Marysville Community Golf and Bowls Clubhouse Official Opening

For a number of months, the management committee and members of the Marysville Community Golf and Bowls Club have been busy organizing and excitedly anticipating the official opening of the newly renovated clubhouse.

This event will take place on Saturday 6th September and whilst a number of the Murrindindi community leaders and representatives have been invited to attend the day of celebrations, an invitation now goes out to all members of the local community to attend the opening ceremony at 11.00am. The Bunker Restaurant will be open for lunch from 12-3pm and for dinner from 6pm-8pm as normal.

Deputy Premier Peter Ryan will declare the building open at 11.00 am and this will be witnessed by representatives from Regional Development Victoria, Minderoo, (the former Australian Children's Trust) the Murrindindi Shire, Pizzey Noble Project Managers, Spowers Architects, Becon Builders, Steve Manalack (Founder of East West Academy) and Friends of Marysville Golf Club, The Marysville and Triangle District Lions Club, and the Golf and Bowls Club Members and friends.

After the official ceremony, VIPs, members and invited guests will partake of a light lunch provided by Manager and Chef, Russell Cohen,

and his staff in the stunning 'The Bunker' restaurant overlooking the 10th Tee.

Whilst 'The Bunker' has only been operating for a short time, many visitors and locals have enjoyed the delicious food supplied by Russell and a much needed culinary gap in the district has been filled. As one golfer was heard to say 'this is one bunker we don't mind getting into'!

Whilst the community is celebrating the opening of the clubhouse and the restaurant, it must not be forgotten that the Marysville Golf Course is one of the most picturesque in Victoria. Set in a natural amphitheatre, surrounded by hills, it was designed to embrace the countryside and the Steavenson River which meanders through it. 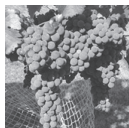

Pans on Fire Update

Hello Campers, since I am not a Musician, I am the designated Driver of one of the Band's Rented nine-seater Renault Traffic mini-buses. When we first picked it up last week, I sat in the passenger seat out of habit, then I got behind the drivers wheel to familiarise myself with the manual gear shift, again on the wrong side. I had driven an old WW2 Studebaker Truck in the Army but that was 45 years ago and it was on bush track behind the rifle range, with no oncoming traffic. My brain has taken a couple of days to adjust to shifting the gears with my right hand and the blinker/windscreen wiper reverse position has added to the confusion. Not mine, just the rest of the French Drivers on the road.

Roundabouts here are the real challenge, you must **LOOK LEFT** and then **TURN RIGHT**, the French are funny about that. Driving on their motorways at 130kph is equally crazy but at night in the rain it can be life threatening. So far I have managed to slip into default mode only a couple of times but the thought of a head-on keeps me awake at night. I am getting better.

We park in the street (Quai Antoine Hebrard) the French have a sense of humour in naming their small zane ways - on one side of the house we are staying in is the **Rue de Porte Arse** and a few doors up is the **Rue de Coq** (Pronounced Cock)? Further along the street another lane is called **Rue de Chat** (the Cat). On Monday morning we had some spare time while the band was rehearsing, I offered to take Gillian Pannan (a new arrival) for a tour of the area, we went up to Boudou (8kms from Moissac) which has a lookout overlooking the valley. The view takes in the the meeting of the waters of the Rivers Tarn and the Garonne which form part of the Canal du Midi joining the Atlantic with the Mediterranean. We backed out of the small carpark and I attempted to make a simple 3 point turn to head back to town. The plan went awry when the front passenger wheel went down a culvert leaving the van with the opposite back wheel a foot in the air. **Panic Stations:** No obvious damage to the undercarriage but we had no traction and with one wheel down the drain, we weren't going anywhere. Out of nowhere - first one then two and finally four kindly Frenchmen came to our aid. Bonjours all around and I had soon exhausted my limited French but I think they got the message that we were Australians in trouble... They shook their heads in unison and just took over and immediately it was, "**Boudou to the Rescue**". The jack supplied with the rental took 10 minutes to retrieve from under the seat and was next to useless, another appeared from a garage across the road along with a few sturdy planks to build a bridge under the wheel. Gillian and I were directed to stand in the back of the van to balance the vehicle while the Frenchmen jacked us up and in no time had engineered a solid platform to allow us to back out of the disaster and on our way.

