COMMUNITY OPENINGS IN MARYSVILLE

The Skate Park

The Community Skate Park opening / Fun Day which was held last Thursday October 2nd, was a great community get together. Thank you to all those that attended, the youth that stayed on enjoyed the workshops and fun with the YMCA, thank you to Lake Mountain for the Jumping Castle, also thank you to The Community Foundation for supporting us on the day with the BBQ and the organized activities.

In 2009 there were a lot of people coming to our community to give support and also see what they could do to help our town rebuild. On one of these occasions the youth at the time were asked what they would like to see in the community, they replied with a SKATE PARK, so from there the funds were found to build a Skate Park in Marysville at Gallipoli Park. The youth were invited to help design the plans for their Skate Park, with several meetings and road trips.

There were many people involved, including the Lions Club, Murrindindi Shire Council and Contractors also local volunteers too many to individually thank.

So on behalf of the youth of our community we would like to say a BIG Thank you to everyone who was involved in making our Skate Park happen.

The New BBQ Canopy

The Triangle Community turned out to see the new BBQ Canopy opened and enjoyed a sausage in bread and a soft drink at the Community Opening. The funds to build the Canopy were donated by the Mansfield Community through Marks Supa IGA Mansfield Community Chest points program after the fires.

Stephen Marks one of the supermarket owners said "The Mansfield Community generously donated many points to the program which enabled Marks IGA to donate around \$32,000 for the project". He also said, "We are proud to be able to see the project finished and we are sure many people will benefit from the new covered area".

Richard Rogerson from the Community Foundation said that this type of event was ideal for funding support, and urged the Community to present applications for funding for suitable events or projects.

Murrindindi Shire Council Mayor, Cr Margaret Rae said the Canopy was a fine example of what is achievable

when Communities worked together and commended the inclusion of solar lighting, which means no ongoing power cost to Council. Nat Morandi, of the Gallipoli Park Precinct Committee of Management, thanked the contributors to the project including the suppliers and the GPPCM.

Stephen Marks unveiled the plaque (with a very complicated rope pulley system!) within the BBQ Canopy for many to see in years to come.

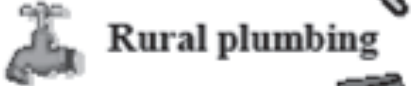

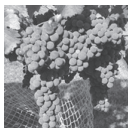

**NEW WEIGHBRIDGE AT
ALEXANDRA LANDFILL
READY FOR USE**



The new weighbridge at the Alexandra Landfill is now fully operational and already improving daily operations.

The weighbridge, installed at a cost of \$150,000 from Council's Capital Works funding, operates exclusively on solar power and will ensure fair and consistent pricing of all waste that enters the facility for disposal.

Murrindindi Shire Councillor Bernie Wagner who holds the Portfolio of Infrastructure and Waste said that the weighbridge, which commenced operation on 1 October 2014, will be a valuable addition to our waste management practices.

"All commercial vehicles that enter the landfill site are now weighed by the bridge on the way in and out so that an accurate fee for the disposal of waste is calculated ensuring fairness and consistency."

"The weighbridge also allows for more detailed data to be collected about the types of waste that enters the site. By having better knowledge of the incoming items, we have the opportunity to export more recyclable waste such as concrete and tyres. The data collected by the weighbridge reflects what is being transported back out and will help reduce the landfill levy that we pay to the EPA", said Councillor Wagner.

The weighbridge operation is simple and requires users to enter data about who they are and what they are disposing. Businesses which are regular users of the landfill can apply for a weighbridge account which will store their identification data making their access even more streamlined. Access to the bridge is arranged by appointment.

COUNCILLOR COMMENT

Crowd Funding – creating the businesses of the future:

Councillors devote a lot of time in considering how the critical mass of the Murrindindi Shire can be expanded. It has been expressed before but ideally we'd like to see another 2,000 rateable properties spread throughout our towns and villages. And new businesses would also be welcomed given their capacity to employ local people and add to our community strengths and skills base. Achieving these targets would give our Shire increased rate revenue and more resources to meet the challenges of the future.

I recently enjoyed a very quick trip to the UK and France to attend the University graduation of my son and daughter in law. With a few hours waiting in an airport terminal I caught up on some business reading. I came across two interesting developments that are helping to build new business opportunities in Europe.

