Dick Smith does it again!

It's the house that Dick built

Behind a nondescript suburban house in Thomastown, a northern Melbourne suburb, is a small bungalow where a very special girl, now lives.

This particular story started back in early 2014 when the Victorian Department of Human Services (DHS) made a direct plea to Dick Smith to perhaps fund a small "granny flat" (but purpose-built) for the little girl Chevie. Disability support day placement wasn't working out and her parents and siblings were finding it increasingly difficult to care for her and still be able to carry on a normal life.

Chevie has Sturge-Weber syndrome associated with intellectual disability. This can often present with behaviours

similar to autism. She also experiences extreme anxiety.

Dick Smith immediately agreed to fund the project as proposed by DHS at a cost of \$77,000, however, he asked that funding be channelled through the Australian Lions Foundation. This is where Lions came in, ALF contacted a neighbouring Lions Club and the club immediately agreed to manage the project for ALF.

This story is in the current "Lion Magazine", a national publication.

However, Dick Smith is well-known to Lions, as in 2013, he announced at our National Convention that he was donating \$1 million to the Australian Lions Foundation to help people in need.

Dick said, "*Pip and I consider this donation to be on behalf of*

the many tens of thousands of hours that are put in by Lions Club members right around Australia and, indeed, the work every year. We respect the work that Lions do and know that this donation will go to those most in need".

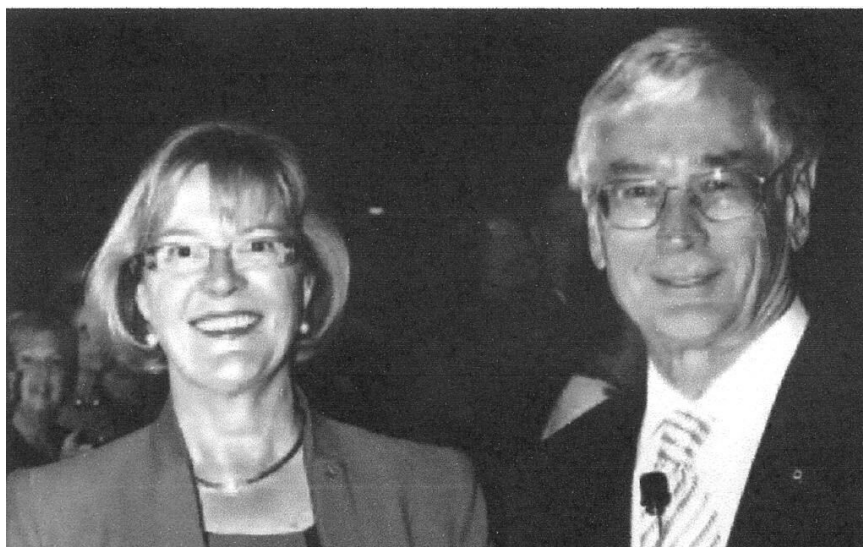
The funds will be used to support the Australian Lions Foundation Compassionate Grants Program which helps everyday Australians in crisis. Funding urgent medical treatment, critical support for people with a disability and crisis services of all descriptions", he added.

The Australian Lions Foundation provided \$10,000 within days of February 7th, 2009 to the Lions Club of Marysville & District - a typically prompt response to a call for help.

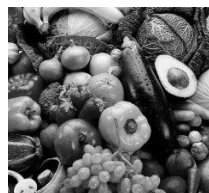

MARYSVILLE GOLF REPORT

B Grade was won by Marysville member Lois Hardham (36) with 32 points and Jody Doran (25) a visitor, but soon to be Marysville member, was the runner up with 31 points.

The nearest the pins were won by Gail Leigh, Dean Malley, Martin Lowe and Adam Littlejohn.

Mayor's Chair Cr Margaret Rae

At our last Council meeting the draft Rating Strategy was adopted for exhibition and many of you will have noticed the advice about this being available for comment.

I often think that the formal language we in local government sometimes need to use doesn't always lend itself comfortably to everyday speech - and that the word 'Strategy' can sound somewhat disconnected from everyday life. So the word I prefer to use in talking about the document is that it provides us with a framework which informs and guides our thinking and decision making. And, whilst the Rating Strategy needs to stand alone so that it can be discussed and considered on its merits with its purpose and intent clearly articulated and understood, nevertheless in practice it becomes an integral part of our budget process each year. Over the years, Council has always had the ability to levy what is called differential rates but has only implemented this approach in respect of rural properties over 40 hectares. Most small rural councils implement a number of differential rates, whether for business/industry, various categories of farming, tourism, or vacant/developable land, for example, which they have determined to be in the best interests of their community. In this newly drafted Rating Strategy we are proposing to introduce two new differential rates - a vacant land differential rate and a commercial/industrial differential rate. This will give us a broader based approach to rating in general and allow us to make adjustments over coming years in a way we have not been able to do to date. It will also bring us closer to the ways by which other small councils construct their rates.

