Last Sunday members of the Marysville Community Golf and Bowls Club welcomed community residents and friends to a viewing of the newly renovated club house. Despite the dreary weather, approximately 140 people visited the club and all were impressed with the transformation of the facility.

The bar was open and operational, with coffees also available. There were sandwiches and sausage rolls, and many enjoyed the vibe the new facility offered.

“The Minderoo Room” has been named after the generous donation from the Minderoo Foundation, which assisted with the building of the clubrooms. The Minderoo Foundation was founded in 2001 by Andrew and Nicola Forrest.

The new clubhouse comprises of the “Minderoo Room”, which will double as a 110 seat bistro and dining area, a fully commercial kitchen, members lounge which will be available for hire as a function room, and can also be portioned off into two smaller rooms, allowing for intimate private meetings if

required. The members lounge comfortably seats 35 people. There is a bar, with a great stock of local wines from Buxton Ridge Winery, Little River Winery and Little Cathedral Winery, as well as others. The pro shop has ample stock for your golfing needs.

Our thanks to Ken Whittingham, Erin Morrison, Ron Denmead, Heather Jenkins, Sean Williams and a number of club members for

organizing the open day. Members are looking forward to hosting events and providing a place for community and family gatherings.

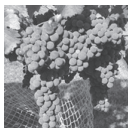

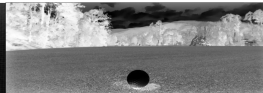

Open Mike
Is Back

Mayors Chair by Councillor Margaret Rae

Recently I attended the Rural and Regional Planning Conference which was held in Lilydale. The presentations were diverse, interesting and informative, ranging from how decisions are made, including case studies, by the Victorian Civil and Administration Tribunal (VCAT), to the development of Melbourne over the past thirty years.

You might wonder about the relevance of the latter but it was a very insightful presentation and the principles of good planning development are very much transferable to the rural context.

You may also have noticed in the press in recent days that Plan Melbourne has been adopted into local planning schemes.. This is a very comprehensive plan which looks not only at the future development of Melbourne but also incorporates the eight Regional Growth Strategies. These were developed very much with local input from each region and it is clear that there is now a planning strategy for Victoria which aims for an integrated and coordinated approach across the State. Hence its relevance.

The key message that reverberated through many of the presentations was that of the importance of the local Municipal Strategic Statement (MSS) which is part of the Local Planning Policy Framework (LPPF). This is the document in which Council can and should clearly articulate its strategies for the future – where and how different types of development might or might not occur, or how different areas or even streets in a township might have particular activities permitted or disallowed.

At our June Council meeting, Council adopted our draft LPPF for informal exhibition. This has been rewritten to comply with current requirements and we are taking the opportunity to redraft sections to provide guidance for the future about planning directions in our Shire.

The issues of where different levels of residential density might occur, where different types of activity might be located, to what extent should different types of agribusiness (which could well include smaller holdings than traditionally) be encouraged and located, the value of protecting prime agricultural land, the future development of tourism based activities, the protection of our natural environment – in fact the future economic development of the Shire is impacted by the LPPF and the strategic framework it sets out.

This is your opportunity therefore to give your input, initially in an informal setting, so that the formal draft LPPF can incorporate your feedback, your thoughts and your ideas about how we should plan for the future.

Copies of the document are available from Council offices at Alexandra, Yea and Kinglake and it is also available from Council's website. The exhibition period is open until 31 July 2014 and I very much look forward to your input.

Councillor Comment by Cr. Andrew Derwent

I cannot help but focus my comments on the recent storms that impacted Kinglake, Kinglake West, Toolangi, Castella and Glenburn. These townships were hit hard with large trees blown onto homes, roads and of course, power lines. I am aware of at least three houses that sustained major damage and there were many others that will need repairs. Fortunately no one was hurt. The carnage caused loss of power for between two to four days. And for these affected areas that are not on mains water, having no power means that pumps don't work so there's no water to cook with, drink, wash or even flush the toilet.

Keeping in mind that most of these areas have been hit hard by a natural disaster not too long ago, the communities seemed to have an instinct about what to do and rallied to the challenge. Response to storm damage is an SES responsibility and the members of the Kinglake SES were wonderfully supported by the Kinglake CFA, Parks Vic and the Department of Environment and Primary Industries (DEPI). I know from my SES experience that given the number of calls for assistance we had, without the help from these other agencies, it would have taken about three days for the local SES volunteers to deal with these jobs. Given that the storms started about midday on Tuesday, it's a credit to all involved that almost all jobs had been attended to by late evening on the same day! Hats off to these people, many of who are volunteers.

