black Saturday bushfires destroyed so much of the Marysville community.

The MCGBC were seeking to reconnect with the surrounds while strengthening its local identity and attracting 'out-of-towners'. The upgrade and expansion of the facility to include a bistro will provide rentable spaces for local community groups and functions.

With design phase completed, Club President, Mr Ken Whittingham and Deputy Premier and Minister for Regional and Rural Development, the Hon Peter Ryan MP, came together to 'turn the first sod' and officially begin construction, with Becon Constructions as the appointed builder.

Construction is due for completion in 2014.

Mayor's Chair

As we move towards the end of 2013, it is natural to reflect on what has happened during the year – and in particular to review what we have achieved.

I attended the 2013 Local Government Ministerial and Mayors Forum recently where local government performance was one of the topics. A new Local Government Performance Reporting Framework is currently being trialled for full introduction in the 2014-2015 financial year.

The message was very clear: we need to look at what we do worst and what we do best – and not shy away from either. My approach to this is that Local Government in general and our organisation in particular need to effect cultural change – from reacting to identified needs to proactively planning for identified needs.

Events over the past few years have constrained us to the reactive model; now it is time to change and I am pleased that our whole organisation is embracing that philosophy.

It will take time. Council is responsible for delivering well over 100 services, encompassing physical services, waste management, planning and environmental services, economic development and tourism, community services, and arts and cultural programs - and each of those has its own level of complexity and differing set of requirements.

A quick count of the organisations and bodies we deal with is a revelation – in the space of a couple of

minutes I identified over 60 and the real figure would be even higher.

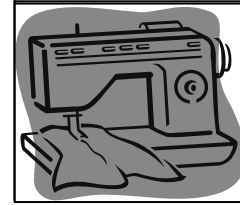
The most important communication, however, is with our communities – and we have around 40 identifiable and diverse communities in our shire. Their needs and aspirations essentially set the framework for service delivery and the challenges that presents.

If our population were concentrated in one major town, many issues would be easier to resolve and costs could be mitigated; but this will never be the case. When you consider our very small rate base and the 3889 sq.kms. over which services must be delivered, together with the ever increasing requirements and costs of compliance and the constraints that exist, I believe we are doing a good job overall.

While we don't get everything right, we are working together – Councilors and Council officers – to constantly improve. That means being accountable and acknowledging and reviewing what we do worst as well as what we do best.

The first quarterly report on this year's Council Plan was formally presented at the November Council meeting. It is salutary to read it and see what we are achieving. The full document and a summary of the first quarter can be found on Council's website and provide a window into the complex range of activities and services delivered. I commend it to you.

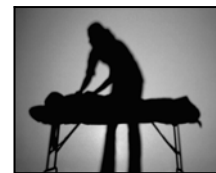

Councillor Comment

It is a fact of existence that many Council activities are enabled as a result of grant funding.

This system of financing projects is the result of meeting the speciality needs of different councils as well as identification by State and Federal governments of areas where particular departments could assist with the many diverse projects that councils take on.

Grant funding is also a reality for the broader community and is accessible to a wide range of groups, institutions, businesses and, to some extent, individuals. Grants for particular projects can come from Local, State and Federal governments as well as non government organisations and the corporate sector.

There is an array of grants available to assist with such things as developing export opportunities, recovery after a disaster, enhancement of education provisions, arts and literary focused events, animal welfare, environmental preservation projects, agricultural facilities, volunteer emergency service equipment, sporting facilities, encouraging business innovation, tourism events, employment recruitment, energy efficiency, etc.

The list seems almost endless and covers practically every aspect of life, but funds are finite.

Successful procurement of a grant is dependent on many factors. How well does the project fit the grants intention? How needy is the appli-

cant? How many people or organisations have applied? Does the application conform to requirements?

Identifying and applying for grants has become a specialised area and many communities and organisations utilise a specific grants officer for this purpose. Murrindindi Shire Council is no exception and employs a grants officer to not only assist council, but also to serve the Murrindindi community at large. Certainly those people and organisations who are grant savvy can benefit greatly from this knowledge.

If you believe you, your business or your community group would qualify for and could benefit from a grant, I would suggest that the first step is investigate what grants are available. This can be done through a simple search on the internet. Although this may not reveal what all those grants are about, it is a good start.

Another important step in considering a grant is to talk to the funding body. Ensuring that you are actually eligible and can apply will save an enormous amount of time.

Council is supportive of groups making funding applications, but we encourage you to ensure the requirements are met before lodging your request. Should people and groups need assistance as they come to the end of application process, Council would be more than happy to assist.

20 Years of Waterwatch – Why we monitor our waterways!

Waterwatch Victoria is a successful community engagement program connecting local communities with river health and sustainable water issues and management. The Waterwatch program was initiated in 1993 to enable the community to become involved in the monitoring and management of waterways in their catchment. It aims to raise knowledge in the community about water issues and to encourage water quality monitoring groups to undertake constructive action. Volunteers with a passion for the environment provide water quality data from waterways across the State from Gippsland to the Mallee. The data is used to monitor waterways over time to establish their condition and whether change (positive or negative) is occurring. It is also useful to monitor recovery after such events as fire or flood.

Goulburn Broken Waterwatch was established in 1993 with our still serving David Hodgkins being the first Waterwatch coordinator in our region, as well as the State!

