A WILD WOMAN'S WILD WOMEN

The final offering of the year from Just Shows to Go Cafe Culture Series program is yet another fine piece of entertainment you will not want to miss - *The Kelly Auty Wild Women Show*.

Kelly's earliest memories are of growing up in the far north on the Ord River Research Station in the Kimberley Ranges. She remembers singing around a campfire, walking in the red dirt under a huge starlit sky and music; music always flowing from the stereo speakers in her home or the tape-player of the ute. From an early age her imagination was captured by the honesty of roots music, the pain of the Blues, rawness of Rock, emotionality of Country, lyrical Folk melodies, the vibrant insistence of R&B, Gypsy fire and Gospel soul. Drawing on all these influences and reforging them in the fires of her own creative spirit, Kelly has honed her vocal performance style into a graceful, passionate and unforgettable roller-coaster ride.

The Wild Women Show is an impeccably researched cascade through your musical memories, transporting you back in time. It opens windows onto the lives, music and fashion times of some of the greatest female singers of the 20th century. It is rich with songs and stories in a powerful and lively costumed show.

Wild Women features the music of Besie Smith, Billie Holiday, Josephine Baker, Edith Piaf, Etta James, Ella Fitzgerald, Peggy Lee, Patsy Cline, Aretha Franklin, Tina Turner and Janis Joplin. These women were writers, musicians, painters, wives, mothers and activists who left a brilliant legacy. The show follows their footsteps and celebrates their lives.

This is not a show of covers but new interpretations of these great singers' classic songs. Kelly has a fine ear for

nuance and an expressive compelling voice. The present band grew from the decade long collaboration between singer Kelly Auty and pianist Boris Conley, two powerful performers in Melbourne's blues, jazz, gospel and rock scenes. Both Kelly and Boris have performed at countless festivals and gigs, from the Broadford Rock Concert to the Hilton Green Room. Kelly performs with Boris Conley, Max McIntosh on Bass and Nick Carrafa playing drums. Kelly has sung supports for Janis Ian, The Drifters, Jose Feliciano and The Platters. Peter has played with Lil Fi and supported Bert Jansch on tour, while Nick has played with Threes Company and the Urban Nomads. All together an eclectic band with vast experience and a powerful repertoire, their sets will be electrifying.

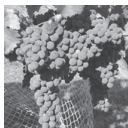

MAYOR'S CHAIR

COUNCILLOR MARGARET RAE

As we continue working on the budget it is interesting to see the issues that come up for debate and discussion. Recently Councillors spent several hours on a Saturday setting the framework for decision making, based on a variety of criteria and utilising much information including multiple spreadsheets of data together with multiple comments from the community.

For those of you who might have felt unsure about whether your comments would be heard, I can assure you that every Councillor has a copy of every response. These have been collated in relation to the options outlined and clearly the weight of opinion is in favour of reducing expenditure on and/or ownership of assets.

We don't disagree with this at all – but we do need to come up with a model of how to identify what costs can be removed or reduced, what costs might be transferred appropriately to community groups, and how such community groups might be identified and assessed as able to take on additional responsibilities. This is where some interesting discussion has arisen around the principles of equity and fairness. These were clearly seen as different so I thought I would share this discussion with you and invite your comments.

The dictionary definition of *Equity* is 'a situation in which everyone is treated fairly and equally'. The dictionary definition of *Fairness* is 'treating people equally in a way that is right or reasonable'.

Now the words *Fair* and *Equal* appear in both definitions, but the basis for our discussion hinged around the more current interpretation of equity as being numerically based versus an interpretation of fairness more as a social measurement of what is appropriate in the circumstances. Now, neither of these is right or wrong – nor is one necessarily better than the other. However, decisions made on the basis of equity will tend to be mathematical, to be driven by equality of numbers and proportions, and be objective in nature. Decisions made on the fairness principle will take into account a range of social as well as numerical issues and will inevitably have a subjective component. Outcomes from the latter approach will potentially look quite different from the former and could lead to questions around why contributions for what might look like very similar responsibilities could well be different for different groups.

So, should decisions be based on equality of numbers or should they be based on individual circumstances and capacity? What do you think?

This week's good news: \$392,000 will be spent to implement the Eildon town square and streetscape project - \$362,000 in grants and \$30,000 from Council. This is great for the Eildon community which has been waiting patiently for this long awaited rejuvenation; it is also great for all of us as we look forward to increased visitation coming through our Shire to experience Eildon and all it has to offer.

