MARYSVILLE RSL PRESIDENT RETIRES

Marysville RSL president retires

Bob Emblin has stepped down from the role of president of the Marysville sub-branch of the RSL, a role he held for 4 years.

Bob, with great support from his wife Jan, have together been an inspirational example to many. The Emblins live in Buxton, and have volunteered tirelessly in support of the community in this area. Jan has been the Marysville RSL treasurer for several years, and will continue with that role.

Bob led the Marysville RSL through a very difficult period. He put in a lot of effort as part of a team that reforming the Marysville RSL in 2008. His leadership was appreciated by the RSL members in the traumatic

period after the Black Saturday. He has steered the RSL into the healthy position it is in today, with 27 current members and a home base for meetings and gatherings, thanks to the support of the 'mens shed'.

Due to a significant amount of organisation and input from Bob, the community have enjoyed the wonderful 'ANZAC' day and 'Remembrance' day ceremonies held at Marysville in April and November each year. For a relatively small population base, the numbers of people attending is great and seem to grow each year.

Bob has been a busy man, who is often seen volunteering his time and energy into Marysville and District Lions club activities, the

Marysville youth group, and with the Marysville golf and bowls club. He will continue as a member of the Marysville RSL, supporting the branch wherever he can. He has once again led the way in organising the 2014 ANZAC day ceremony planned for Marysville, and has expressed a desire to catch up with veterans of his old regiment for the following ANZAC day.

The RSL was formed in 1916 by returned war service personnel, primarily to honour the memory of the fallen and to help each other, and their families whenever required. The RSL was the first national welfare agency in Australia and welfare remains its prime function today.

Mayors Chair

Recently I had the opportunity, with other Councillors and the CEO, to meet with the Minister for Local Government. The primary purpose of the meeting was for the Minister to confirm the provision of \$730,811 in funding for specific capital works projects in the Shire. This funding, which represents the balance of the Murrindindi Assistance Package made available to us since the 2009 fires is very welcome, as it will enable renewal works to take place on a number of our assets.

However, welcome as the support is, it will not provide a solution, nor even a part solution to the funding gap which exists in terms of managing the recurrent and long term costs of the generously donated additional assets which have been gifted to us over the past few years. This challenge is ongoing and is a driving force behind our current budgetary planning exercises.

The meeting with the Minister did provide a valuable opportunity for us to further explain these and other issues which have the potential to affect our Shire and to advocate in the strongest way possible on behalf of our communities. The Minister was very receptive to our advocacy and is very much aware of the concentrated efforts we have put into reviewing our organisation, the changes we have made and exploring and implementing best value practices to assist our community.

Continuing the theme and spirit of advocacy, some in our community have in recent times expressed some concerns over logging practices in the Shire and expressed a need for more and better information. Council has been liaising with VicForests in that regard to enable opportunities for increased communication and information. I am pleased, therefore, that VicForests has announced that it will be holding an "Open House" event in the Alexandra Town Hall on Saturday 15 March from 11am to 6pm. This will be a good opportunity for you to speak with VicForests staff, to ask questions, to relay concerns and to find out more information.

While you are there you may just notice the planter box that has appeared to the north side of the Hall steps. This is a simple but hopefully effective step to reduce the risk of anyone inadvertently stepping off the higher edge on that side. The Town Hall has heritage listing so installing permanent railings or similar barriers is not possible but I feel sure that this solution will prove effective.

And on the theme of occupational health and safety I had the pleasure last week of participating in a staff induction session. The health and safety of staff is not confined to their physical environment but also includes their personal wellbeing. Support for each other in the workplace is very important. This was a stimulating and rewarding session and, if this group of staff is anything to go by we are well placed for the future. Thank you to everyone for a great experience.

Councillor Comment –

Council has introduced a street lighting policy that will help guide staff and Councillors when it comes to determining the installation of street lights across the shire.

