## Super season at Lake Mountain has snowball effect

Lake Mountain is enjoying a super season thanks to a timely top up of fresh new snow.

The resort has been absolutely pumping with energy with an estimated 5000 visitors on peak days. Visitors of all ages have been having an absolute ball with so many exciting activities on offer ranging from snow play and tobogganing to sled dog tours to snow shoeing and skiing the world class network of trails.

The visitor numbers have certainly helped reinforce Lake Mountain Alpine Resort's reputation as possibly the most popular winter theme park in the State, if not Australia.

Resort Manager, Scott Gamble, said it was wonderful to see families, literally by the thousands, out and about and enjoying the thrills and spills on the toboggan slopes, playing in the snow and building snowmen, exploring the resort on snow shoes or giving cross country skiing a go. The Siberian Husky sled dog tours are also a major attraction on the first weekend of each month during the season.

"The resort is truly a winter wonderland," said Mr Gamble from Belgravia Health and Leisure who is managing the resort for the second year running on behalf of the Lake Mountain Board of Management.

"It is terrific to see hundreds and hundreds of families and people of all ages having such a fun day out ... The countless snow men, of all shapes and sizes, suddenly taking shape all around the resort add to the magic."

At the same time Lake Mountain is enjoying quite a revival as a cross country skiing destination given the great cold, dry snow conditions and excellent grooming. And, with a commitment to junior development, conditions were

perfect on Sunday for the Schools Snowsports XC Classic event, hosted by Lake Mountain for the first time, as well as the third and final round in the Lake Mountain Mini Series for young skiers. Competitors and spectators enjoyed a truly Blue Bird Day.

The bumper snow season is having a great domino effect on the local region and particularly Marysville, the gateway to Lake Mountain. The township has been abuzz with the influx of snow visitors, many of whom have expressed an interest in coming back to explore further afield during the green season.

"While most businesses can not afford to rely on the snow trade alone, a good season certainly helps," said Christine Adams who runs the Marysville Caravan and Holiday Park and is also president of the Marysville Triangle Business and Tourism Inc.

"The eating/dining and hotel businesses are doing extremely well, although operators are missing out on quite a bit of sleep trying to keep up," Mrs Adams said.

"It is by far the best season since the 2009 fires and certainly helps put Marysville back on the map ... Many of our visitors at the caravan park are here for the snow but they are saying they want to come back in the warmer months to see more of the area. It is the visitor returns who really make the difference."

At Fraga's Cafe in the heart of Marysville, the volume of coffee sales certainly tells the story.

"During the snow season we usually sell about 20kg of coffee a week, compared with 10kg at other times of the year. Last weekend alone we sold 15kg," said James Fraga, adding that staff have been flat out serving breakfasts, lunches, afternoon teas and beverages.

Meanwhile Nat Morandi from Marysville Ski Hire has a slightly different perspective ... While his shop has been extremely busy, everything comes to a halt on peak days when the resort reaches capacity and closes, sometimes before 11 am. People do not hire clothing and equipment once the resort is closed.

"It has certainly been a good season, but it is not a 'great' one until we reach the end of August," said Nat who has been in the business for 30 years so is all too aware of how Mother Nature can quickly turn things around.

While most visitors to Lake Mountain travel from Melbourne, the positive vibes from such a good snow season seem to have a snowball effect.

"Towns like Alexandra do not benefit noticeably, but a good season at Lake Mountain is good for everyone in the region," said Andrew Embling, president of the Alexandra Traders and Tourism Association.

Lake Mountain's Mr Gamble said it was tremendous that the resort helps to bring thousands of extra visitors through the Marysville Triangle and surrounding townships, stimulating tourism and employment.

He also commended the resort staff who have been working around the clock to ensure that visitors enjoy their snow experience to the max and that the ski trails are maintained to an exceptionally high standard. In addition, the road crew does its utmost to keep the roads clear of snow and ice to minimise the need for fitting chains. He advised snow visitors to plan to arrive early to avoid any closures due to the resort car parks reaching capacity, particularly on weekends. With the recent top up of fresh snow, Lake Mountain's winter wonderland has lots to offer so, come on up!

## Mayor's Chair by Councillor Margaret Rae

Discussions at Council briefings lately, as you may imagine, have focused intently on the funding issues facing us as we look at formulating the next budget and start to examine what options might be available.