It was an amazing result to get us back on four wheels. much backslapping and handshaking the blokes, air kissing the ladies, (who had really only watched) we were on our way.

I had visions of needing an expensive recovery vehicle to get us out of a hole, **Viva la France** , we were saved the cost and the embarrassment of calling in the troops. We both had cameras but took no photographs of the near disaster, perhaps that's just as well.

Mayor's Chair by Margaret Rae

Recently in the press you may have seen articles in which the responsibility for enforcing country of origin food labelling laws has been discussed. The claim was made that this is the responsibility of local councils – a claim with which others disagreed. This got me wondering - and if I am doing so, then probably you are too – so I decided to follow this up.

We are all concerned about where our food comes from and whether it is fresh and fit for use, and many of us have a preference for local products. This is where labelling is helpful.

Packaged food and unpackaged fresh and processed fruit, vegetables, nuts, spices, herbs, legumes, seeds, fish (including shellfish) and meat (pork, beef, sheep and chicken) must be labelled. The country of origin of the food must be identified, or, if the food is a mix of foods from different countries, each country of origin can be stated or a statement that the food is a mix of local and imported foods, or a mix of imported foods.

Country of origin information can also be written on a sign near the food or on labels, e.g. stickers on fruit.

Some food is exempt from country of origin labeling requirements, including food sold for immediate consumption e.g. food sold in cafes, restaurants and canteens or when a food is made and packaged on the premises it is sold, such as in a bakery.

Council's role – through our Environmental Health Officers – is primarily twofold: one is to conduct an annual inspection of the registered health and food premises across the Shire. At present there are approximately 312 registered premises which include caravan parks, hairdressers, beauty therapy, tattooists, motels, hotels, cafes, school camps, restaurants and bakeries. If a complaint is received by Council, then an additional inspection is carried out.

Secondly, Council officers will conduct random sampling of locally made produce to ensure labeling requirements are being met. This will usually pick up unintentional errors in the nutritional panel calculations or quantities of ingredients listed.

Food sampling is very topical at the moment and there has been a recent pilot project for a Food Sampling App which has been developed by MAV Technology in partnership with the Department of Health. Council's Coordinator Environmental Health participated in this project to test and assess the app – the intention of which is to produce a more efficient electronic based system when collecting food samples. The use of an iPad for daily Environmental Health Officer functions is also being tested and this, combined with the food sampling app and others is proving to be extremely efficient and time effective for the businesses and the officer involved.

Council also participates in the Hume Regional Sampling Group, which is currently focusing on gluten free products from a regional perspective. The work of this group complements that of the individual councils, all of which must carry out their responsibilities and remain compliant under Section 32 of the Food Act.

At the end of this self imposed exercise, I not only learned a great deal about food labelling and sampling, but I also discovered a new understanding and appreciation of what Council is achieving through its Environmental Health Officers who are working at the cutting edge in their field.

Well done to all.

Councillor Comment by Cr Christine Challen Cathedral Ward

Yay for Yea! The Y Water Centre is officially open. After many years in the planning and development stages, grant applications, private fund-raising efforts, enormous amounts of determination, grit and goodwill within the community and dedication from a group of people who've taken on the responsibility for its management, the building at the Wetlands, including a wetlands educational interpretive element, well stocked shop and fully accredited Visitor Information Centre (VIC), is in business.

Yayyyy!

This promises to be a great hub for tourism and a boost for business generally in Yea and the broader region. There were many happy faces and complimentary speeches, deservedly so, at the opening ceremony last Thursday. Congratulations to those who've persevered, served on Committees and volunteered their services to get this project to fruition and to run the Centre and VIC into the future. Well done too, to all the contractors and Council's Building, Project Management and Economic Development Teams for their tenacity and great work in ably fulfilling their roles.

As you'd be well aware by now, due to the eloquence of our CEO, Mayor and other Councillors in their comments, we are facing an annual funding shortfall of \$1.76 million brought about by reconstruction and expansion of assets following the 2009 fires.

One option that Council is considering among others is the possibility of the community taking greater responsibility of community buildings and infrastructure. The Y Water Discovery Centre is one example of this, where the Y Water Association is taking responsibility of the operation of the Centre.

