Local Oncologist raising funds for the Epworth Hospital

Local Oncologist, Dr Michael Daly will be travelling to China in early September to undertake what he describes as the ultimate "Walk and Talk". He will be walking the Great Wall of China for 6 days to raise money for research and facilitating patient treatment at the Epworth Hospital in Richmond, where he heads the stereotactic radiosurgery program. This offers hope for brain and brain conditions, not only as part as cancer treatment, but also for benign tumours and blood vessel abnormalities.

"Not only patients at Epworth may benefit from funds raised, but through a series of hospital visits and lectures before and after the walk, information and experience will be shared with Chinese Oncologists and neurosurgeons as well", he says.

He hopes to walk some of the less well travelled parts of the wall including Jinshanling, Jiankou and Xishuiyu before

returning to the hustle and bustle of Beijing and Guangzhou. Mike will be part of an eight person team from the Epworth with the other participants from administration and nursing. As a training exercise you may see the team climbing to Keppel's Lookout or the Cathedrals later in August.

Mike's first visit to china was in 2006 when he was working at the Alfred. He has taught in Guangzhou, Beijing, Shanghai, Nanjing, and Shendu. He has led several Asia/Pacific and Australi-

an training courses with the most recent teaching staff from the Peter Mac, Royal North Shore in Sydney and the Royal Perth hospitals.

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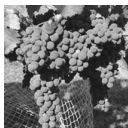


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**Gallipoli Park Precinct

Mayors Chair by Councillor Margaret Rae

The Honorable Tim Bull has responded to last week's Mayor's Chair, where I set out the situation facing Council and the community of Murrindindi Shire, following the gifting of a range of new and valuable assets to the Council resulting from bushfire reconstruction efforts.

Unfortunately there remains a significant lack of appreciation of the nature and extent of the problem. The Minister's letter reflects his misunderstanding of a number of the issues we have been discussing with the Victorian Government for over two years now.

Council has consistently acknowledged the unprecedented generosity of governments and the Victorian and Australian people in responding to the 2009 bushfires throughout our discussions with Government and the community as well as in all our communications through the media. It is widely acknowledged that the 2009 bushfires were one of the worst disasters to ever hit Victoria and the community of Murrindindi Shire. The incredible generosity shown to Murrindindi Shire and scale of reconstruction was also unprecedented.

However, Council is now dealing with the consequences of decisions made in relation to reconstruction in the Shire at that time, which Council had limited opportunity to influence. Given this, it is difficult for Council to understand the lack of recognition by the State Government that Council now faces new and unexpected challenges that other small rural Councils do not face.

No other small rural Council has taken on the responsibility for meeting the annual cost of operation, maintenance, insurance and renewal for approximately \$33 million worth of assets immediately and simultaneously. And none has done so at the same time as facing a decline in the rate base, a drop in population and a government buyback scheme in the face of a range of new restrictions and costs for residents to rebuild.

In his letter, the Minister refers to a range of grants available to the Council. Council continues to apply for grants and constantly looks to access alternative funding sources. However such grants give very little budget or planning certainty as they are generally decided following competitive processes and, moreover, do not generally cover operating or maintenance costs. Consequently, these funds do not and cannot address the fundamental issue facing Council - that of an ongoing annual funding shortfall of over \$1.7 million. It would be irresponsible of Council to allow this situation to continue without seeking further assistance.

Similarly, whilst very welcome, the Victorian Government's investment in the Vibe Hotel and Conference Centre in Marysville to which the Minister refers, does little to address the immediate problem facing the Council. The investment is complementary to and consistent with our approach to growing our rate base. However, this will take time to evolve and support is therefore required in the interim.

We are not seeking funding for staffing as the Minister suggests; our need relates exclusively to the new and expanded assets gifted to Council following reconstruction efforts. As a small rural Council with a substantial and unfunded additional cost burden resulting from reconstruction activities, these funding sources and other support measures mentioned do not provide a solution. It is unfortunate that the exceptional challenges that face Murrindindi Shire which arise exclusively as a result of those large scale reconstruction activities are not recognised by Minister Bull and the Victorian Government.

