LIFE SAVING DEFIBRILLATOR PRESENTED TO FOOTBALL/NETBALL CLUB BY ADAS

At a recent game, Alexandra District Ambulance Support Inc., the auxiliary that supports Ambulance Victoria in this area, presented the Thornton Eildon District Football and Netball Club with an AED, automated external defibrillation device.

ADAS has been instrumental in raising funds to place the lifesaving defibrillators in community locations in Alexandra, Marysville and Eildon, so when the football and netball club made enquiries about acquiring one for their club rooms, ADAS was happy to help.

The device is designed to be used by a

lay person in an emergency when waiting for a "trained operator" could mean the difference between life and death. However, Andrew Woollard, Team Manager for Ambulance Victoria, has offered to conduct a training session in the use of the device for the club. The AED will be available at all times for the local community, not just on game days.

John Creighton, Acting President of the club thanked ADAS for their support and for providing the opportunity to have such a proven lifesaving piece of equipment available in the club rooms. John mentioned several instances where

such devices have saved lives in small communities.

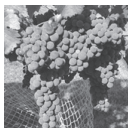

Mayors Chair by Councillor Margaret Rae

I am pleased to say that Council has now adopted the Council Plan, the Strategic Resource Plan and the Budget for the 2014-2015 year. This always marks a significant point in a Council year and means that we will now be able to commence the discussions with the community signalled in the documents.

There are, however, other documents and policies that get adopted by Council over the course of the year which may well, to the outside observer, seem pedantic, technical, obscure and even irrelevant to everyday life. In fact, though, they provide the framework for our service delivery and, while compliance is a driving force behind all of this, so is our community - and wherever we can, we try to improve the ability of Council and community to interact with each other.

A recent example is the adoption of the Governance Local Law 2, 2014, which for some reason I suspect has not been on many people's top ten reading list! However, this somewhat legalistic framework contains the formal mechanism by which members of the community can bring their concerns to Council. This has traditionally been done by means of petitions or through Open Forum, and many of you will have used Open Forum to address Council or have listened to others doing so. Since I have been a Councillor I have heard some of you, whilst appreciating the opportunity to address Council, also express some disappointment or frustration at the somewhat one sided process which does not provide a mechanism for a response.

In redrafting the Local Law, we were very conscious of wishing to improve this in a practical way, so a new option of 'Questions to Council' has been introduced. This is intended to provide an answer whenever possible at the meeting. For this to be possible, questions will need to be lodged in writing by 4pm on the day before the Council meeting. Our intention is to have as full an answer as possible for the person asking the question at the formal meeting. If this is not possible because of the complexity of the question, for example, then an officer and a timeframe for response will be designated at the meeting.

This section of the agenda will be retained at the beginning of the meeting and known as Public Participation Time. It will comprise three parts: Questions for Council; Open Forum; and Petitions. The format of Open Forum will be kept as before as this often takes the form of 'questions without notice' so time will always be required to make a considered response. The process for Petitions has also been retained. We do hope, however, that Questions for Council which will provide the opportunity to submit a question and receive an answer in the shortest possible timeframe and will assist those in the community who have concerns and who wish to communicate directly with Council.

Councillor Comment by Cr John Kennedy Cheviot Ward

Most people will remember those old newspaper items which encouraged their readers to learn a new word every day. Well my column this week is about that. And the new word is 'geocaching'.

The word is important because it is an activity that is creating significant public activity around the world and it has the potential to increase our future visitor numbers to Murrindindi Shire.

There are said to be almost three million 'geocaches' located around the globe and well over six million and rapidly increasing exponents. Let's start with a simple explanation.

Geocaching is a real world, outdoor treasure hunting game utilising GPS (global positioning system) devices – think GPS enabled mobile phones or tablets etc. Using the GPS coordinates participants in geocaching attempt to find the 'geocache' (or a container) hidden at that location.

There are some simple rules which basically require the players that one the cache is located they are expected to take something from the cache and replace it with something of equal or greater value. You must also write down something about your find in the log book and you must also log on your experience at the geocache website.

This may all sound fairly simple but geocaching is on a strongly increasing trend in many parts of the world especially in the USA. It has a particular attraction to young, technically aware and IT proficient people. It is traditional that caches should be placed in local parks, at land marks or near unique buildings, at historical or geographical features or similar.

I am aware that there are already caches at a number of places within Murrindindi Shire. Those that I am aware of include the Cheviot Tunnel, and at historic grave site in the Yea Cemetery.

I believe there is another close to the statue in the Jack Shiel Gardens opposite the Shire Offices in Alexandra. It is believed there is another one intended for the Avro Anson aircraft crash site on Mount Torbreck. There could also be many others elsewhere within the Shire's 3,889 square kilometre land mass.

Caches that are within easy reaches of major metropolitan communities like Melbourne appear to be key attractions. Simply they provide geocaching participants with a visit out in the country where using their GPS information the challenge is often to reach and record as many cache sites as possible in a day. This is what brings our often younger generation technically aware tourist visitors and we all know that visitors to our Shire buy coffee, meals, fuel etc and may even stay overnight, so our local businesses are potentially beneficiaries of geocaching.

So my message is if you see people about the Shire with a GPS instrument in their hand and they are investigating or searching around our local landmarks and features well they are probably geocaching! Wikipedia the free encyclopaedia to which we all refer as a reference today has this to say:

"Geocaching is an outdoor recreational activity in which the participants use a Global Positioning System receiver or mobile device and other navigational devices to hide and seek containers called "geocaches" or "caches" anywhere in the world. A typical cache is a small waterproof container containing a log book, where the geocacher enters the date they found it and signs in with their established code name. After signing the log, the cache must be placed back exactly where the person found it. Larger containers such as plastic storage boxes (Tupperware or similar) or ammunition boxes can also contain items for trading, usually toys or trinkets of little financial value".

Council to conduct feasibility study for proposed trail link

Council is undertaking a feasibility study for the proposed construction of a trail connecting Alexandra, Thornton and Eildon (and Lake Eildon) to the Great Victorian Rail which is being funded as part of the Advancing Country Towns (ACT) initiative.

The Great Victorian Rail Trail is a shared pathway for cyclists, walkers and horse riders that stretches 134 kms from Tallarook through Yea to Mansfield with a branch line from Cathkin that terminates in Alexandra.

The feasibility study will investigate the viability of linking the three townships of Alexandra, Thornton and Eildon to the existing Rail Trail route in order to improve the economic benefits that flow from tourism to these communities. The feasibility study will also assess the health and well being and recreation benefits that may exist for the local communities in the development of a trail link.

Infrastructure and Waste Portfolio Councillor Bernie Wagner is supportive of the project and said that it would greatly increase tourism potential.

"The possible construction of a trail linking the Great Victorian Rail Trail to our State recognised tourism destination of Lake Eildon has the potential to increase 'year-round' tourism to the region and thereby improve the sustainability of businesses that rely on visitation

"However before any decision is made to construct the trail, Council is committed to the feasibility study so it can determine if the construction of a trail link is viable in the first instance and to also fully understand the long-term financial impacts of developing a trail link.

"Once this study is complete Council will then consider the recommendations and make a decision in relation to the future construction of a trail link. If the project is to proceed Council will need to seek grant funding to develop the trail," said Cr Wagner.

Council will hold a number of information drop-in sessions for the community to learn more about the trail link feasibility project. Council staff will be on hand to give an overview of the project and to answer questions. Plans showing the proposed trail link route options will also be available.
