Life Members Honoured

A small ceremony was held at the Marysville History Centre on April 24th when Mary and Reg Kenealy were given framed Life Member Certificates and a Camellia tree.

The erstwhile couple have been members of the Marysville & District Historical Society for around 30 years, no-one knows for sure as the records were lost in the Black Saturday fires. We do know that Mary was secretary for 25 years, Reg president for 15. They would open the History Centre in Pack Rd. every weekend and any other times on the strength of a phone call.

When Marysville was in danger on Feb. 7th 2009 Mary and Reg selflessly gathered up the centre's more valuable and rare items in their trailer in favour of their own belongings. Sadly everything was lost including the Pack Rd centre. Mary and Reg were taken out of the village before the firefront hit by their son Kevin, like so many others with just the clothes on their backs and their lives.

After the fires hundreds of donated items were sent in by people who had read of Mary and Reg's dilemma, souvenirs that had been kept by folk who had visited Marysville and District in past years. Mary and Reg knew they needed somewhere to store it all so they rented the tiny cottage on Woods Point Rd with a lock up gar-

age that had amazingly not been destroyed. Now living in Boronia, Mary and Reg opened this tiny History Centre every weekend for visitors, even purchasing an old Toyota motorhome so they had somewhere to sleep. It can barely be imagined how difficult this must have been for an elderly couple in the miserable Marysville winter of 2009. On more than one occasion they sifted through the remains of the Pack Rd. centre searching, mostly in vain for historical paraphenilia.

After Andrew Mackenzie, art historian and librarian, had offered to help an avalanche of historical items came in from his many friends and contacts. Andrew had to store this in his own garage at Mt Eliza.

Mary and Reg knew this growing collection needed a bigger home. In June 2010 Michael Darmody's large home at 39 Darwin St was purchased by the Historical Society and with a Government grant was converted into a most agreeable history centre. Mary and Reg spent even more time, weekends and weekdays sleeping in their motorhome, even suffering drenched bedding in the winter of 2010.

The Marysville history centre was mainly developed by Mary and Reg, only asking for assistance when heavy furniture needed moving. Both of

them working together as always set up the displays in each room or area with much love and exquisite taste. The Marysville History centre is a wonderful place to visit, an oasis of tranquility in a town rushing forward. A great day for Mary and Reg was when the Marysville and District Historical Society's new centre was officially opened by Cindy McLeish on October 5th 2013. Hundreds of people came to browse through a most interesting history centre. Congratulations on your Life Memberships Mary and Reg! And on a most dedicated journey

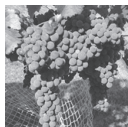

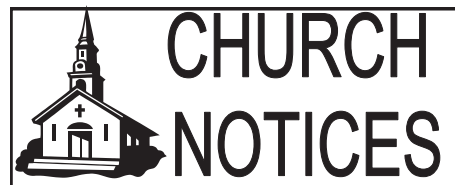

Mayor's Chair by Cr Margaret Rae

This time of year always seems particularly busy with deadlines and due dates in all directions. But it is also a time for great events and many memories.

Easter has come and gone in a flash – it is still for me, oddly enough, very reminiscent of spring, emphasised by chocolate rabbits and eggs. However, autumn is descending with its cool brisk mornings, the annual Anzac Day commemoration and all the memories that are brought to life by old and new comrades coming together. I hope these occasions have brought not only some economic benefit but also revived the spirit of togetherness with the opportunity for some rest and relaxation.

I encourage you to read the budget papers as they present a very clear picture of our ongoing situation for the next ten years and of the need to address this in more substantive terms as we move forward. This will need your input and commentary as we develop a shared understanding of the issues in order to reach an outcome we can all live with.

In the meantime we continue to take pride in our achievements; when I see other organisations spruiking their successes, I sometimes reflect that we as a Council don't often do the same and that our achievements, both large and small, are perhaps not celebrated enough.

So congratulations to those who have such achievements to celebrate – you are great role models in the workplace, as are others who achieve in the community. Everyone has value and contributes in some way to our quality of life. And on that note, I look forward to your contributions over the weeks to come.

1000 Hands a Great Success