This is a situation not of our making. We are not shying away from the responsibility for these additional assets but we simply do not have the resources to manage them without placing extraordinary additional burdens on our community. Our point to Government (and now to the Opposition) has been and will continue to be that we do not believe it is acceptable for fire-affected communities - which I might add, is the whole community of our Shire - to suffer cuts to services or inordinate rate rises. Council will continue to work actively to seek recognition by the Victorian Government and the Opposition of the real and ongoing costs of the gifted new and expanded assets to the community of Murrindindi Shire.

You could be forgiven for thinking that Council has become a little obsessed with its current funding situation. We have. And that is because it is difficult to overstate the seriousness of the choices we now face. I hope that you will add your voice to ours, and speak to your local member about this important issue in the lead up to the State elections in November.

Councillor Comment by Cr John Walsh, Koriella Ward

Feeling a bit like Crocodile Dundee comparing knives in New York, I'd like to say to Joe Hockey "That's not a budget crisis; this, in Murrindindi, is a budget crisis."

Last week in her Mayor's Chair, Margaret advised that we were finally knocked back by the State Government after more than two years of discussions to gain support for the increased on-going costs of the buildings, parks and trails built during the Community Recovery Phase. These are additional costs to Murrindindi Shire Council, outside the assistance received from successive State Governments for fire recovery or grants available for Councils in general.

The Victorian Government's decision creates a hole of about \$1.76 million per year in our long term financial plans and comes on top of a freeze on Commonwealth Assistance Grants. Add to that, reduced rates available due to slower than expected rebuilding in fire affected areas; the buy-back scheme; and the impacts on housing costs of the extended Bushfire Management Overlay provisions. More costs and a projected lower rate base threaten our long term sustainability.

So where to from here?

Firstly we continue to press the State Government to reconsider and have asked the Opposition and local candidates for their support. I encourage all residents to do the same and consider the answers when they vote in November.

\$1.76 million represents about 12.5% of revenue from property rates and the municipal charge. To cover the gap in one hit, we would have to add the increase to the current 6% annual rate rise. That is more than an 18% rate increase in 2015/16 and 6% thereafter. Or we could meet the gap over 10 years and we'd have increases of about 8% per year instead of 6% for the next decade.

Another option is to reduce the costs by having community groups make greater contributions to the costs of all buildings and facilities they use. We can reduce the services we provide and also look to reducing the standards at which we provide services. That lemon was squeezed hard in the Services Review but there may be some juice left that we can extract. This approach is also complicated because many of the current remaining services are statutory obligations that we can't cease or hand off to others.

As highlighted during the Rate Strategy Review, other Councils gain additional revenue from differential rates for vacant land and for commercial properties. Perhaps it is time for us to look at those options. We have already commenced work to have more people live in the Shire. With more residents in new properties we gain more rates contributions and thus lessen the load for each of us. But for that to be successful we need to have increased employment and training opportunities. In that regard the State Government investment in the Vibe Hotel and Conference Centre at Marysville helps but their reduction in course subsidy for the Murrindindi Training Institute doesn't.

There are other avenues to be explored and I'd appreciate your input of ideas and preferences. The solution is likely to be a mix of all options unless we just use the blunt axe of an across the board rate increase and at greater than 18% next year, I for one don't want to do that if it can be avoided.

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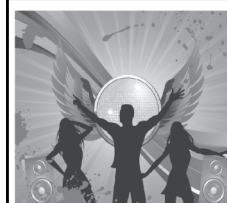

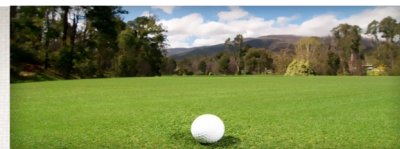
