MOU supports strong houseboat industry

Enhancing the reputation of the Eildon houseboat industry as a leading and professional local sector has been further bolstered with a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) being signed between the newly formed Lake Eildon Houseboat Industry Association and Murrindindi Shire Council.

The MOU has been developed as part of the Victorian Government funded Eildon-Thornton-Alexandra Advancing Country Towns project and engages the Association to design and develop a code of conduct and quality accreditation framework for its members.

Eildon Ward Councillor Bernie Magner said the framework would set high standards and generate a competitive advantage for member businesses.

"The Lake Eildon Houseboat Industry is a key economic driver for the local economy and the Association wants to enhance its reputation as a leader in its manufacturing and workmanship in the houseboat industry," Cr Magner said.

"The MOU sets the framework for the industry to meet those high standards and gain advantages on its competition.

"Council is pleased to be supporting this project."

Association President *Mike Dalmau* said the MOU was fundamental to ensuring a positive fu-

ture for Lake Eildon houseboat builders, operators and tourism generally.

"It provides a clear framework in the way we operate and how we can be assessed as an organisation," Mr Dalmau said.

"You know when you are involved in building, buying or renovating a houseboat from Eildon, it will be done at the highest of standards and with tradespeople who have adhered to a set of guidelines and principles that will deliver quality.

"It also opens up the opportunity for job creation and apprenticeships."

A total of \$25,000 is being provided by the Council from the Advancing

Country Towns funding to support the project. Advancing Country Towns is a four-year, \$9.4 million Victorian Government investment in nine regional and rural communities. The program is working to address the challenges of rapidly changing populations, industries and environments.

The Eildon, Thornton, Alexandra Advancing Country Towns project (2011-2015), being led by Murrindindi Shire Council, has received a grant of \$890,000 from the Advancing Country Towns program.

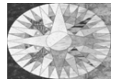

Launch of the new Summer campaign

Melbourne's wet and dreary weather at Federation Square on Thursday of last week did not deter members of the Marysville community combining with the Bendigo Bank and Fed Square in launching the exciting new program to encourage people to visit Marysville and help to continue building the local economy which is still in recovery mode following the devastation in 2009.

The local steel band Pans on Fire had Melbournians, tourists and visitors to Federation Square clapping along in delight as the new **Wish You Were Here** video and images were flashed across the huge screen in the square. At the heart of the campaign is the need to make the wider community and overseas visitors aware that Mother Nature has turned the blackened images of Marysville into a green oasis. In recent times we have come to realise that the issue of drugs is not confined to metropolitan areas but can and does occur right across our state and the whole country – and has been experienced even in our own country towns.

As part of the strategy to increase education and awareness of this issue, opportunities are being provided for parents, families and the general community to get more information from people working in the field.

Such a forum was held recently in the Alexandra Shire Hall and was supported by the Alexandra District Hospital, Goulburn Valley Area Mental Health, Murrindindi Shire Council, Nexus Primary Health and Victoria Police. The presentation gave straightforward, clear information on the drug known as Ice (methamphetamine) and assistance in recognising the signs when it is being used.

An incredibly valuable part of the session was contributed by one of our local police officers who shared his personal story and experiences with us. Whilst the audience was not large, nevertheless I am sure that

everyone who was there gained markedly from the experience and from participating.

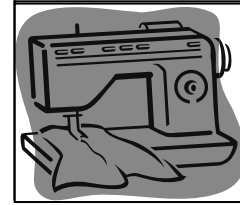
Our young people deserve the best chance they can get in life – and we need to ensure that they get the best information available so that they can make the right choices.

The clear message from that forum was to keep the lines of communication open, to talk honestly with the young people close to you, and not to judge but to be there for support. The best help can often come from families and friend.

Let us do our best as a community to provide that support to enable others to grow and achieve their full potential.

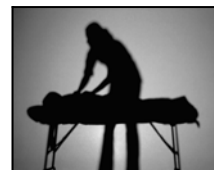

Councillor Comment

Back in 2001, 31 Local Learning and Employment Networks (LLENs) were established by the Victorian Government. In 2002, the Central Ranges LLEN (CRLLEN) was convened, comprising the Murrindindi, Mitchell and Macedon Ranges Shires.

Today, CRLLEN is an incorporated association funded by the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development. Its purpose is to aid partnerships and networks with education, industry, community and parent stakeholders to improve education, training and employment outcomes for young people aged 10 – 19 years.