One is the rapid worldwide adoption of CrowdCube an online equity capital raising platform where relatively small amounts of capital can be sought from multiple investors for start-up, new or rapid growth businesses or companies. There is also an Australian equivalent known as Pozible as a crowd funding source. These vehicles are used by entrepreneurs that typically offer a new product, a computer application or software, or some type of new business thinking for investment. For instance I read the short history of a UK business called Pip & Nut where a young entrepreneur, Pippa Murray, is working to create a new business based on a range of nut-based natural, sugar free, protein rich food products. Her new business was seeking to raise one hundred thousand pounds sterling in return for a 19% share in the business. The offer must have appealed since a total of 81 investors quickly subscribed over one hundred and twenty thousand pounds in new share capital and the new nut butter business is under way.

Many of the small investors who contribute start up capital to businesses like this one are obviously hoping to tap into a these new trends in sourcing start-up capital by crowd funding and facilitating the movement by creative and skilled people to rural and regional areas may in time assist Murrindindi Shire to increase our critical mass.

You can see some of the innovative new ideas where new business funding is being sought at the website www.crowdcube.com or www.pozible.com.

If any resident has a new business idea, Council offers quite extensive support through our Economic Development Department based in Alexandra. As always a phone call to Council is the quickest way to set something in train.

HOLLY ERADICATION PROGRAM - NARBETHONG

**TRAINING DAY and WORKING BEE:
10.00 a.m. Thursday 16th OCT. 2014**

As part of the Holly eradication program at Narbethong, a training day and working bee will be held at the property of Mr Bruce Bayley, 280 Maroondah Highway, Narbethong (adjacent to the Black Spur Roadhouse) at 10.00 a.m. on Thursday the 16th of October, 2014.

Information will be provided on the techniques used in holly eradication, including treatment methods, use of equipment and herbicide.

Holly is officially listed as an Environmental Weed. It is a garden plant which has become well established in bushland at Narbethong and Marysville. It is spread by birds eating ripe berries and dispersing seeds. Once established it displaces native vegetation.

The program is ongoing and supported by the Victorian State Government's Communities For Nature grant. This recent extension is a joint partnership between DEPI Marysville, Upper Goulburn Landcare Network, Friends of The Marysville Walks Inc. and local landholders.

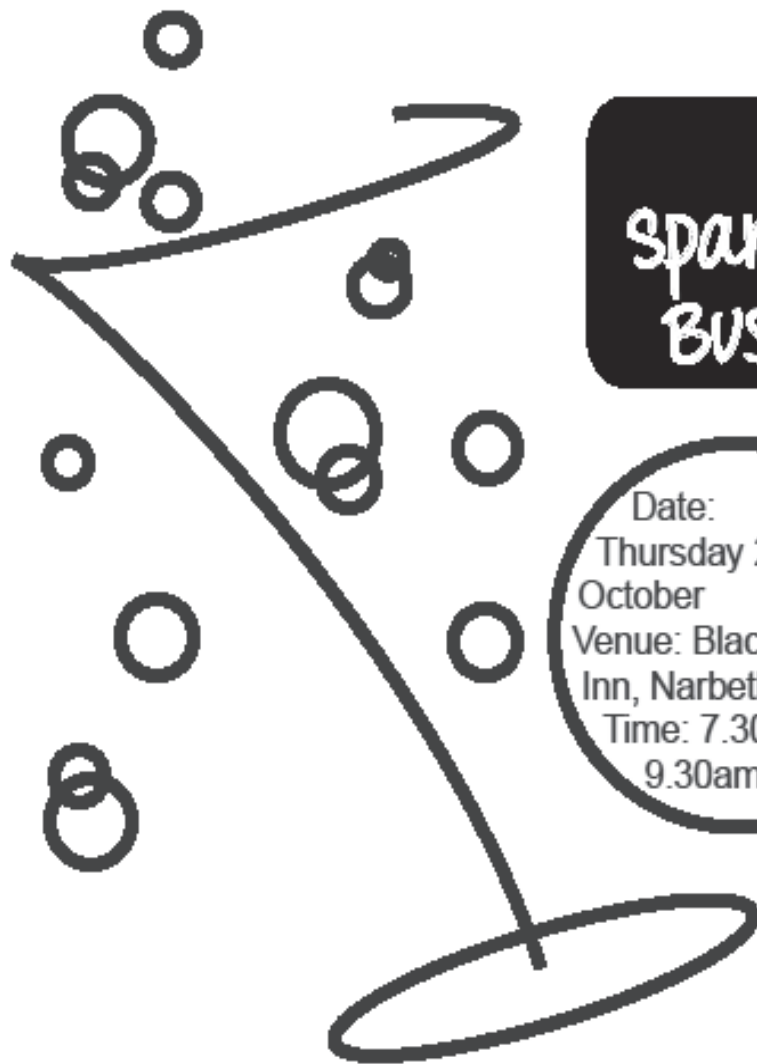