You will recall the letter I sent out in the middle of last year, which identified a number of options that had the potential for being incorporated into our budget planning process. The introduction of other differential rating categories was one of these, so this also forms part of our reasoning for redrafting the framework for calculating rates in the way we have.

Given the critical role that rates play in enabling us to deliver the many and varied services that we do - over 100 altogether - and that rates comprise about half of what is needed for our overall budget, we are very conscious not only of the impact this decision making has on our community but also that the whole matter of rates is complex and can be hard to understand.

The discussion is too long to repeat here, but I encourage you to read the document, to think through the issues and to provide comments by the due date which is 5 March 2015. All such submissions will be considered by Council at a Special Meeting to be held on 11 March 2015. I would also encourage you to speak to Council officers or any of the Councillors if you need something to be clarified or explained.

And on a positive note, recently I had the pleasure of meeting with the new Minister for Regional Development, the Hon. Jaala Pulford, when she came to visit Marysville to have a tour of the new Vibe Hotel and Conference Centre which is due to open shortly. There was the opportunity for a wide ranging discussion on a number of issues which affect us, and we look forward to working closely with the Minister and her department in progressing those initiatives that will add economic benefit to our Shire.



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Venom Banking: Unlocking the potential of Victorian Venom

Samples from some of Australia's most venomous wildlife are helping Victorian scientists explore the medical potential of venom through Australia's first publically available venom bank.

The Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning's (DELWP) Arthur Rylah Institute (ARI), Museum Victoria and University of Melbourne's Australian Venom Research Unit (AVRU) have established the Victorian Venom Bank using funds from the McCoy Seed Fund.

ARI Senior Scientist Nick Clemann said: "Most Victorian snakes are venomous, as is the male Platypus and many invertebrates, but there is limited knowledge about the venom of these animals, so we are establishing a bank of specimens for researchers investigating their potential use in medical and taxonomic research."

"Ultimately we aim to have as many venomous species as possible in the collection, including snakes, spiders, scorpions and the Blue-ringed Octopus. Each specimen will have a matching sample of its own venom stored."

"We've been finding and catching venomous snakes, and milking them for their venom. To date we have secured specimens of Tiger Snakes, both Victorian species of Copperhead Snakes, White-lipped Snakes and Small-eyed Snakes."

Museum Victoria (MV) Manager of Genetic Resources, Joanna Sumner said: "The collection will be available to scientists conducting research in a variety of fields including development and refinement of antivenoms, development of pharmaceutical or medical applications and studies of the relationships within and between species."

"This will be the first publicly available venom library. This is an exciting opportunity for us as we'll be able to provide venom samples and matched tissue samples from specimens we hold in the State's collection. "This means that researchers can use techniques such as next generation sequencing to greatly extend the scope of current research on venom and it's derivatives." Dr Sumner said.

Australian Venom Research Unit (AVRU) Investigator Ken Winkel said: "This collaboration is an important step in our effort to encourage research into the diverse uses of venom."

"Whilst the possibility of new drugs from venom leads is exciting, we also have an immediate interest in better understanding how good current antivenoms are at neutralising the effects of Victorian snakes," Dr Winkel said.

"In particular, little research has focused on the variation in toxins found in the various Tiger 'type snakes' that we treat with Tiger Snake antivenom. This project will begin by focusing on these types of snakes and their venom variation."

An update on Princess Evie of Marysville! (The nurses named her this and she just loves it so that is what we will refer to her as .)

Evie is in consolidation phase of Chemo, she is still classed as high risk even though her response to first round was good, purely because her counts were very high at admission she will continue on a high risk protocol through out the rest of her 2 1/2 year treatment.

We are currently in a townhouse, with daily visits from a nurse 4 times a week to administer a chemo drug that we will eventually give ourselves through her insoflon (butterfly). Bloods still couple times a week and a lumbar puncture with chemo in spine every Friday for a few weeks. And some long days of chemo in day oncology thrown in also.

At the moment she is in great spirits the nurse today was very surprised with her energy and courage. That's our girl!!! So extremely proud of her courage everyday, she doesn't like it but she has relented that it has to be done so she just gets it done!

She does not like her butterfly in her tummy and is very anxious about it, she does not want to look at herself or have anyone else look at her tummy! This is gut wrenching and heartbreaking for me to hear her say every time I change her nappy or get her dressed! I'm sure she will get used to it but for now she just hates it!

By tomorrow she will have no neutrophils and will once again be neutropenic (no immunity). Fingers crossed we can stay out of hospital

This time round! But have been told it's quite likely we will go back in!

So we are just soaking up every little bit of the happy well Evie we have once again, hoping that this round doesn't start knocking her around to much!!

Once again please always remember how much we appreciate every single persons love and support not one thing goes un noticed, and one day, one day! We can't wait to personally thank you all! X

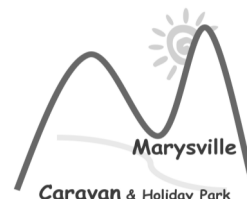