From this partnership, the Murrindindi Training Institute (MTI) developed with the aim of addressing skills and training gaps in outdoor leadership, community services and the health sector. The MTI is located in the former Alexandra Hospital. Within the two years of its operation, this organisation has become the preferred training provider for most outdoor recreation organisations in Victoria.

Last week, Councillors and Council officers were briefed by the CEO of CRLLEN. He outlined many of CRLLEN's key achievements, among them the MTI, Murrindindi Training Needs Analysis 2013, The Central Ranges Trade Training Centre, the Murrindindi Local Strategic Skills Training and Employment Network as well as supporting the Murrindindi Youth Strategy and Koorie Pathways Program.

The 2013 Murrindindi Training Needs Analysis highlighted there was capacity for local providers to develop short courses to meet industry needs, to deliver certificate level training in Outdoor Recreation, Aged Care and Children's Services and Certificate III in Agriculture and Certificate III in Com-

petitive Manufacturing. Strategies for next year include increasing school based apprenticeship opportunities for local young people, continuing the sustainability of MTI and furthering the development of health and agribusiness industry training at a local and regional level.

The LLEN program, including CRLLEN, has not been funded beyond 2014 at this stage and Murrindindi Shire Council will be advocating to our local members and relevant government ministers for education, community services and higher education and skills for its continuation. Community members, particularly those who've been involved and assisted by CRLLEN, are encouraged to lend their support to this advocacy.

Another gem of an idea was realised recently. A former Alexandra Secondary College teacher and now Corporate Media Communications Manager for Federation Square, Ron Smith, enabled the launch by the Marysville community and Bendigo Bank of the 'Wish You Were Here' social media campaign.

The campaign launch was assisted by the Steel Band, Pans on Fire, local photographer, Donavon Wilson, Chair of the Marysville Chamber of Commerce David Stirling, and Parliamentary Secretary to the Premier Craig Ondarchie, MLC. Across the big screen at Fed Square video and images were displayed as a call to action to spread the word that Marysville is well and truly open for business.

Let's keep these great ideas and initiatives coming in 2014!

Each year, DEPI recruits seasonal project firefighters to assist with bushfire suppression and prevention during the warmer months of the year.

Burning permits no long available this summer

Murrindindi Shire Council will not issue permits to burn-off over the summer period with the CFA Declared Fire Danger Period coming into force on Monday 2 December.

The fire danger period means people face severe penalties for lighting fires in the open air without a permit issued by the CFA. This includes burning off.

Council's General Manager Infrastructure and Development Tamara Johnson said the declaration was a strong reminder that people should have prepared their properties for the fire season.

"Every landowner has a responsibility to take necessary steps in preventing fires and reducing the risk of injury or damage to other people and their property," Ms Johnson said.

"And there is still time to protect your home and property by slashing, mowing, grazing, and spraying grass. It is important everyone plays their role."

Municipal Fire Prevention Officers have been conducting inspections of properties throughout the shire and those considered a fire hazard have been issued with a notice to clean up. Failure to comply with a 'fire notice' will see Council completing the works at the land owner's expense.

Residents with concerns over neighbouring properties are encouraged to contact Council, to ensure any potential hazards are inspected as quickly as possible.

"Council is also playing an active role with slashing and spraying occurring across the shire," Ms Johnson said.

"Our fire preparations are on-going with slashing and spraying activities occurring along key roads and around townships."

More details on what activities are restricted during the Fire Danger Period can be found in the CFA's 'Can I or Can't I' which is available on CFA's website at www.cfa.vic.gov.au/warnings-restrictions/can/.

Changes to road conditions in Highlands district

Murrindindi Shire Council will reduce the speed limits on sections of Highlands Rd, Caveat Dropmore Rd, Top Rd, Springs Rd and Creightons Creek Road to 60 kilometres an hour following road damage in the area.

Logging operations in the area have seen a number of roads damaged because of high trucking movements.

Acting General Manager Infrastructure Services Matt Parsons said Council was continuing to monitor road conditions and would continue to undertake repairs to assist with driver safety.

"Council will work with the company involved to ensure roads are returned to the condition prior to the logging. However this will not occur until current operations cease in approximately May next year," Mr Parsons said.

"I urge people to drive to the local conditions."