There were concerns that peoples' wellbeing would start to suffer without power, so a decision was made late on Wednesday afternoon to set up a relief centre at the Kinglake Council offices. Council staff are to be commended for operating the centre so efficiently on such short notice. Notice of the relief centre's operation had to get to the affected residents quickly. CFA crews from Kinglake West, Toolangi, Glenburn and Murrindindi rallied to the call and eagerly assisted the now very tired Kinglake SES members to get the message out. By 10.30pm on Wednesday night most of those without power knew of the relief centre arrangements and were also provided other valuable advice. The volunteers door-knocked, used phone trees, facebook pages and other means to let people know. A daunting task completed in a short time with little notice, but one that was achieved well and without complaint. These volunteer crews are of course members of our communities.

Again, hats off to these crews. Many of whom, like me, went home to a cold house, with no power, no lighting and no water. Many of the Kinglake SES members had been active in the field for about 18 hours and I can assure you it's not enjoyable to get home after midnight, after starting the day at around 6am, to a freezing cold house with no lights and no water.

The grounds crews from SP Ausnet worked tirelessly to restore power and they also warrant congratulations for what must have seemed a daunting task as do our Council crews for clearing many trees and much debris off our roads.

The performance and behaviour of our community during this trying time reminds me of the reasons I live here. It's not just a beautiful place to live with our native flora and fauna, but our communities are generally a close, inclusive and involved bunch of people that are mostly ready to pitch in and help to get over the problems. Feedback received from the residents was really encouraging. Thankful for the efforts put in by the many volunteers (sometimes their neighbours or friends) and the other crews in clearing up the mess and getting the relief message out.

I am glad I live in Murrindindi Shire and glad to be considered a member of the Kinglake community.

Governance Local Law improves meeting practices

The adoption of Murrindindi Shire Council's Governance Local Law 2, 2014 will see improved community participation in council meetings. Chief Executive Officer Margaret Abbey said that a Governance Local Law is different from other local laws as its predominant focus is on internal Council operations.

"Although the new Governance Local Law mainly focuses on our internal governance practices, its impact on meeting practices is what will generate interest from the community. The new law incorporates a substantial change to the Public Participation Process which provides the community better options to be heard during Open Forum sessions at Council meetings and receive a response to their enquiries from Council.

"Council values Open Forum sessions however the past process has been restrictive in that it prevented members of the Council from providing responses or entering into discussions with participants. The new law allows for members of the community to provide prior notice of their Open Forum submission or question for Council in order to receive a response during the Open Forum session.

"This provision will mean a more open and transparent meeting processes and gives Council the flexibility to adapt to the needs of our community", said Ms. Abbey.

The new public participation processes will be in place for the next ordinary meeting of Council scheduled for Wednesday 23 July. Other main changes incorporated into the Local Law will see the election of the Mayor being conducted during the open public section of a Council meeting and will enable the Chief Executive Officer to set the Council meeting agenda.

Murrindindi Shire Council working towards energy efficiency

Murrindindi Shire Council has adopted a ten-point plan for creating a more environmentally sustainable and energy efficient workplace.

Chief Executive Officer Margaret Abbey said that a number of exciting projects were underway to improve the energy efficiencies of Council's offices and buildings.

"Works have begun to upgrade and replace some of Council's lighting stock with LED technologies following an energy audit in 2013 that estimated we could save around \$3,000 in running costs annually.

"Lighting replacement works underway include the interior and exterior security lighting at the Alexandra Offices, Library, Council Chambers and Shire Hall as well as the Kinglake Community Centre. Other works include removing excess lighting from passage ways in the Alexandra offices and installing tamper-proof timers on boiling water dispensers" said Ms. Abbey.

Council is also seeking other efficiencies. Council's Information Management Team has been leading the organisation through the shift to an electronic record keeping and information sharing system known as 'TRIM'.

"This is dramatically reducing the amount of paper used across the organisation. TRIM has resulted in a marked reduction in the demand on server storage capacity thanks to the consolidation of electronic records into one central source. Since the implementation of TRIM in July 2013, staff have saved approx 40,000 documents into the system" said Ms. Abbey.

The establishment of a 'ResourceSmart Team' amongst Council staff has been the driving force behind many of the initiatives being put in place throughout the organisation.

"This group of committed volunteer staff which we affectionately refer to as 'The Green Team' is committed to supporting innovative projects and leading our organisation through sustainable change. Along with the initiatives that are already being rolled out, a number are due for introduction in the very near future including: the establishment of a composting system complete with worm farms to recover organic waste from office kitchens, installation of new bin infrastructure to improve recovery of waste streams generated throughout the offices and the implementation of a 'switch off' campaign to remind staff to power down their electronic equipment when not in use" said Ms Abbey.
