## OPEN GARDENS FEATURED IN NARBETHONG AND BUXTON

This year Alexandra & District's Open Gardens Weekend celebrates 24 years of offering superb town and country garden viewing. The finishing touches are now underway in the eleven lovely gardens open to visitors on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> & Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> October. With the optimism that accompanies warmer spring weather, garden owners have worked hard preparing their properties for visitors to enjoy a wonderful weekend when the local district is looking superb. Among the eleven gardens open this year, four are located in Alexandra township, one at Thornton and Eildon, one at Acheron & Taggerty and three in Buxton and Narbethong areas. In Buxton Tracey Boyce and Anthony Slot's home and garden commenced in 2007. Seven years later and many hours of work have resulted in a very well organised, productive and ornamental garden with spectacular views. Tracey and Anthony understand the challenges of growing plants in a westerly aspect with long hot dry summers. Hardy plants including olive trees, an espaliered crab apple and some tough perennials have been successful additions. Taking advantage of a more sheltered area, they have established some delicate species along with natives, deciduous trees and shrubs. A large veggie patch is protected from severe frosts by Teucrium and Luma hedges. Food plants are highly valued here and the owners have created a wonderful setting despite limited time available in their busy lives. There are some good gardening ideas at this venue for home gardeners. Visitors will be greeted warmly and can enjoy morning and afternoon teas. Look out for chook-

friendly, hardy plants for sale. Continuing on to the Narbethong district "Tarnpirr Farm" is opening its gates to the public for the first time in 25 years. Synonymous with horse breeding for more than three decades, this property showcases a beautiful English garden. New owners Bridget McIntyre and Anthony McDonald feel fortunate that despite damage to the property in the 2009 fires, the main elements of the garden remained intact and they continue to work on its development. As well as magnificent old English trees, visitors can expect to see established conifer gardens, azaleas, rhododendrons, maples and roses. The 1900s English style manor is unique in appearance, emanating old world charm and resting comfortably in this setting. There is much to appreciate and enjoy as visitors wander through this lovely property.

Included for the first time in the Open Gardens Weekend, "White Lotus Day Spa and Retreat" is set amidst the surrounding mountain ash forest of the Yarra Ranges. Located at the original old Post Office of Narbethong, this small and developing garden is a mixture of old and new. It is easy to envisage Post Mistresses long ago planting the hydrangeas that today still nestle close to the cottage. The Buddha Garden captures your attention lending an oriental touch to the area at the back and an intriguing meditation tepee beckons. Lawn areas lead to a rotunda set in a fern glade and mulched paths wander into shady copses. Box hedges, citrus trees, berry hedges, olive trees, herbs and vegies combine to create layers of green foliage that comple-

ment the buildings. Owners Gary Solomon and Di Ware have worked tirelessly to develop their setting and business. This carefully maintained property features a restrained palette of plants and colour and as new plantings mature, they will add to the natural beauty of this setting. Visitors to any of the open gardens have a chance to win an exquisite Accommodation Spa Package at "White Lotus". Plan your visit to this welcoming venue as Gary will be performing here live on both Saturday and Sunday at 11am and 3pm.

With the "Alexandra Festival of Flowers" at St John's Church and "Run for the Roses" Races at Alexandra also on this weekend, there is an abundance of experiences in the district. 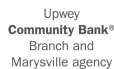

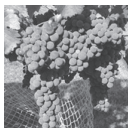

# MAYOR'S CHAIR

## COUNCILLOR MARGARET RAE

The term 'sustainability' is frequently heard these days and it seems to apply to everything from what we eat, to how we live, to our environment, and to just about everything else as well. This often makes it seem just another buzzword which appears increasingly meaningless. Because of that very reason, it is useful to define what it is that is meant by sustainability.

The most commonly used and recognised meaning is what is called the Brundtland definition (WECD, 1987) which says that "*Sustainable development is development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.*"

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has its own version which states that "*Sustainability creates and maintains the conditions under which humans and nature can exist in productive harmony, that permit fulfilling the social, economic and other requirements of present and future generations.*"

And then there is the Victorian Auditor General Office (VAGO) definition which says that "*Organisational sustainability means that councils have the capacity to function efficiently, effectively and economically to meet the current and future needs of their communities to an acceptable standard.*"

Whichever you prefer - or, in fact, find you are required to relate to - nevertheless they all provide a framework for thinking about the matters in hand and for accountable decision making whether in the areas of financial planning, service delivery or environmental issues.

