## Alexandra Maternal and Child Health Centre benefits from generous Rotary donation

Alexandra's Maternal and Child Health Centre has been the lucky recipient of brand new fun and educational toys thanks to Alexandra Rotary Club supporting a project initiated by the District Governor's partner, Helen Clancy, who is a midwife.

Each year the Rotary District Governor and partner identify a project which is of special interest to them and then request each Rotary Club to make a contribution to that particular project. President of Alexandra Rotary Anne Reid said that in the 9790 district there are 60 Rotary Clubs.

## Mayor's Chair by Cr Margaret Rae

From time to time issues arise which attract a level of community concern and discussion - none more so than the expenditure of public monies on the purchase of goods and services. The ways in which this has been done have varied over the years and have become increasingly complex and sophisticated. I clearly remember the days when buying or fixing something for the organisation simply meant running to the nearest shop or contacting the nearest handyman. Whilst this can still happen to a limited extent, by and large purchasing now has to comply with a number of stringent requirements.

We all know from our own personal budgets that we have to consider how we spend our funds effectively. Organisations are no different and whether it is local government, health, education or any other public sector organisation, they are all increasingly constrained by insufficient funds to meet the demands placed on them and therefore have to find more effective ways of utilising the funds they do have.

As I attend meetings of councils from across the State, there is more and more discussion of how this is being managed in individual councils and across the sector. Increasingly, the emphasis is on three things: collaboration, shared services and bulk procurement. In addition, councils are being actively encouraged and indeed are expected to be implementing these practices wherever possible - and regular reports are made at meetings and forums on how this is being achieved by various councils. Given the stresses on our own budgetary situation which has been clearly articulated over recent times, we are also engaging in collaboration, sharing of services and bulk procurement from time to time. Deciding to go down a pathway such as bulk procurement - where a group of councils join together in offering a tender in order to get the best value for money versus tendering as an individual organisation presents a number of challenges. One of these is how to manage local content. Individual or stand alone tenders often have a local content criterion as standard practice and the advertising of such tenders can be targeted appropriately. Bulk procurement tenders, however, may not include a local content criterion, and the advertising may be much more broadly based. Also, because a dual tendering process is not possible, there is no way of comparing the potential outcome of one process against the other.

The range of issues and the potential impact of such a decision to be considered in deciding which way to go is considerable, but the expenditure of public monies brings with it accompanying responsibilities. The Local Government Act requires that councils follow best value principles and these principles can and do include a number of considerations. The challenge of decision making in this context is how to achieve balance between the needs, desires and expectations of the community and to marry that with those of government and regulators, whilst remaining accountable and compliant and operating within the financial capacity of the organisation.

If that sounds complicated, it is!

So, how we as Council deal with this and many other issues as we go forward, will be amongst the options we will be considering in our discussions that we have signalled will take place with the community early in the new financial year. Our capacity to raise revenue remains very limited and our cash flow projections are not strong. Therefore how we spend our hard earned revenue is a key factor in our considerations. We need you, as our community, to think about these things and to bring to the table your preferences and your thoughts on where the centre of balance should be and what compromises you would be willing to accept to achieve that balance.

I look forward to our discussions and to your input.

As we move into the colder months of the year, we stoke up the fire and spend a bit more of our leisure time in-doors. We may watch a bit more TV, grab a magazine to have a read and flick through the pictures or even grab a good book with a cup of soup and spend the night drifting off into a fictional wonderland. I am going to go out on a limb and say that most are not going to grab the Council Budget (unless you need a good night's sleep), so I will highlight some of the work Council does with your rates and other funds each year.

Every year, Council provides over 2,500 children health checks and immunisations, over 90,000 items to borrow from our libraries, 60,000 hours of Family Day Care, 20,000 hours of services to the aged and disabled. We enable over 20,000 visitors to our swimming pools and have over 70,000 walk in visitors to our Visitor Information Centres each year.

Council must maintain over 1,000 kilometres of roads, 290 bridges and organise the collection and disposal of 6,055 household rubbish bins. There are over 3,000 animal registrations to process, about 300 building permits to issue and the same number of health premise registrations.

Many of our activities are our core function and as we all know, nothing is free. Your rates go to the daily running of a busy 'industry' and Council is determined to get the best value for each and every dollar we spend. We have an enormous Shire with many expectations and it is our job to balance those expectations with a realistic service provision. I am sure that most will be happy with the balance we have struck.

On this upcoming long weekend, I want you to put down that book, stretch your legs, grab the family and friends and get along to the Alexandra Truck, Ute and Rod Show on Sunday 8 June. It has become a signature event on the Murrindindi Shire Calendar and has something for everyone. See you there!
