## Mayor's Chair by Cr Margaret Rae

We have been receiving a small but steady stream of responses to our discussion paper on how to best deal with our financial challenges. I would like to thank all those who have taken the time to call or write and provide comments and suggestions.

It is clear from the responses received so far that rate rises are the least popular option and this is no surprise. This is the least popular option for Council too – which is exactly why we have tried to identify other options which may go far enough to mitigate the problem.

Some people have said that rate rises are a simplistic approach and lazy – we couldn't agree more. Some councils would have simply applied the rate rise and said that's that. This is not our approach. We are working very hard to find a different way or combination of ways to minimise the impact on the community.

On looking through some of the responses so far, the preferences are for considering the introduction of differential rating categories (option 2), handing back or selling assets which we do not have the capacity to manage (option 3), transferring full responsibility for operating and maintenance costs to committees of management (option 4) – all about equal – followed by reviewing service provisions, particularly the number and location of service centres.

Each of these will have some unavoidable impact on people in the community. Differential rating categories would enable some redistribution of burden, but has to be done within the context of what is called vertical and horizontal equity, as well as capacity to pay. This is a lengthy debate to be had. Selling assets may be possible where the asset is a saleable structure and not on crown land. This was explored extensively during the Services Review and most were identified at that time. However, it may be that others can be identified now. Returning unmanageable assets, particularly those received post 2009, may well be an option and will require further exploration and negotiation. Whether the asset would be run in the same way in the future as a consequence of such an action is an unknown.

Transferring full responsibility to committees of management and/or community groups for a whole range of community assets is something Council is already encouraging and could be possible. The communities involved, however, would need to be willing and have the capacity to undertake this responsibility. Part of the reason that Council is responsible for so much in this area has arisen from local communities' requests for assistance in respect of insurance, maintenance and recurrent costs. It would be good if community groups could start discussing whether and how they might be able to take back these responsibilities.

Council will certainly be exploring in more detail the service delivery provided from our three centres and related costs, as well as potential impact on local communities if this were to be varied. One of our biggest challenges is our geographic dispersion. We are unlike just about every shire, in that we do not have one centre of population. Our five major townships of Alexandra, Eildon, Kinglake, Marysville and Yea have populations that range from 240 to 2,200. These are small populations in relation to the whole and, in fact, we have some 42 communities altogether.

This presents us with service, communication and travel challenges, not to mention the inevitable additional costs that go along with that. There are no economies of scale. Our only way to mitigate costs is to further explore and participate in shared service delivery – increasingly the way of the future. This also will form part of our considerations going forward.

In the meantime, please keep the comments and ideas coming.

## Council committed to delivering on community's bushfire memorials

Stage three of the Murrindindi Bushfire Memorial Project development is about to commence with the Murrindindi Bushfire Memorials Working Group continuing to guide the process.

Murrindindi Shire Mayor Margaret Rae said that the Working Group, which was established in November 2009, has been advising Council about the memorial development process.

"The Working Group has been doing some important work in consulting with the community about its needs. The development of a memorial must be a community effort and the result of collaboration between all community members.

"Our focus has been on ensuring that the community ends up with memorials about which it can be proud and which capture the right tone and sentiment for the community. This is not a process which can be rushed through," said Cr Rae.

The Bushfire Memorial Project has developed a design brief and finalised site selection following community consultation.

"There was support for a memorial to be constructed in each town that suffered loss of human life, with two larger memorials to be developed on either side of the Shire, representing the two fires that struck our region on 7 February 2009.

"Other important elements highlighted were in the memorials' planned designs. There was support for simple designs which first and foremost recognised the loss of human life. Requests have also been received for secondary design elements to be incorporated which reference losses of property, pets and damage to the environment and to broader communities

"There were also requests that the story of the fires should be told through some interpretive elements, including the response from the emergency services and broader community", said Cr Rae.

The Murrindindi Bushfire Memorials Working Group is recommending that the larger memorial be located in Lions Park in Marysville and Frank Thompson Reserve in Kinglake, and that these list the names of the individuals who died in the fire in that area. Families of the deceased will have the option not to include the names of their loved ones.

While Council and the Murrindindi Bushfire Memorials Working Group want to do everything they can to ensure that the needs and wants of the community are met, the community has high expectations for the memorials and want multiple memorials constructed.

"During the last six months, discussions have been held with philanthropic organisations to ascertain their level of interest in supporting the construction of the memorials. If this funding is not available, the project will be re-scoped to ensure that it is within budget and the long term maintenance costs are minimised", said Cr Rae.

Once the final amount of funds for the project is known, designers, landscape architects and artists will be invited to provide an expression of interest to complete the design and construction stage.

"We will be calling for professionals with experience in the development of community spaces, public art and memorials as well as experience with facilitating community engagement", said Cr Rae.

Council is keen to ensure the working group continues to be representative of the community and encourages anyone interested in joining the Murrindindi Bushfire Memorials Working Group to contact Project Consultant Jenny Branton on 0417 532 344.
