## Thank you

Thank you all for your good wishes on my retirement from editing the Triangle, I gave my time because I love this community, and the community wanted to retain the Triangle.

However, the Triangle only exists because of many other people, the readers and contributors, but also the printing and collating teams. The printing team is made up of four Lions who normally adhere to a roster, whilst the collating team is mostly non-Lion volunteers, varying in numbers and names from week to week, all of whom are fantastic, community-minded people.

For those that don't know, the Triangle was first issued in 1975 and for most of the early years a stencil was typed and placed on a hand-

operated roneo machine for printing on foolscap size paper, both sides. In about 1991 we bought equipment which enabled us to scan pictures and sketches, and then the Triangle grew...!

In the early 1990's, a computer was deployed to help out. Publisher software was bought and I 'just learned' how to use it. A couple of years later I went to a day class at CEACA where I learned in particular, a lot of shortcuts.

From then on, the Triangle has continued to grow, although we try to limit the number of pages to a manageable size.

For a number of years Elaine Postlethwaite wrote lead articles, often to promote a new business or welcome a new family to town, then lat-

er this role was taken over by Monica Fafeita. Since then, many of the articles have been supplied by the communications department of the Shire as Press Releases, and others by the media departments of State and Federal Government, particularly when we have visiting politicians in town. I have written very few, my excuse being that I didn't have time. I expect I will miss the contact with the people who contribute regularly, but I'm hoping now to catch up on things that need doing, and have some "me time". My first trip will be to visit my sister, and this time I won't been constricted to the later part of the week.

## Mayors Chair

I have to say that I have been feeling somewhat divorced from my community this week - it doesn't take long for withdrawal symptoms to set in when I don't have time to spend a while in the street catching up with things and people - as I have been very much on the road.

One of the trips was to go to Melbourne to meet with members from Executive Education of the RMIT College of Business together with the Deputy Pro Vice-Chancellor for Industry Engagement. These are people who are actively involved in creating and building links and relationships with countries and communities in Asia and who have been sending delegations to visit our shire. We spent quite some time with them exploring how our relationship can be improved and how we can build on this to increase the opportunities for economic benefit for Murrindindi Shire. Whilst this is still in early stages, it is only by continuing to explore the potential for tourism, business and education can we be ready to maximise opportunities when they do arise.

Later in the week I attended more meetings with peak bodies - one with the Municipal Association of Victoria (MAV), which is very much the voice of local government at the higher level and is well placed to carry the concerns and challenges experienced by councils and shires to State Government and to advocate for us. The strength of the collective voice, particularly when it comes to articulating the benefits of and continued need for ongoing grant programs cannot be overestimated and we, as a shire, need to be part of that dialogue so that we can continue to maintain critical infrastructure for our communities.

Similarly a meeting with the Hume Region Local Government Network (HRLGN) not only gave us the opportunity to inform a regionally focused body of what we and other local rural and regional councils need but provides a forum to learn more about issues that have the potential to impact us all. There is great value in Mayors and CEOs from rural shires gathering together to share experiences, information and concerns. It is a good way to find solutions and to build partnerships for the future.

In looking around the room it was good to see not only how many Mayors were there but how many are women. March 6 was International Women's Day and this year marks 100 years of women being able to stand for local government. Currently of the 79 councils in Victoria, there are now 28 women mayors (28%) and 215 female councillors out of 631 elected in 2012 (34%) with every council having at least one female councillor. This is the first time for Victoria. This is to be celebrated as there is enormous value in the shared thinking and understanding from women and men in decision making for our communities.

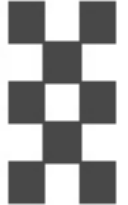

## Planned burning increases as fire conditions ease

Planned burning to reduce fuels on public land will increase in the coming weeks as fire conditions start to ease in parts of the state.

