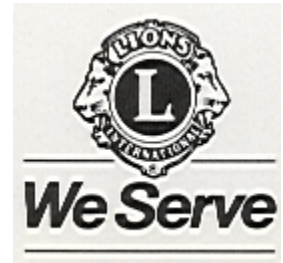

Boardwalk among the gum trees to celebrate first National Eucalypt Day

A new boardwalk was opened at Lake Mountain on Sunday 23rd March 2014 to mark Australia's inaugural National Eucalypt Day. The boardwalk, with interpretative signs, allows visitors to walk among the native subalpine native forest.

The boardwalk was built following the 2009 bushfires and was made possible through the financial support of the Bjarne K Dahl Trust and the National Australia Bank.

"The new boardwalk at Lake Mountain is a wonderful place for Victorians to appreciate our much loved gum trees in a subalpine setting. Its construction is a testimony to community strength following the 2009 bush fires." Said Scott Gamble, Resort Manager, Lake Mountain Resort. Trust Chair Alison Teese said:

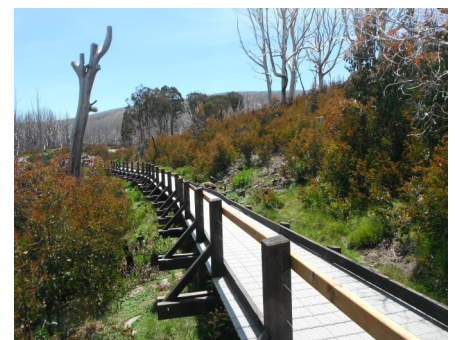
"The 23rd of March was a special day for the Trust not only because it was the first National Eucalypt Day, but because it was also Dahl's birthday. The Trust aims to continue his legacy by educating and promoting the cultivation and conservation of eucalyptus trees in our country.

"Dahl's mission was always to promote, establish, cultivate and conserve eucalypts. In creating a National Eucalypt Day and opening the Boardwalk, we hope this will become a day that will celebrate this iconic Australian tree."

The Bjarne K Dahl Trust is a philanthropic fund established with a bequest from Bjarne Klaus Dahl, a Norwegian Forester who came to Australia in 1928 and fell in love with the bush, particularly the Silvertop Ash, *Eucalyptus sieberiana*.

Bjarne K Dahl's passion for eucalypts led him to leave his entire estate to support the establishment, cultivation and conservation of eucalypts.

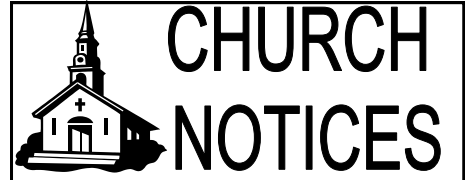

It's dog and cat registration time

The important task of ensuring your dog or cat is registered with Council needs to be done by 10 April 2014.

While it is a legal requirement to have your pets registered, by doing so you also have the knowledge that should your pet become lost there is a good chance you will be reunited because of its registration identification.

Corporate and Customer Services portfolio holder Cr Cris Ruhr said Council made it as easy as possible for people to renew pet registrations.

"Residents who currently have animals registered on Council's system should have started to receive their 2014/15 renewal notices. We also encourage pet owners that do not yet have their animals registered with Council to take appropriate action to do so," Cr Ruhr said.

"We have good compliance with many pet owners making sure that their animals are registered, unfortunately we do have those that fail to comply.

"We offer a range of payment methods and changes to your animal's registration can be done over the phone."

Registration payment can be paid in person at any one of Council's offices, via cheque or money order posted to PO Box 138 Alexandra or via BPay using the details on the registration renewal form. Bpay is not a payment option for new pet registrations.

It is mandatory for all dogs and cats to be microchipped if being registered for the first time. This regulation also applies to previously registered dogs and cats that move into the Murrindindi Shire from another municipality.

Discounted fees apply to cats and dogs that are desexed, registered with an approved association (The Victorian Canine Association), dogs that have undergone obedience training with an approved organisation or animal over 10 years of age.

Dogs on rural properties that fall into the category of working stock dogs can also be registered at a discounted rate. Concession rates also apply for owners who hold an appropriate pension concession card (Health Care Cards are not eligible).

Mayors Chair

Many of you will be aware of comments in the media recently about the quantum of rates collected by councils and the perceived value of services received in return by the respective communities. This is a particularly relevant topic at the moment when councillors are sitting around the table battling with the figures and having to make decisions against what are essentially two balancing factors: what are the services the Council is required and expected to deliver, and how much can the community afford – or is prepared to contribute – towards those services. A key word there is 'contribute', for Councils do everything they can to access funding through Federal and State programs and grants to deliver designated services. Last year approximately 50% of our funding came via those sources with 50% from rates and charges revenue.

Let's look at what councils do. They deliver over 120 different services, including maternal and child health, meals on wheels, food safety, public toilets, street lighting, local roads, footpaths, bridges, swimming pools, community halls, parks and gardens, sports fields, resource recovery centres and landfills, to mention only a few. Which ones do we need the most? Which ones could we do without?

