Made in Marysville and Surrounds Art, Craft and Produce Co-op

As one business relocates from Marysville Central another moves in. The latest enterprise, Made in Marysville and Surrounds Art, Craft and Produce Co-op is sure to fill a gap for visitors, everyday shoppers and holidaymakers who want to support the district. This new shop will be providing a marketing outlet for local talent and is really worth a visit. Last Saturday morning supporters of the venture were treated to a champagne breakfast to celebrate the co-op's official opening by Murrindindi Shire's mayor Councillor Margaret Rae.

The Co-op has something for everyone: beautiful hand made glass work to wear or to use, pottery, hand made soaps, hand washes and hand creams, lovely designer cushions, traditional china, the cutest hand knitted baby and children's wear, original paintings, breadboards, preserves and seasonal fresh produce. All great gifts for friends, loved ones or just yourself.

This co-operative was the brainchild of Buxton residents Melanie and

Steve Ritchie with encouragement from chef Michael Jaeger. Melanie loves making costume jewellery and Steve is a glass artist. Michael is My Chef Mike who also makes great food and coffee opposite at his Lazy River Café in Marysville Central.

Between them a deal to rent the shop space previously occupied by Lit and Beyond was negotiated. Co-op members will contribute an annual fee. To help get the enterprise off the ground the first six months rent is being paid by a kind and secret benefactor.

In her welcome address Melanie said people who visit a tourist town are looking to take home something that is locally made. She acknowledged the wide support that the venture had attracted, from bubbly donated by the Buxton Hotel, to her husband Steve for the shelving, to the inaugural members for their courage to come on board and believe in the venture, Michael Reddrop for his involvement as landlord; and all the hard work from members and friends to get the shop up and

running and ready for the grand opening. Melanie added that as the town's visitor numbers increase and Reddrops supermarket expands, their shop will move into the space presently occupied by the

Bendigo Bank and Marysville Triangle Real Estate who in turn plan to move to another location in the town.

Mayor's Chair

Having spent most of my working life in education, it remains a passion with me and I retain a strong belief that education is a right and not a privilege. More opportunities for students to receive education and training which will take them beyond secondary school and provide them with skills to take into the workplace is something our Shire needs and for which Council is a strong advocate.

It was with great pleasure therefore that I recently attended the opening of the Trade Training Centre at the Alexandra Secondary College. As part of the Central Ranges Eastern Hub – a consortium of ten secondary schools and colleges across our region – this offers enhanced opportunities for our young people to gain specific skills which will be applicable to the workplace with future potential for articulated pathways to further education.

The Murrindindi Training Institute (MTI) is also offering skills-based training with the curriculum being developed through consultation with and input from employers and industry. This results in graduates being 'workplace ready' with relevant skills who can operate effectively from day one. Over time MTI is planning for course offerings to be broadened into other disciplines with a focus on those that not only meet

the needs of industry but of industry specific to our area.

The Advancing Country Towns initiative implemented by the Victorian State Government has assisted in this process by providing funding for the production of the Murrindindi Training Needs Analysis. This is providing valuable data for use in assessing future training needs and has resulted in the development of a network of local employers and industry for their input into future planning.

Such initiatives take time to come to fruition and certainly much is still in the somewhat embryonic stages, and stable funding streams are a critical component for the future success of such initiatives. But there are several groups working in conjunction with one thing in mind – one shared goal – to improve the long term educational and employment opportunities for our young people.

This is something which we would all support wholeheartedly and I look forward to the continued development of education and training opportunities in our Shire.

Free Disposal of Greenwaste 1 – 2 March 2014

Murrindindi Shire residents can dispose of green waste free of charge at all Resource Recovery Centres (Transfer Stations) on the weekend of **1-2 March 2014**.

Materials Accepted as Green Waste	Materials Not Accepted as Green Waste
Grass clippings, Leaves	Noxious weeds (blackberries, holly etc)
Garden prunings	Construction timber
Branches and tree trunks up to 250mm diameter and maximum of 1.5 metres long	Branches and tree trunks over 250mm in diameter or over 1.5 metres long, tree stumps

Not all vegetation or woody materials are accepted as green waste – noxious weeds, construction timber and large trees and stumps will be disposed as general waste at the normal rate. People wanting to use the free service will need to prove eligibility by presenting a copy of a current tip tag, rates notice or other documentation showing you have residency in the shire.

Councillor Comment

Irish Andrew Sisters

The 2014 Café Culture Series is about to burst into action with the four piece Irish band "Saoirse" (pronounced seer-sha, meaning freedom). Saoirse have been playing together since 2006, brought together by a series of happy coincidences. After appearing as individuals at several different shows they were naturally drawn together by a common love of beautiful Irish music.