Department of Environment and Primary Industries (DEPI) Chief Fire Officer Alan Goodwin said: "We are committed to implementing an increased planned burning program as recommended by the Victorian Bushfires Royal Commission." "Our specialist forest firefighters have been working hard to fight fires over the summer period, but now as temperatures drop our attention will turn to carrying out planned burns to reduce bushfire risk to people, communities and the environment," Mr Goodwin said.

"This summer we have seen fires that have started in remote areas like the Mallee and far east Gippsland and have continued to burn for weeks. This is why planned burning will target not just burns close to towns, but also remoter area burns."

"Reducing fuel loads on public land both in remote areas and close to properties and towns helps slow the spread and intensity of bushfires making them easier to control."

"In general, planned burning is the most effective tool we have to manage fuel over large areas of public land – but we know that it can only do so much on its own, and that it will be more effective in some areas than others."

"This summer over 51,000 ha of land that was going to be treated using planned burns over the coming 3 years has been burnt by bushfires. We'll have to take that into account in the coming months and may need to delay some burns or bring other ones forward as we work towards carrying out 260,000 ha of planned burns."

"The weather conditions will always be a strong influencing factor in how many and where burns are carried out. What we are focussing on is making sure that we have burns planned and prepared so that they are ready to go when conditions are right."

"In the coming weeks we'll be looking at carrying out planned burns in coastal areas like the Otways, in grasslands and woodlands around Melbourne, and some of the elevated areas in the North east."

"We're mindful of the impact smoke is having on communities in the Latrobe Valley region and will avoid burning in that area until conditions ease."

"Given it is still close to summer, people might be concerned if they see smoke, but they shouldn't call Triple Zero unless they see flames and no fire crews." 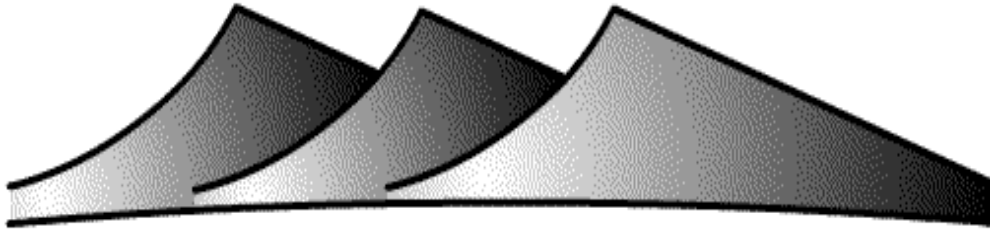

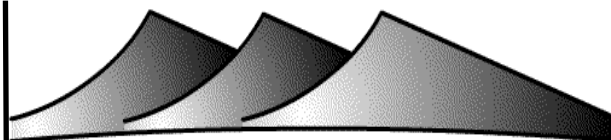

Triangle Blackberry Action Group

The South Cathedral Landcare Group (SCLG) was formed in February 2013. The rapid growth of blackberry post fires was identified as the first initiative to be tackled. With this in mind SCLG applied for and were successful in receiving funding from Victoria Blackberry Taskforce (VBT) for a Blackberry Action Group (BAG). Our BAG, Triangle Blackberry Action Group (TBAG) is one of fourteen BAGs across Victoria and covers an area that includes Narbethong, Marysville, Taggerty and Buxton in the Shire of Murrindindi.

It is very early in TBAG'S development having only started in September 2013. We have however been able to achieve some significant milestones in a short time.

- Establishment of a Steering Committee to drive the project.
- Engagement of a Project Officer who is assisting landholders with management plans.
- Collaboration with public land managers and agencies.

An official launch of the TBAG project was held 20<sup>th</sup> October 2013 at the Buxton Memorial Hall where a variety of guest speakers presented information to the group. There was much interest in what the project had to offer and many people signed up to join the SCLG and also to request a visit from the Project Officer to discuss blackberry management. There are incentives available to assist landholders manage their blackberry.

Currently our Project Officer has visited 23 properties to help people with their blackberry. This represents 420 hectares and 18 hectares of blackberry that is now being managed.