COUNCILLOR COMMENT

CR JOHN WALSH, KORIELLA WARD

There's been a lot in the news and on talk back radio about the way in which some private Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) have been ripping off the training subsidy schemes to the detriment of students, various industries and RTOs doing the right thing. Industries are suffering because graduates haven't been properly trained and students are unwittingly wasting their limited rights to subsidized training on shonky fly-by-night schemes. Government is spending a lot of time monitoring the scheme, investigating breaches and prosecuting miscreants.

We are in desperate need for post secondary training opportunities within Murrindindi Shire. We need options for our youth to gain skills and training that lead to successful jobs within our local area if the flow of young people out of the Shire is to be reduced. We need local opportunities for people to gain expanded or new skills as workplace requirements change or to meet their desires to improve themselves.

For all subsidized courses there should be a clear need for the skills, with jobs awaiting those who complete training to a level that industry wants. In that way, the taxes invested in training can be returned through increased productivity and economic activity. To achieve that outcome, industry must be involved in setting the standards to be achieved, stating the numbers required to be trained and make a commitment to support on-the-job training and to employ graduates.

Before its demise, the Murrindindi Training Institute (MTI) governance structure provided a self-monitoring loop. Courses would only be undertaken if recommended by a relevant industry group, represented on the MTI Board and which could demonstrate a clear shortage of the required skills and with guaranteed employment and support for students to gain practical experience.

The Continuing Education and Arts Centre of Alexandra (CEACA) has picked up the reins from MTI and I thank them for it. Developing a strong capability in post secondary training is also an opportunity to increase our resilience and improve our social fabric with not just economic spin offs but providing advantages in support for sporting clubs, the arts and volunteerism. Welcoming students from outside the Shire expands our own experiences as well as showing off our beautiful area.

I sincerely hope that a long term view can be taken and we have the chance to resurrect a full MTI standard training capability in Outdoor Education, Aged Care, Houseboat Building and Hospitality to name just a few.

MARYSVILLE POLICE REPORT

Property at 4 Murrindindi Street, Taggerty, is not permanently lived on, the previous dwelling having burned in 2009 bushfire. Presently, there is shedding and two caravans located at this property. There is no fencing

or gate presently at the property. The owner visits the property at various times with no particular pattern.

Two Dunnys-R-Us portables are located near one of the caravans. One of these portables is a shower unit which has its own water heating unit attached to it and a near-by water pump. These units are fairly obscured from outside the property by bushes.

Between about 1200 hrs on 20/10/14 and 1630 hrs on 07/11/14, unknown offender(s) have entered the property and removed the water heater and pump from the shower unit. An 8.5kg gas bottle was also removed. The items were removed with tools as there appears to be no damage to the fittings. Total value of stolen items approx. \$1,000.

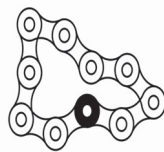

FARMERS & STOCK SUFFER AS DOGS ROAM

Murrindindi Shire Council Local Law Officers are receiving an increased number of reports about dog attacks on stock, particularly in and around the Kinglake area. Acting Chief Executive Officer Michael Chesworth said that the reports are concerning and that both stock and dog owners need to be vigilant. "Wandering dogs are causing a big problem for stock owners with most attacks taking place during the night. A recent attack involved the killing of around 30 sheep on one property.

"We suspect that these dogs have owners. It is paramount that owners take care to ensure their dogs are confined to their own properties at all times. Failing to do this not only creates the potential for your animal to become involved in an attack on neighbouring livestock, it is also a breach of the *Domestic Animals Act 1994* and can result in large fines. "Owners will be held liable for all expenses incurred as a result of the attack", said Mr. Chesworth. Landowners are advised of their rights if they report an attack to Council. Anyone with information about an attack on stock or wandering dogs should contact Council's Local Law Unit on (03) 5772 0333.

FIRE RESTRICTIONS NOW IN FORCE

Murrindindi Shire Council advises that the CFA Declared Fire Danger Period will come into effect on 24 November 2014. No burning off permits will be issued by Council after this time.

During the Fire Danger Period, burning off in the open air, other than for cooking purposes or warmth/comfort is prohibited. During a day of Total Fire Ban no fires can be lit.

A zero tolerance approach is taken to the deliberate or reckless lighting of fires during the Declared Fire Danger Period and serious fines apply for breaches of these regulations.

Council and CFA local brigades are working together to prepare for the upcoming fire season. A number of Fire Ready Victoria meetings will occur across the Murrindindi Shire in the coming months. Please check the CFA website for further details at www.cfa.vic.gov.au.
