The store was a huge hit, selling items donated. The store raised over \$1000 in the two days of operation, which is a fantastic effort!

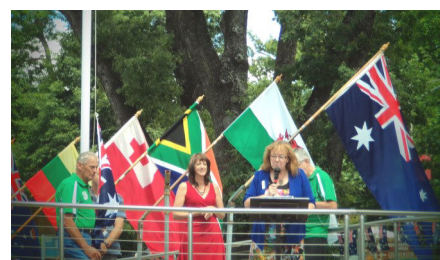

Mayor's Chair - Cr Margaret Rae

Well, the outcome of the Mayors Leadership Conference was that it was well worthwhile – taking stock of skills and opportunities, particularly in the face of new challenges, and taking on board the learnings from others' experiences, is a valuable exercise and, I hope, helps to set us up for the coming year.

The new Minister for Local Government, the Hon Natalie Hutchins, appeared briefly to speak at the conference about the new Government's priorities in general terms. We have extended an invitation to her to meet with us so that, as a new Government and a new Minister, they can be updated about our achievements, challenges and plans for the future. Hopefully, that will occur shortly.

Certainly as we move into the new year, we are focused on our planning for the future, particularly in the context of the budget. Once again, thank you to all of you who participated in providing valuable feedback during our funding advocacy campaign. This has been taken on board and we are now in the process of constructing the framework and carrying out the calculations to demonstrate the effect of applying the various options available to us. This is clearly being done in the context of the as yet unframed policies of the new Government and the unknown outcomes of this. We may well find that we need to prosecute our case vigorously in the following year and the detailed analysis and planning under way will stand us in good stead if and when that becomes necessary.

However, while we must remain mindful of this, we will continue to construct what we believe is a viable and sustainable plan for our future as a Shire. As we are all acutely aware, rebuilding over the past six years has progressed slowly with certificates of occupancy issued for only 43.5% of those properties which were lost. Similarly, our rate base, while it continues to grow, does so very slowly. Mechanisms are being put into place to assist this, such as the current Yea Structure Plan and the planned Eildon Structure Plan – but these initiatives take time to achieve results. Therefore we need to be patient and realistic – and to develop our Strategic Resource Plan for the next ten years with that clearly in focus.

Part of that will include revisiting our Rating Strategy which, although an integral part of the budget process, needs to be dealt with as a separate item. This will be considered by Council shortly as a draft strategy which will go on exhibition for comment and input. We believe this is a case of 'no surprises' as comments and discussions from last year have informed the process and we intend to present a logical and rational Rating Strategy to take us forward.

Our annual budget will be formulated on the basis of these underlying principles and policies.

All these key requirements for the Annual Budget, the Capital Works Plan, the Strategic Resource Plan, the Rating Strategy and the annual review of the Council Plan are being worked on simultaneously at the present time so that all appropriate consultations, exhibitions and timelines can be met.

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Councillor Comment Cr John Kennedy

Attracting Melbourne's apartment dwellers

If you take a look at the city skyline including Southbank and Docklands it quickly becomes apparent that apartment living in high-rise towers is a new social phenomenon. In fact a new building proposed in Southbank envisages being Melbourne's tallest building at 80 or so floors with 1,100 new apartments.

Property reports indicate that up to eighty more high-rise residential apartment towers are proposed for the city and a number of the inner fringe suburbs. So what does this mean for Murrindindi Shire?

Well I believe it means there will be lots of affluent city apartment-dwellers looking for escapes, especially as many of the apartments are getting smaller in size. Many years ago I lived for twelve months in Toronto Canada in a very compact downtown city apartment, in fact it was a comfortable hotel room of very small size.

While I worked during the week, I planned my weekend activities to get out into the Ontario countryside, the scenic delights, the many small villages and other easily accessible rural attractions as quickly as possible. As soon as Friday afternoon came around I was ready to get on the road, with a clear plan to return back straight to my office on Monday morning. I think this will be an experience sought and a demand created by Melbourne's substantial dwellers in small apartments. I think it will probably mean more demand for our accommodation choices and for a food and wine and culture experience. Even for a dose of fresh air with a Great Victorian Rail Trail experience, or a walk on one of our trails or in a national park will be other options.

There will also be a population of people wanting a permanent getaway in the country and to retain a small 'bolthole' in the city just for living during the working week. I was reflecting on this at the opening of the highly successful Yea Arts Carnivale and I think experiencing the events which Murrindindi Shire already offers will be an increased part of the out of town experiences sought.

Although most of our Shire offers easy access from the city, we will be in competition with the other getaway destinations – the Mornington Peninsula, the Great Ocean Road and Surf Coast and even the historic regional towns of central Victoria. We need to be aware of this social change of increased numbers of relatively affluent city dwellers living in small compact spaces.

The challenge for our local businesses, our venue operators and our event organisers will be to present a range of options, events and choices that will be attractive enough to attract the inner city population to Murrindindi Shire as visitors in the years ahead.
