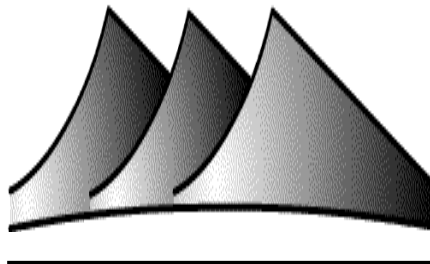

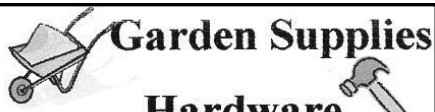

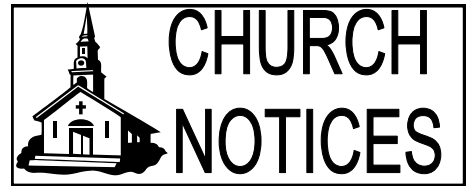

Mayors Chair

Last week I reflected on learnings from a conference I recently attended. The theme of that conference was all about small communities and one of the key presentations was about the bringing together of a small rural community and a group of refugees - it was the story of the Karen refugees in the little western district town of Nhill, population 2000, and many of you may have been aware of this story being profiled on television and radio recently.

For me and for all of us there listening, it was an inspiring story, not just from the perspective of the Karen refugees, who have found a new home, new employment and, most importantly, a new community. It was also the story of a small country community and the way it has come together, not just to make this initiative happen but to maintain and sustain it. It is the story of collaboration across every group in the community - health, education, police, service groups, sporting clubs and individuals - all were and continue to be involved and supportive.

The key components for this initiative, of course, had to be in place for this to happen - a viable business looking to expand, a reliable and growing source of supply, a shortage of workers and a group of potential workers willing and able to move to a country area, as well as a champion - in fact, a set of champions - to drive the initiative.

It highlighted for me once again the strength of small rural communities and what can be achieved when we all pull together, whatever the challenge or initiative. It's one of the reasons that we live where we do - it is very hard to replicate that level of caring in the anonymity of a city.

So it was with great pleasure that another of my very recent activities has been to welcome new members to our community and to the broader community of Australia through a Citizenship Ceremony. It was lovely to have it as a family occasion with babies, friends and family present.

Whether people have been here a few weeks or a few years, the common thread through my conversations with them is how welcome they feel and how warm our community is. So, on behalf of all of us, I welcome our new citizens and hope they spend many

Councillors Comment

Council recently facilitated a forum in Alexandra with real estate agents and representatives from around the shire with the theme of growing the Murrindindi Shire rate base.

Meeting practices improved in proposed Local Law

Improved community participation in council meetings is a key focus of a new Governance Local Law proposed by Murrindindi Shire Council.

The new Governance Local Law No. 2 (2014), set to replace Governance Local Law No. 3 (2011) will have much of its content remain the same but with changes to council meeting processes.

Chief Executive Officer Margaret Abbey said that the proposed Governance Local Law has a community focus and encourages participation at council meetings.

"This revised Law will mean more open and transparent meeting processes and gives Council the flexibility to adapt to the needs of our community," said Ms Abbey.

A substantial change in the proposed Local Law will be with regard to public participation, giving the community further options to be heard and receive a response from Council.

Ms Abbey said that Council values the Open Forum submission process but it is restrictive in that council cannot provide responses or enter into discussions with participants.

"In the proposed new law, provisions for questions of council have been added. If a member of the community provides prior notice of their open forum submission or question for council, then they will be provided with a response as part of their open forum time during the council meeting.

"We hope that the public participation changes will assist council to better meet the needs of the community.

"We anticipate the new Governance Local Law will enable meetings of council to run more efficiently and effectively for both the council and the community. It is important that the Local Law reflects the needs of Council with respect to its meeting procedures, the level of interaction with the Community and the behaviour that is expected by Council in council meetings." said Ms Abbey.

Marysville Road Closure Anzac Day March

Council advises that Murchison Street from Darwin Street to Lyell Street, Marysville will be temporarily closed from 10.30am – 12noon on Friday 25 April 2014, for the annual ANZAC Day march.

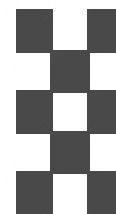

Sport and recreation grants to improve facilities

Community sporting organisations are encouraged to consider applying for support under the State Government's 2015 - 2016 Community Facility Funding Program (CFFP). 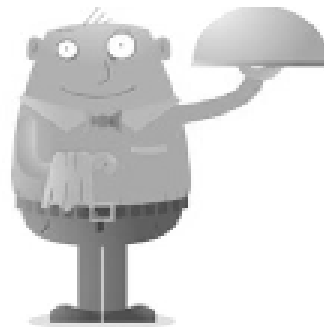

Wandering stock on the shire's roads are continuing to cause safety concerns for motorists with a number of incidents occurring in the past fortnight.

Council's General Manager Infrastructure and Development Services Tamara Johnson said that in recent weeks Local Law staff have attended a number of callouts to incidents involving vehicles and stray stock. "One incident was a near-miss with the motorist veering off the road to avoid a collision, whilst the other involved the driver unavoidably colliding with wandering stock resulting in the death of multiple cows."

"This is a very traumatic experience for all concerned."

"Our Local Law officers are currently experiencing a high level of afterhours call outs to remove stock from roads," said Ms Johnson.

It is the responsibility of all landowners to ensure that when placing stock into paddocks adjacent to highways or roads that fencing is of an adequate standard to keep stock enclosed.

Failure to securely confine stock could result in animals being impounded. Associated costs and a possible monetary penalty of up to \$1,000 may also be incurred.

Council may also issue a fencing notice on the property owner, which requires them to bring their fencing up to a required standard to ensure stock are securely contained.

"We reinforce this message every year when a lack of feed on properties encourages stock to push through fencing and graze on roadsides. It is vital that we make our roads as safe as possible for all motorists – especially during the school holidays and Easter period that are now upon us," Ms. Johnson said.

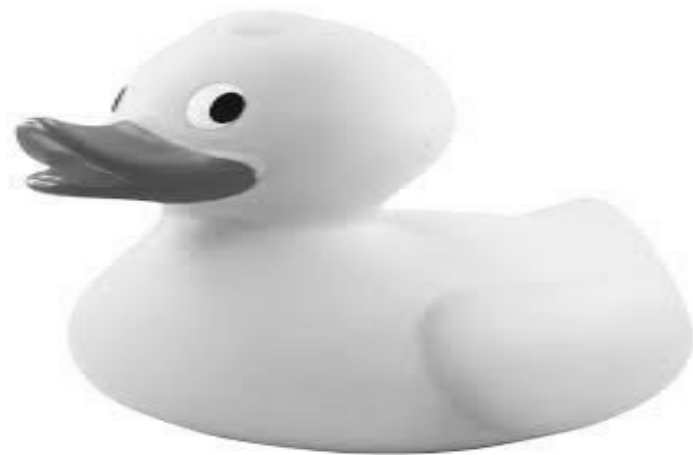
