Mayor's Chair

People often say to me "are you busy?" and I invariably answer "yes" but it does make me reflect on what being busy means to me and others, and what it is that we expect out of 'busyness'.

For many, being busy is demonstrated by someone else (me, for example) rushing from place to place, from function to function, from commitment to commitment. This can often be amply demonstrated by the number of photographs that appear in the local paper. These activities have great value – they recognise achievements, they celebrate occasions, they mark history, they encourage participation and, above all, they enable connection with our community and by so doing they add visible value.

There are some activities that are perceived as not so valuable – and I am thinking here of the common reaction to the idea and reality of meetings, which are often seen as a waste of time and as non-productive.

But these add value too, because it is only in such forums that working levels of agreement can be reached – and recorded – in order to achieve objectives and outcomes. It is the way that democracy works and, while it is cumbersome, we haven't as yet come up with anything better.

But the other side of 'busyness' can also be very quiet and almost invisible. Many of my busiest times are times such as this, when I am sitting at my desk at home, in between the formal commitments, somewhat frantically trying to catch up on the back-

log of emails, correspondence, questionnaires, surveys, reports, briefing notes and council papers, not to mention the column I am writing.

I am not alone in this – my fellow councillors find themselves in the same situation – and I know many of you in the community experience similar times in your lives.

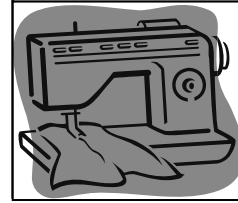
Currently in Council we are grappling with the annual tasks of preparing the budget, updating the Strategic Resource Plan, setting the Capital Expenditure Plan and reviewing the Council Plan. All this must be achieved within imposed protocols and timelines. So if occasionally we are 'missing in action' it can often mean we are busier than ever.

So whilst busyness can mean different things at different times, it is the value that is obtained that is important.

The sense of achievement in a job well done is something we all understand and strive for and councillors are no exception. Our goal is to achieve outcomes that are the best in the circumstances that prevail and that will provide the best overall outcome for the whole community. This is the driving force behind our discussions and debates – our 'busyness' and our business.

In the meantime, though, we will continue to enjoy the more public occasions where we can hear and share your views and experiences.

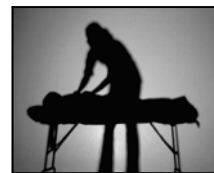

Councillor Comment –

The removal and treatment of our waste is an ever changing issue that requires careful consideration and is not something that can just be put into the 'too hard' basket to be resolved another day.

Our costs are escalating and I believe that users should pay the costs of disposing of waste, rather than leave it to future generations to fund our waste removal.

Council is currently combining with our neighbouring Shires of Mitchell, Mansfield, Strathbogie and Benalla to strategically place ourselves in a better bargaining position as we negotiate our kerbside waste collection service. The current year cost for this service is \$822,000. This is your money and Council is determined to get it right.

On the weekend of 1-2 March, Council's transfer stations will not charge for green waste disposal, so now is the time to trim back those branches, sweep down the driveway and head on down to the tip.

Some conditions apply, such as we don't accept noxious weeds, construction timber or branches over 250mm in diameter or over 1.5 metres long. People wanting to use the free service will need to prove eligibility by presenting a copy of a current rates notice (or other appropriate verification of the property you own or reside at) or a current tip ID tag.

The long running issue of waste disposal in Taylor Bay is also one that Council has been grappling with for many years. I am hoping to see some change in the near future, as the current system of a communal site has been abused by non Taylor Bay residents and has become an expensive eye-sore that is un-sustainable in its current format.

The Regional Victoria Living Expo is on again on the weekend of 11-13 April at the Melbourne Exhibition Centre. Council is sending a team of staff down to promote the Murrindindi Shire to potential future residents and businesses.

Last year, there were 9500 people who came to the Expo and we distributed information kits to those interested in coming to live in the best part of Victoria, where we have rivers, lakes, mountains, both State and National Parks, wide open spaces, working farms, residential homes, vibrant communities and business opportunities for all.

