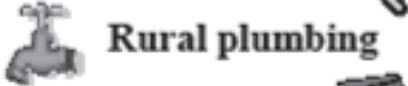

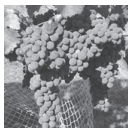

MAYOR'S CHAIR

COUNCILLOR MARGARET RAE

The October meeting of Council received and endorsed the Annual Report for 2013-2014. This report provides a detailed coverage of the activities of Council over the last twelve months and gives the opportunity to reflect on the year just passed. It is often too easy to feel that not enough is being achieved, that it takes too long to get things done or, to reflect some opinions, that nothing is being done at all.

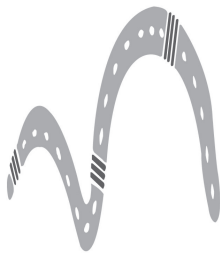
This is in fact far from the truth as the full report will attest. Now it is true that not all of you will want to plough through all the detail but the report does contain a nice feature called "Fast Facts". This appears in relation to each of the areas of focus and gives a snapshot of the range of services provided and of the level of demand experienced.

These can be found on page 24 for 'Our Community', on page 33 for 'Our Environment', on page 44 for 'Our Economy' and on page 51 for 'Our Council'. Quick examples are: 9109 hours of home care and 1961 hours of personal care performed; 7559 meals delivered by Meals on Wheels; 305 building permits were processed with 97% delivered within 30 days; 212 food and health premises registered; 207 mobile food permits issued; the Shire received 452,000 day trip visits worth around \$40 million dollars to the region; 81 events progressed through the events coordination process; 21 sales were held at the Yea Saleyards handing almost 40,000 cattle, providing a record operating income. In addition, there were nine new policies adopted during the year; thirteen policies were reviewed; seven strategies were adopted and five significant internal audits were conducted.

There is much more that was achieved during the year - from caring for our parks and gardens and all our open spaces to handling all of your enquiries at the front desks of each of our service centres, to working with complex planning issues, whether at the individual's level or interpreting and applying changes emanating from the State Government. All of these go towards providing the framework that enables strong and reliable performance framework reporting, legislative compliance, accountability and measureable outcomes. This is a particularly appropriate time to stop and reflect as this marks the midterm of Councillors' elected term of office. It also highlights what still needs to be done and helps us to set objectives for the next two years.

So, whilst progress may seem to be slow at times, the best improvements are achieved through incremental steps - the most important parts of a new house, for example, are the foundations, the plumbing and the electrical works, most of which become fairly invisible as all the décor appears. Nevertheless, if the time and effort isn't put into the early stages, it can show in the final result.

The journey has a way to go but we are travelling in the right direction. I look forward to sharing it with you.

NEW VACUUM MAT TECHNOLOGY FOR OUR AMBULANCES

At a training session at the Alexandra Ambulance Station recently, newly qualified Ambulance Community Officers were instructed in the use of the new vacuum mats by Team Leader Andrew Woollard. The mats were purchased with funds provided by the Alexandra District Ambulance Support auxiliary.

The vacuum mat is an invaluable piece of equipment when it comes to transporting an injured patient. The mats effectively immobilise the patient and enable them to be lifted safely without the risk of causing further injury. The mats cost \$1400 each so the provision of the funds by ADAS is vital to enable all local ambulances to carry them.

The vacuum mats are extremely useful all year round and can be used to transport a patient from a boating accident on Lake Eildon, an injured bike rider or bushwalker, or a snow skier who has had a mishap in winter. ADAS will also provide funds for vacuum splints which work on the same principle but are used to immobilise limbs to provide support for the injury while the patient is being transported to hospital for treatment.