One of the arguments put forward is that rates should rise by no more than CPI each year. That would be fine if everyone abided by the same rule. For example, State landfill levies have been rising at 10% each year, adding around \$40,000 in costs. Other services are impacted by growth in construction, materials and wages costs – something many of you experience also when a quote is needed or a tender fulfilled. These are not the same items that are measured in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) which reflects household goods and services pricing.

The need to maintain facilities such as playgrounds and swimming pools is subject to legislative requirements and is therefore not discretionary expenditure. Legislative compliance puts heavy cost demands on councils as does the effect of cost shifting where responsibility for matters not traditionally those of councils is moved into our sphere; whilst there might be some initial assistance with such matters, nevertheless there are always ongoing costs which then have to be built into the budget.

So how to decide? Do services get reduced? If so, which ones? Do we cease our involvement with emergency management, planning, mitigation and recovery? Do we no longer support underfunded Home and Community Care programs and stop meals on wheels, cleaning, home maintenance and respite? Do we stop trying to maintain ageing infrastructure and simply turn the key in the lock and let the facilities sit idle? What services do you think are most important? What do you think we could let go? What do you think provides value for money? As we prepare the budget, these are some of the questions we are asking, along with assessing the risks that might arise from removal or reduction of services and maintenance.

There are many questions here, but our commitment remains to deliver the best services possible, to maintain our infrastructure in the most efficient and effective way and to address our bottom line without imposing rate increases that are unsupportable. When the draft budget is on exhibition your input will be welcomed and valued.

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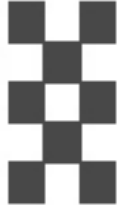
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Golf and Bowls Clubhouse Renovations Proceeding Well.

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HOLLY ERADICATION PROGRAM AT NARBETHONG

TUESDAY 22nd APRIL, 2014 A Holly eradication program has
been in progress at Narbethong and Marysville since February,
2007 Holly is a garden plant which has jumped the fence and be-
come well established n bushland around Marysville and Nar-
bethong. It is Spread mainly by birds eating the ripe red berries
and disbursing the seeds. It is an invasive plant and once estab-
lished displaces indigenous vegetation. It is officially listed as an
Environmental weed. The program has been extensively sup-
ported by DEPI Marysville, VicRoads, Murrindindi Shire Council,
Parks Vic, Upper Goulburn Landcare Network, Goulburn Broken
Catchment Management Authority, The Friends of the Marysville
Walks and local landholders. Because of this support, significant
Gains have been made in the reduction of holly spread on both
Public and private land. The program is ongoing and the most
recent allocation of funding through the Victorian State Govern-
ment's "Communities for Nature" grant will enable further work
At Narbethong. This extension is a Joint partnership between
DEPI Marysville, Upper Goulburn Landcare Network, The
Friends of The Marysville Walks Inc. and local landholders. As
Part of the program, two training days will be held at the proper-
ty of Mr. Bruce Bayley, 280 Maroondah Highway, Narbethong
At 1.00 p.m. on Monday the 17th of March, 2014 and Tuesday The
22nd of April, 2014. (adjacent to Black Spur Roadhouse). These
Training opportunities will provide information on holly eradi-
cation including methods of treatment, use of equipment and

Iconic Bridge Officially Opened

Acheron's Breakaway Bridge has been officially opened with member for Seymour Cindy McLeish and Mayor of Murrindindi Shire Margaret Rae cutting the ribbon on the iconic structure.

The bridge has undergone extensive refurbishment including increasing the load carrying capacity to 20 tonnes which will improve the area's transport needs. The works have been carried out whilst retaining the historic look of the bridge structure.

Sport and recreation grants to improve facilities

Community sporting organisations are encouraged to consider applying for support under the State Government's 2015 - 2016 Community Facility Funding Program (CFFP).

Community Service portfolio spokesman Cr Andrew Derwent said Murrindindi Shire Council was calling for expressions of interest from sporting and community bodies who had an interest in gaining funding under the scheme.

CFFP funding is available under six categories:

- *Better Pools* – grants of up to \$3 million to build new or upgrade existing aquatic centres;
- *Major Facilities* – grants of up to \$650,000 to develop or upgrade major sport and recreation facilities;
- *Seasonal Pools* – grants of up to \$200,000 to upgrade seasonal pools in rural, regional and outer metropolitan locations;
- *Minor Facilities* – grants of up to \$100,000 to develop or upgrade local sport and recreation facilities;
- *Soccer Facilities* – grants totalling \$100,000 for up to two projects are available to upgrade existing and construct new facilities; and
- *Planning* – grants of up to \$30,000 to fund initiatives that assess the future sport and recreation facility needs of local communities and up to \$50,000 for regional planning initiatives.

“All applications to the 2015-2016 CFFP must be supported by Council,” Cr Derwent said.

“Council is therefore seeking Expressions of Interest from community based sport and recreation organisations.”