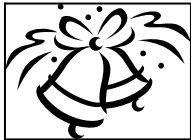

“Nar-be-thong”

In November 2013 the Narbethong Progress Association successfully launched the history book “Nar-be-thong”.

This was four years of hard work for the Narbethong History Group which was peppered with fun and good feelings. The book is heavy with photos and stories written by residents of Narbethong, past and present. We are pleased to announce that the book is selling well.

The aim was to highlight positive things that happened in the past. This was in response to the 2009 Black Saturday disaster that devastated so many lives. As it turned out, we uncovered a rich history of courageous people who battled similar disasters in the past. However, the book is not about Black Saturday.

Narbethong can “name drop” like no other town in the district.

So many colourful and famous people have been associated with this tiny village. So many successes are attributed to these people. Some of the stories are written by humble people who experienced both failure, success.

They tell their stories with compassion and how they won through to a mostly happy experience in childhood and working life

This is the book many people (other than Narby people) have been waiting for. It reveals the mystery behind the curtain of tall timber. People who only drive through Narbethong, cannot hope to see the romantic houses from the Maroondah Highway.

Places like the Hermitage, St Fillan, Narbethong Farm, Tarnpirr etc. are quite lovely and historic. Farms in Granton, were home to the Lovett Family at “Brocklesby”, and “Laradoc”. These and other places you’ve never had explained will now make the drive more interesting in future.

The Book is available from Marysville Visitor Information Centre, Marysville Historical Society, Kim Rycroft’s Saladin Lodge, Rosemary Sisson’s Out-Door shop, Black Spur Inn, Alexandra Newsagency. 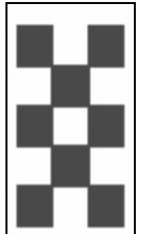

Community Update Regeneration Burns in Central Highlands and West Gippsland

VicForests will undertake planned regeneration burns in the Central Highlands and West Gippsland regions in the coming months.

These regeneration burns are part of the annual prescribed burning plan for Victoria's forests and assist young eucalypt seedlings to regrow following timber harvesting operations.

VicForests is very conscious of the community's sensitivity towards fire. While this process will result in some smoke, VicForests would like to assure residents that all activities will be closely monitored.

These burns are part of the planned burning program being undertaken in conjunction with the Department of Environment and Primary Industries (DEPI) for 2014.

All burns are authorised prior to ignition and will be supervised throughout by trained staff on location.

Some burns will be conducted in the evening and night in line with new lower intensity burning practices, or to take advantage of favourable climatic conditions.

Properties in the direct path of the fires have sustained substantial losses of pasture, fences and hay shed. While some stock have been killed in the fires, or had to be put down afterwards, large numbers remain which need to be cared for until pastures and fences are re-established.

The Lions Club of Pakenham would welcome any support from this area. In February 2009, Need for Feed were delivering hay within a few days of the fire and assisted many local animal owners.

Free Disposal of Greenwaste 1 – 2 March 2014



Murrindindi Shire residents can dispose of green waste free of charge at all Resource Recovery Centres (Transfer Stations) on the weekend of **1-2 March 2014**.

Materials Accepted as Green Waste	Materials Not Accepted as Green Waste
Grass clippings, Leaves	Noxious weeds (blackberries, holly etc)
Garden prunings	Construction timber
Branches and tree trunks up to 250mm diameter and maximum of 1.5 metres long	Branches and tree trunks over 250mm in diameter or over 1.5 metres long, tree stumps

Not all vegetation or woody materials are accepted as green waste – noxious weeds, construction timber and large trees and stumps will be disposed as general waste at the normal rate. People wanting to use the free service will need to prove eligibility by presenting a copy of a current tip tag, rates notice or other documentation showing you have residency in the shire.

Marysville Pre School

is a modern facility with 12 dedicated, friendly staff. After re-establishing at 15 Falls Rd in 2010 (co-located with Marysville Primary School) the centre has not looked back. The committee decided to extend the service into Long Day Care, offering care for young children, before and after kindergarten care, and before after school care for older children. Our staff provide programs that are developed from the children's interests in a safe welcoming environment.