Some facts about Goulburn Broken Waterwatch:

Over the last 20 years there have been a total of 230 monitors testing waterways within the Goulburn Broken Catchment at different times

There are currently 50 active monitors in the Goulburn Broken Catchment

There have been a total of 863 sites monitored in the Goulburn Broken Region over the 20 years

There are currently 223 sites being monitored in the Goulburn Broken (1527 in entire State)

During the 2012/13 Financial year, there were 1587 site visits made with data sets collected

There are 150,000 data sets in the State Waterwatch Data Management System, and 40,000 of those are from the Goulburn Broken Region

Recently Goulburn Broken Waterwatch hosted luncheons around the catchment to thank past and present monitors for their participation in building up our data set. It was fantastic to see people from the North of the Catchment attending luncheons in the south, and south attending east and mixing with other monitors they had not met previously. Monitors have similar passions, and new friendships were made.

The lunches were also combined with our annual Quality Assurance Quality Control testing, which is an essential part of ensuring the data that we collect is recognized by organizations such as the Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority as credible data, and therefore useful to them in relation to projects that they undertake around the catchment.

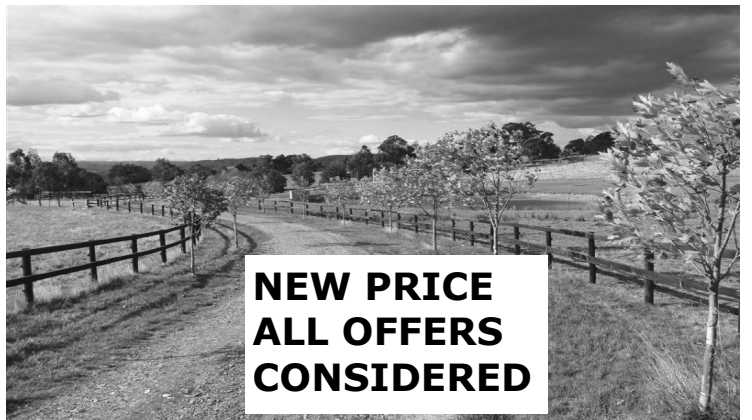

Solid start to achieving goals of Council Plan

A range of activities that support the Council Plan 2013-17 has been delivered in the first quarter of the newly structured plan which defines the four key components on which Council will focus - Our Community, Our Environment, Our Economy and Our Council - and outlines what Council expects to achieve over a four year period and guides the allocation of finances.

Mayor Margaret Rae said the quarterly review was not only an important guide for Council, but the community and other key agencies.

"It is pleasing to see such a solid and significant start to the new plan," Cr Rae said.

"It clearly demonstrates that Council staff have been working solidly to deliver for the community."

Overall the first quarter showed:

- 42 activities were on schedule
- 44 activities were ongoing
- 6 activities were not due to commence
- 3 activities were completed

"The plan is a key document for local community groups, residents, investors, and other levels of government who play a vital role in helping Council deliver on its commitments," Cr Rae said.

Highlights of the first quarter included:

The "Change It Up" youth leadership program was delivered involving 20 young people engaged in a three day program to represent the ideas of young people from across the shire.

A policy has been formed to outline how native vegetation is to be managed for all Council Infrastructure works. In conjunction with this policy, staff have developed a roadside management guide to assist in the delivery of the works program.

The concept of a shire-wide peak business and tourism body progressed well during the quarter with a road show of open business forums. Incorporation of the body is close to being finalised.

Council has assisted with the establishment of a representative body to assist the Houseboat Industry in maximising its growth and addressing regulatory challenges.

Council has supported the establishment of the Rivers and Ranges Community Leadership Program which will support community lead-

ers in developing their advocacy skills.

Council continues to advocate for support from the State Government to cover the on-going operating, maintenance and renewal costs associated with the gifted and novated assets as a result of the 2009 fires.

There has been advocacy to the Victorian Government with support from the Hume Local Government Network and the High Country Councils Coalition, for the provision of funding for both the initial capital and the ongoing maintenance of trails.

A Capital Works Policy that details how savings from capital works programs will be managed was developed and adopted by Council.

"As a Council we are pleased with the strong start to the year," Cr Rae said.

"The plan provides for many challenging activities, however Council and its staff are committed to delivering strong outcomes that will continue to build and support the needs of the shire."

Spring domestic firewood collection season ends on November 30th

The Spring 2013 Firewood Collection Season will close across Victoria this weekend (Saturday 30/11/13).

Department of Environment and Primary Industries (DEPI) Statewide Land and Fire Coordinator Rob Price said: "We want to remind people that, from the 1st of December 2013, all designated firewood collection areas will be closed over the Summer period and it will be illegal for people to collect firewood on public land until the start of the Autumn Firewood Collection Season.

"Some designated firewood collection areas may already be closed because the supply in that area has already been exhausted," Mr Price said.

"The public will be able to start collecting firewood again from designated firewood collection areas from the 1st of March 2014, pending suitable conditions enabling safe access to forests and parks."

DEPI and Parks Victoria staff will be patrolling parks, forests and reserves throughout summer to ensure people are doing the right thing.

Firewood collection is only permitted during designated times of the year and from designated firewood collection areas.

Typical on the spot fines are around \$560. Offences that go to court may be liable for fines up to \$7042, one year imprisonment or both.
