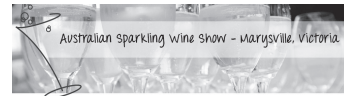

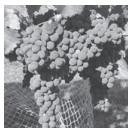

# MAYORS CHAIR COUNCILLOR MARGARET RAE

I have had several conversations with residents lately regarding rates - not, however, in the context of options and financial challenges, but about the effect of the revaluation process on their properties. Having spent some time explaining this to them, I thought I would revisit this in today's column as I feel there may be others for whom the process is not clear. Revaluations nowadays are carried out every two years and this is a process required by State Government, although Councils are responsible for ensuring it happens. Independent Valuers are contracted to carry out the valuations which are based on a range of data including market prices by area over the past two years and which reflect the Capital Improved Value (CIV) of the properties in that area. The Shire is not treated as one entity, as it were, but separate analysis is carried out in different areas so that the differences between, for example, Flowerdale and Eildon, are properly reflected.

This revaluation process is carried out concurrent with, but separate from, Council developing its budget for the coming year. Council prepares its budget based on what is required to deliver an appropriate level of service across the 100+ services provided. It is worth noting that rates contribute approximately 50% of the revenue required, with user fees and charges and State and Federal Grants - some recurrent and some competitive - making up the rest. Careful scrutiny and analysis of every item in the budget takes place so that best value can be obtained from the limited resources at our disposal.

The actual amount to be recovered from rates is very much controlled by our approach over the past few years to cap any increase at 6%. While this is sometimes compared with CPI, it should be remembered that councils do not shop in supermarkets for milk, bread and the like, but have to buy concrete, fuel, road making materials, equipment, etc., so the annual increase experienced by us is inevitably higher. In addition, one third of the annual 6% increase is put into reserves to contribute to the upkeep of our (and your) assets.

Once the valuers have completed the revaluation process, the CIV figures are provided to Council so that the rates for each individual property can be calculated. Irrespective of whether valuations have gone up in given areas, this will not deliver more money to Council as the amount to be raised by rates has already been determined in the budget. The process for Council is to calculate how much each property will contribute to that total amount.

Individual properties will experience that differently and price fluctuations in one area will affect the amount of rates in another. To use Eildon as an example, when the water level is low in the lake and property prices fall, the amount of rates available becomes less - consequently more needs to come from other areas. A simple analogy is to think of the budget as a pie and areas across the Shire as slices of that pie. If one slice becomes smaller, then others need to become bigger because the pie remains the same size.

Having an increased number of rateable properties in the Shire would also assist in this as the calculation for the rate revenue would be spread across more properties. Growing our rate base would therefore help everybody.

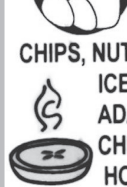

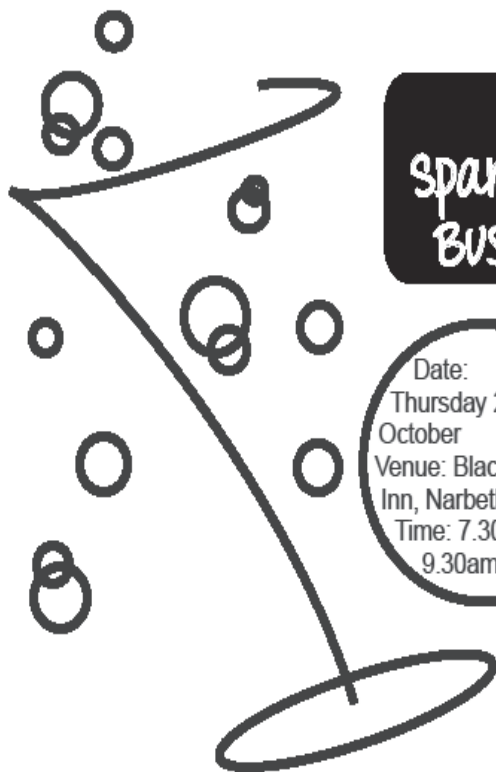

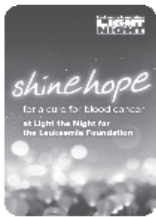

## FUNDING ADVOCACY—WHERE TO FROM HERE

In recent weeks Murrindindi Shire Council has been asking for feedback from the community on the options it is considering to address the funding shortfall which arose from the gifting of new and expanded assets by the State Government after the 2009 fires.

Assistance has been sought from the Victorian Government to help address this shortfall but, in the absence of a positive response, Council is now considering options which would either generate more revenue or cut Council's costs.

From the opening of the period for comment at the end of August 2014, until 7 October 2014 when the formal period for comment finished, Council received around 150 responses from members of the community. Council received feedback in the form of emails, letters, phone calls, feedback through an online form, comments on Council's Funding Advocacy Facebook page and through letters to the media.

Mayor Margaret Rae said the community's participation and input had been invaluable.

"On behalf of Council, I would like to extend my thanks to those members of the community who provided feedback on the options Council is currently considering. The community's views are extremely important and will certainly have a bearing on which option or options Council will now focus on to address the funding shortfall." Cr Rae added that Councillors are currently considering the options and this process would continue during November. She said that while the formal period for responses was now closed, any additional feedback received before a decision was made would be seen and considered by Council.

"We are keen to encourage the community to get in touch with Councillors or with Council directly to pass on any views they might have on the options under consideration. More information is available on Council's website at [www.murrindindi.vic.gov.au/fundingadvocacy](http://www.murrindindi.vic.gov.au/fundingadvocacy) for those interested in getting feedback to us".

Council expects to provide an update to the community in relation to its decision in late November 2014.

## COUNCIL TARGETS ELM LEAF BEETLE

Murrindindi Shire Council has commenced its seasonal fight to protect approximately 170 Elm trees growing throughout its parks, reserves and avenues from the invasive Elm Leaf Beetle.

Council's Elm Leaf Beetle Management Program works to protect the significant Elms, and although it's almost impossible to eradicate the Elm Leaf Beetle entirely, every effort is made to monitor and control the beetle, in a cost effective manner.

Council's Natural Environment and Climate Change Portfolio holder Councillor John Kennedy said that the Elm Leaf Beetle can cause complete defoliation of a tree within three months if not treated.

"The Elm Leaf Beetle spends the cooler months in sheltered places; however as Elm trees come into leaf during October and November the beetle emerges and feeds on the new growth. It is when they lay their eggs that the real damage occurs. The adult beetles chew holes through the leaves but the larvae eat everything except the leaf veins which destroys the trees ability to achieve photosynthesis and produce reserves of energy that are necessary for tree growth and disease resistance", said Cr Kennedy.

The Elm Leaf Beetle has a yellowish to olive green colour with a black stripe along each side of the back, and grow to about 6mm long. Native to Europe they were accidentally introduced into Australia in the late 1980s and are considered serious pests.



## Hume Joint Kerbside Tender