Recently Marysville Pre School was a lucky recipient of two VBAF grants. One of the grants was \$10,000 for resources for the Marysville Playgroup. The Marysville Playgroup and Pre School have had a huge benefit from these resources. Mel, the director at the Marysville Pre School Centre says "before the grant, there were not very many resources for young toddlers and babies, this VBAF grant has been very helpful in providing for this gap". The group is growing in numbers every week and President of the playgroup Leah Ware says "we are all really grateful for this grant as the kids have loved the new resources and it really gave us a chance to get to know each other outside of the playgroup setting."

The second VBAF Grant received was for the outdoor area at \$33, 000 which has provided Marysville Pre School with enough money to buy outdoor equipment including a 'leaky boat,' a play train called "Slow Coach", rubber surfacing, more vegetable gardens, fruit trees, dry creek bed and landscaped garden beds. Marysville Pre School would like to thank VBAF for the grant and Peart's Gardening for their expertise and work developing the outdoor space.

"The Michael Rodger - Act to D-Feet MND"

National champion to lead off Sunday's MND event cycling race Benalla's newest national sporting champion, Felicity Wardlaw, will lead off the 89 kilometre ride at Sunday's Mick Rodger Act to D-Feet MND fundraising event.

The 36 year-old rider upstaged Olympians and national champions to claim the Australian women's time trial earlier this year.

Wardlaw completed the 28km course at Burrumbeet near Ballarat in 38mins 46secs to beat three-time winner Shara Gillow by a staggering 32seconds.

Mick Rodger Act to D-Feet MND event spokesperson, Robyn Smith, said the committee was excited to have Wardlaw lead off the cycling event.

"Felicity is a champion, and it is great that she has agreed to participate in this year's event. It is an opportunity for the Benalla community to honour her outstanding achievement," Robyn said.

Benalla's fundraising event is poised to break the \$350,000 fundraising milestone this Sunday when thousands of people converge on Lake Benalla to raise money and awareness for Motor Neurone Disease (MND).

All the money raised from the event funds the Mick Rodger Benalla Grant for MND Research which since 2008 has helped fund five research projects to find a cure for the disease.

Ms Smith said the support from the community during the past five years, particularly since Michael's death in 2010, has been overwhelming.

Background Information

Mick Rodger Act to D-Feet MND was first held in March 2008 after popular Benalla businessman and sportsman, Michael Rodger, was diagnosed with the disease.

Since then a small but committed organising committee, with the tremendous support of the broader community, has raised more than \$300,000 to help find a cure for the disease.

After a brave battle, Michael passed away in March 2010. MND is the name given to a group of diseases in which the nerve cells controlling the muscles that enable us to move around, speak, swallow and breathe progressively fail to work normally.

The disease, which affects about 1300 people in Australia and their families, was first described in 1869, however there is still no known cause or cure and treatment options are limited.

On average, one person dies every day of MND in Australia.

Get rid of your green waste on Clean Up Australia Day

Murrindindi Shire Council's popular free green waste weekend has been planned to coincide with Clean Up Australia Day.

On the weekend of March 1-2, Council's Resource and Recovery Centres (transfer stations), will accept green waste free of charge, with some conditions applying to what can be left at the centres.

Council's Infrastructure and Waste portfolio spokesman Cr Bernie Magner said it was an opportunity for people to tidy their yards and take advantage of the free service.

"You can bring as much green waste as you like, just as long as you meet our requirements," Cr Magner said.

People wanting to use the free service will need to prove eligibility by presenting a copy of a current rates notice (or other appropriate verification of the property you own or reside at) to the site attendant or a current tip ID tag.

The free disposal offer does not apply to commercial operators.

Not all vegetation or woody materials are accepted as green waste – noxious weeds, construction timber and large trees and stumps will be disposed as general waste at the normal rates. **See advertisement in this issue**