The Street and Public Lighting Installation Policy as it is known, gives us a strong set of guidelines to create an equitable and consistent approach to community requests for lighting.

I have strongly supported this policy because it also takes into account community sentiment to proposed projects, who pays and where new installations fit in with Council's works program.

Under my portfolio of Corporate and Customer Services we constantly review Council policies and we have just completed the Asset Management Policy.

This important policy underpins how we effectively manage our infrastructure assets, in other words community building, roads, bridges and open spaces and the like.

We have completed a mountain of work on our Asset Management Plan which guides us in terms of needs and cost for the next decade. This policy is there to support Council in its decision making and also to assist the community in understanding why we can and cannot commit to projects.

Another good news story is the progress we are making in delivering on our commitments in the 2013-17 Council Plan.

Of the 82 projects and activities to be completed this year only nine have been delayed. We have already completed 8 while 63 continue to progress.

The plan also highlights the diverse range of services provided to the community, with some of the highlights including our strong advocacy to both state and federal members, the establishment of our Health and Wellbeing consortium and Council attracting a stage of the Great Victorian Bike Ride.

The report certainly shows that we are getting on with the job of listening and delivering for our community.

Bushfire memorials locations supported

Several memorial sites will be developed across Murrindindi Shire to commemorate the 2009 bushfires. In supporting the recommendations of the Murrindindi Memorials Project working group, Council has adopted the installation of two large memorials – one in Marysville and one in Kinglake – with smaller memorials sited in Narbethong, Castella/Toolangi, Kinglake townships and Flowerdale.

Mayor Margaret Rae said the important decision to endorse the locations would now allow Council to seek design concepts.

“We respect that this has been a process that has been community-driven, and now that we have direction in terms of locations we can now start to talk to community groups and agencies where preferred sites have been requested,” Cr Rae said.

“We will continue to engage with the community and working group as we embark on securing proposed sites or looking at alternatives for those areas that may not be suitable or arrangements cannot be entered into.”

Locations include: Marysville - Lions Park; Kinglake - Frank Thompson Reserve; Narbethong - Narbethong Reserve; Castella/Toolangi - Central Park and Flowerdale’s Byrneside Reserve

“We certainly have listened to the community and working group and there will be a number of options available to families in terms of contributing and participating in the project,” Cr Rae said.

“Should families not be in a position to make a decision to participate when it starts to develop, there will be options into the future for them to be involved.

“We are pleased to be making progress on this significant project and we will soon call for expressions of interest to short-list suitable businesses to develop design concepts. From this a successful designer will be appointed and a final design will be developed in consultation with the working group and community.”

It is hoped that the project can be completed by the end of the year.

Triangle Blackberry Action Group

The South Cathedral Landcare Group (SCLG) was formed in February 2013. The rapid growth of blackberry post fires was identified as the first initiative to be tackled. With this in mind SCLG applied for and were successful in receiving funding from Victoria Blackberry Taskforce (VBT) for a Blackberry Action Group (BAG). Our BAG, Triangle Blackberry Action Group (TBAG) is one of fourteen BAGs across Victoria and covers an area that includes Narbethong, Marysville, Taggerty and Buxton in the Shire of Murrindindi.

It is very early in TBAG'S development having only started in September 2013. We have however been able to achieve some significant milestones in a short time.

- Establishment of a Steering Committee to drive the project.
- Engagement of a Project Officer who is assisting landholders with management plans.
- Collaboration with public land managers and agencies.

An official launch of the TBAG project was held 20th October 2013 at the Buxton Memorial Hall where a variety of guest speakers presented information to the group. There was much interest in what the project had to offer and many people signed up to join the SCLG and also to request a visit from the Project Officer to discuss blackberry management. There are incentives available to assist landholders manage their blackberry.

Currently our Project Officer has visited 23 properties to help people with their blackberry. This represents 420 hectares and 18 hectares of blackberry that is now being managed.