A constant in this is how we communicate with you, our community, in a clear and accessible way. In the process we find ourselves debating the language that is used within local government and whether the words can be at times unfamiliar to many. One such discussion recently was directly in relation to the costs incurred in keeping all our assets functioning. These are usually described in three categories: operating, maintenance and renewal. It has become increasingly clear to us that these words are not understood in the same way by many groups of people, whether within the community, other groups to whom we are advocating, or even political representatives of all persuasions. So I thought I would take this opportunity to go through these descriptions.

Operating costs are relatively simple to explain – they are the day to day expenses often also described as recurrent costs and are the ones experienced in one way or another by us all – electricity, gas, water, telephone, insurance, cleaning and the like. Maintenance costs are sometimes misunderstood and we have often received the comment “but you don't need money for maintenance, they are all new buildings”. If only that were true! Every asset needs regular maintenance whether it is servicing, repairs to minor damage, repainting scuffs and scrapes, or ensuring playgrounds and equipment such as barbecues are safe and serviceable. There is a plethora of things that need doing during a given year in order to maintain the quality and condition of assets to keep them safe and functional for people to use and to minimise deterioration.

Which, of course, leads to the third component – capital renewal. Now this doesn't necessarily mean knocking down and rebuilding. It means monitoring the condition of the asset and intervening at an appropriate point to undertake more significant works so that the life of the asset is extended and maximised. It can involve works to restore the asset back to its original condition– which is where grant funding plays a vital role. However, we are required to plan for this aspect of asset care and like all Councils set aside money for when this work is needed. Appropriate funds therefore need to be accumulated and preserved, as we are doing, in a reserve specifically for this purpose so that monies are actually available to carry out renewal as it is needed. Without such provision and planning, our roads, bridges, footpaths, parks and buildings would gradually deteriorate and become dysfunctional. All three components of the costs are therefore unavoidable. They are also very well understood by Council.

As you have heard us say before, the annual cost of the new gifted assets now runs at \$2,804,000 per annum, in contrast with \$1,040,000 million per annum before 2009. This is the gap we are having to bridge – the costs are real; the solution is yet to evolve.

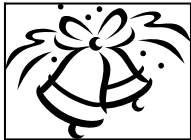

The Department of Environment and Primary Industries and Parks Victoria are committed to protecting and enhancing the natural values of parks, reserves and state forests across the state. Examples of this conservation management are the control of introduced plant and animal species which can impact on these values.

As part of an ongoing strategy, the Department of Environment and Primary Industries is continuing to lay buried baits containing sodium fluoroacetate (1080 poison) on public land for the control of foxes. Baiting commenced Monday 13th January 2014 and will continue until Friday 19th December 2014.

Baits have been laid at strategic sites and other known areas of fox habitat within the above mentioned forests and parks, and within the vicinity of townships Eldon, Rubicon, Taggerty, Buxton, Marysville, Narbethong, Healesville, Warburton and Toolangi.

1080 poison signs have been posted throughout the baited areas and members of the public who are living, visiting or working in the above named areas are advised to take particular care not to disturb or interfere with bait stations. Domestic dogs and cats are particularly susceptible to 1080 poison and should be under effective control, muzzled or kept away from the poisoned areas.

## Community Accessibility Inc. supports Murrindindi

Community Accessibility is pleased to announce an expansion to its services and involvement within the Murrindindi Shire.

Recently, a trial was launched to provide community transport within Alexandra to assist residents to travel to and from medical and social appointments. The service operates 2 days a week and pick-ups can be made by contacting our office. This service is the result of a partnership between Community Accessibility, Berry Street and Murrindindi Shire Council.

In addition to this service, we currently run a community transport service from Yea and have done so for a number of years. This service can be used locally or for medical appointment trips further afield i.e. Melbourne. Community Transport is not funded directly in the State of Victoria so in order to maintain the vehicles, cover on-road costs and to keep these services operating, it is necessary for a fee to be charged. The eligibility requirements may vary for these services, so please confirm this with our Seymour office.

To assist the Murrindindi Shire Council to provide more consistent and improved utilisation of their community bus fleet, Community Accessibility has established the Smartlink program in Murrindindi. Smartlink is a register of vehicles which are available for hire to groups within the Shire. At present only the Shire owned community buses are on the register but it is hoped that other vehicles will become available as time goes on. Call 1300 704 530 if you would like to know more about Smartlink.

We have recently been involved in the development of a partnership with Travellers Aid Australia and V/Line to improve access to the Seymour train station through the reinstatement of the buggy service which used to operate. This will commence in the next couple of months. We hope this will enable more people to benefit from the regular transport links between Seymour and Melbourne.

Requests for our services within Murrindindi are increasing, so are the options. We believe in all services working together to provide transport solutions to the residents of Murrindindi Shire.