We hope you'll take some time to visit Council's dedicated Funding Advocacy webpage at www.murrindindi.vic.gov.au/fundingadvocacy and get informed about our campaign and the options that we are considering. These pages also feature links to the email addresses for the Minister and Shadow Minister for Local Government, as well as to your local member and other candidates for the newly created seat of Eildon following the abolition and redistribution of boundaries for the Seat of Seymour.

We encourage your feedback and also to contact relevant politicians in person, by mail or email with your suggestions. You can also keep us posted on Facebook at www.facebook.com/mscfundingadvocacy. This issue affects us all and together we can achieve the very best outcomes.

At its Ordinary Meeting last Wednesday night, Council adopted its new Social Media Policy. Our Communications Team have been diligently preparing a framework and protocols so that Council and Councillors can more effectively engage with residents and ratepayers, visitors, et al. The adoption of this policy ties in with the launch of our new Facebook page that I've mentioned above which is solely dedicated to our Funding Advocacy Campaign.

While we envisage our Social Media usage and content will increase with time and experience, we ask that the community use the current Facebook for its intended purpose – to provide feedback, responses and ideas on the Funding Shortfall issue. Of course, we also ask that users do not post items that are offensive, discriminatory, insulting or slanderous. We want to have genuine two-way communications on this important topic, with the appropriate courtesies and respect shown for each other at all times.

With a state election looming in November, Murrindindi Shire residents have a significant opportunity to also voice their concerns to candidates and influence their decisions on state government funding assistance for our new and gifted assets.

Foundation announces first grant round open

The Marysville and Triangle Community Foundation (MTCF) announces the opening of its first grant program.

The Foundation advises that funds are available to provide assistance to communities affected by the 2009 bushfires in the Murrindindi Shire.

"We are pleased to open our first grant round from 10 September 2014" said the chair of the MTCF, Tony Thompson. "The Foundation's Bushfire Recovery Fund was established from funds received from the Victorian Bushfire Appeal Fund and is intended for projects that address a hardship caused by the 2009 fires in Murrindindi Shire. The foundation sees this grant round as an important first step towards achieving its vision of building a legacy for a vibrant, healthy and resilient future across the communities of Murrindindi."

Grants are available for projects that fall within at least one of the following criteria – improve community connectedness, health and wellbeing; build community capacity; deliver community events and arts programs and reconnect the community with nature.

The grant round opens on *date* and applications must be received by 5 November 2014.

Applications are submitted on line through the Foundation's website www.marysvilletrianglefoundation.org.au

Guidelines for submitting grant applications are available on the website together with a Bushfire Recovery Fund fact sheet.

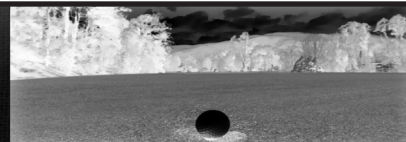

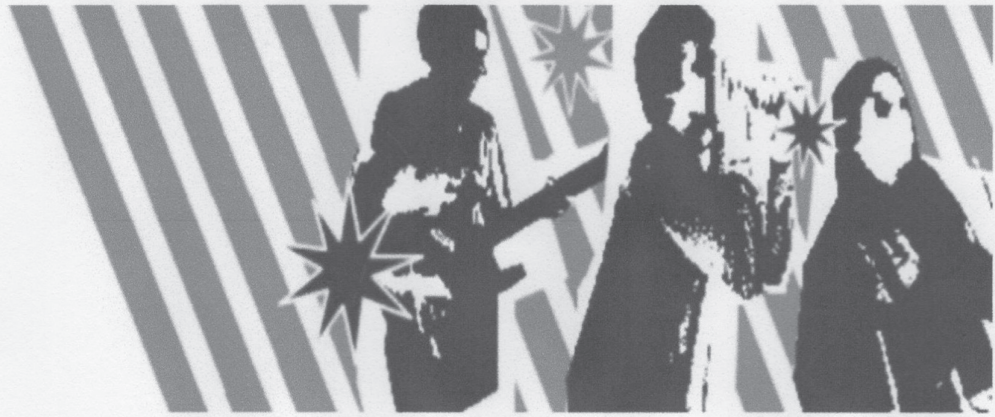

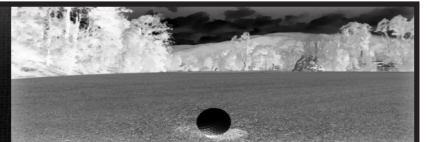