I was recently at a forum (yes, another one!) which focused on sustainability in rural councils conducted by Rural Councils Victoria, one of the many peak bodies with which we engage on a regular basis. The purpose of the forum was to identify the best ways in which RCV can work with and support rural councils in meeting the needs of their communities whilst managing the range of pressures that affect them all. What was refreshing about the approach of this particular session was that as much time was spent on the opportunities that present themselves as was acknowledging the challenges that exist.

We are often criticised for focusing disproportionately on the negatives and on 'doom and gloom'. Overall I would disagree with this but I do acknowledge that we often do not present opportunities, benefits and achievements in sufficient balance, and rarely do we sing our own praises. Somehow this is left for others to express – which is pretty hard for anyone to do until they know – and letting you know about the things we do well should be part of our regular communication and not seen as just blowing our own trumpet.

There are many ways in which opportunities present themselves and one which is increasingly being used is that of collaboration between councils. A tangible example will shortly be clearly demonstrated in our shire as we move towards the installation of energy efficient light globes. The *Watts Working Better Program* will see us collaborating with eight other councils to retrofit street lighting to provide significant ongoing savings in electricity costs. Starting in mid November, Mercury Vapour residential street lights will be replaced with T5 lights. The estimate is that Council will save over \$500,000 in electricity costs over the next 20 years. In addition, there will be significant reductions in greenhouse emissions that, collectively across the nine councils, will be around 93,000 tonnes – equivalent to taking 21,000 cars off the roads.

How about that for good news!

# COUNCILLOR COMMENT CR CHRISTINE CHALLEN

Between 1914 and 1918, Australian men and women volunteered their service in the First World War. Between 2014 and 2018, Australians will honour their commitment and sacrifice and commemorate the ANZAC Centenary.

Our Goulburn River Valley Tourism region has many significant connections and sites of interest with Australian military history and it was appropriate at their inaugural 'Heart of Victoria' dinner in Kilmore recently, that the former Premier of Victoria and current Chair of the Victorian Government's ANZAC Centenary Committee, Hon Ted Baillieu, spoke about how Victorians in particular, (at the time we went to war, Melbourne was Australia's National Capital), can link in with our ANZAC heritage and ensure its iconic legacy is enshrined for future generations.

Connections and threads was the message reinforced in his address. What are the stories of our grandparents and relatives from this time? Are there diaries, photos or medals lying around at home? Are there street memorials, trees planted, plaques or names mentioned on local honour boards in our halls and schools? How are **we** connected with those people and places and what unlikely, coincidental and interesting threads come to light when we start to dig into their stories that then tie in to our personal histories, and to others?

My father's dad, William Townsend of Warracknabeal, signed up in 1917 to serve in the Australian Imperial Force. When I was shown the list of soldiers who boarded the first ship, HMAT Orvieto, leaving Australia from the Port of Melbourne in November 2014, I came across the name Harold Townsend. Believing he must be related, I have embarked on a search which will put me in touch with people I haven't spoken to in years and perhaps relatives I didn't even know existed. I'm excited about the possibilities of making these connections and where they may lead.

In 1919, Australian children, 16 years and under were given a silver coated medallion as a symbolic reminder of Australians who'd served in the First World War. If anyone in our Shire has one of these medallions I'd love to hear about your ANZAC connection and what you know of the recipient of this Peace Medal.

The records of World War 1 servicemen and women are easily accessed from the National Archives at [www.naa.gov.au/collection/explore/defence/service-records](http://www.naa.gov.au/collection/explore/defence/service-records).

If you're interested in exploring these records but are unable to use the internet, then ask a young person to help you – the younger, the better! Not only are their computer skills superior, it's also a valuable opportunity to involve children in finding out about history and their heritage.

The Victorian website for the ANZAC Centenary is [www.anzaccentenary.vic.gov.au](http://www.anzaccentenary.vic.gov.au). Goulburn River Valley Tourism is a good resource for finding locations of historic military interest within our region ([www.goulburnrivervalley.com.au](http://www.goulburnrivervalley.com.au)) and our local RSL's have access to useful information, including details for upcoming Remembrance Day services on 11 November. Lest we forget.

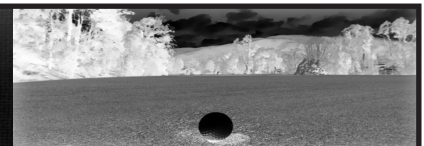
