Foundation congratulates successful projects funded by the first grant round

The Marysville and Triangle Community Foundation (MTCF) are proud to announce the successful projects funded as a result of its first Bushfire Recovery Fund grant round.

The Foundation provided grants totalling nearly \$100,000 to support 11 projects.

"These projects will result in providing assistance to those affected by the 2009 bushfires in Murrindindi Shire," said MTCF Chair, Tony Thompson. "The board of directors of the Marysville and Triangle Community Foundation were delighted with the interest we received in our first grant round and we look forward to seeing the projects implemented for the benefit of our community."

The grants were assessed according to the criteria required by the Victorian Bushfire Appeal Fund (VBAF). The primary objective of the grant program is to assist communities in their recovery from the 2009 bushfires.

The Foundation will continue to operate the Bushfire Recovery Fund grant program in 2015, and details will be announced soon.

Applicants with ideas for projects for the 2015 funding year are encouraged to commence initial discussions with the Executive Officer, Robyn Hill. "The purpose of the initial discussions is to confirm that projects are eligible for funding, to provide advice about how the MTCF's online grant program works and to be a resource for queries about grant applications", said Robyn Hill.

The board of directors has completed a strategic planning process for activities in 2015 which reflect the vision of the Foundation ... to build a legacy for a vibrant, healthy and resilient future across the communities of Murrindindi. This includes establishing a formal arrangements for the establishment of a new trust fund using funds received last year from the State Government following from the sale of Marysville Central.

Mayor's Chair Cr Margaret Rae

As the draft budget time is rapidly approaching, I thought I would take the opportunity to articulate the steps that need to be undertaken during the budget process. I have at times heard comments or expectations that everything would sit tidily in one place or in one document from the beginning so that it is more cohesive. However, the requirements of local government do not provide for a simple one-step process.

This has advantages and disadvantages. For those who want to see the whole rationale in one document from the beginning, it can feel frustrating. To them I say, please be patient as there are required steps we have to undertake. For others, the step process is more helpful as the information comes in relevant 'packages' and can be assimilated according to the reader's situation. Not everyone wants to understand or comment on everything. As each component is finalised, they are brought together to make the final document.

The best way to think of the process is like using building blocks. Firstly, there needs to be a plan - the Council Plan - which articulates the broad strategies to be followed. This is set every four years with annual review and revision.

The Capital Works Program has to be developed with detailed consideration of the condition of our assets and the needs of the various communities in the light of the resources likely to be available to us.

The Strategic Resource Plan sets out where we want to be and how we see things evolving over the next ten years. This is a transparent and accountable way of planning and showing the financial pathway over that period of time.

The Rating Strategy sits in a separate document and is revised and reviewed periodically. Rates comprise approximately 50% of our revenue so this strategy needs to set out the most equitable method of collecting that contribution within defined parameters. When the strategy is revised, it needs to go through its own consultation process and adoption before it can be incorporated into the budget calculations.

The annual Budget is the final step in the sequence. The detail of this cannot in reality be finalised until assessment, consideration and, where necessary, adoption of the other components has taken place. Each of these is a separate component to be incorporated into the budget process and, although contingent on each other and integral to the annual Budget, is nevertheless required to be assessed and analysed separately.

This information is clearly disseminated and made available to our community and, while at times we may receive criticism for the degree of success in achieving that, we can only use the means at our disposal, whether print, broadcast or electronic media - and there are also legislative requirements for these processes to which we must adhere.

So currently the Council Plan is being reviewed, our Capital Works Program is in draft form, our Strategic Resource Plan is being reviewed and is close to draft form, our draft Rating Strategy is on exhibition for consideration and we are much closer to compiling the draft Budget. Once each of these is ready, the combined documents will be released on exhibition for consideration and comment by the community.

Bushfire Rebuilding Sessions

Temporary Bushfire Planning Provisions (Planning Consents) were created by the State Government to simplify the planning process for those who had their homes destroyed or badly damaged in the 2009 bushfires.

These Provisions are coming to an end on 30 April 2015.

To assist residents who are yet to submit an application to rebuild, Council is holding two bushfire rebuilding sessions which will be attended by Planning, Building, Infrastructure and Environmental Health Officers.

These sessions will provide an opportunity for residents to be taken through the application process while having the necessary staff and information available to answer all your questions and queries.

A representative from Council's Economic Development Unit will also be in attendance to assist with any commercial investment or business related opportunities / enquiries.

If your property was affected by the 2009 bushfires and a house was destroyed or damaged that has not yet been rebuilt, or you wish to discuss a development opportunity, you are encouraged to attend one of these sessions.

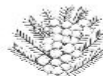

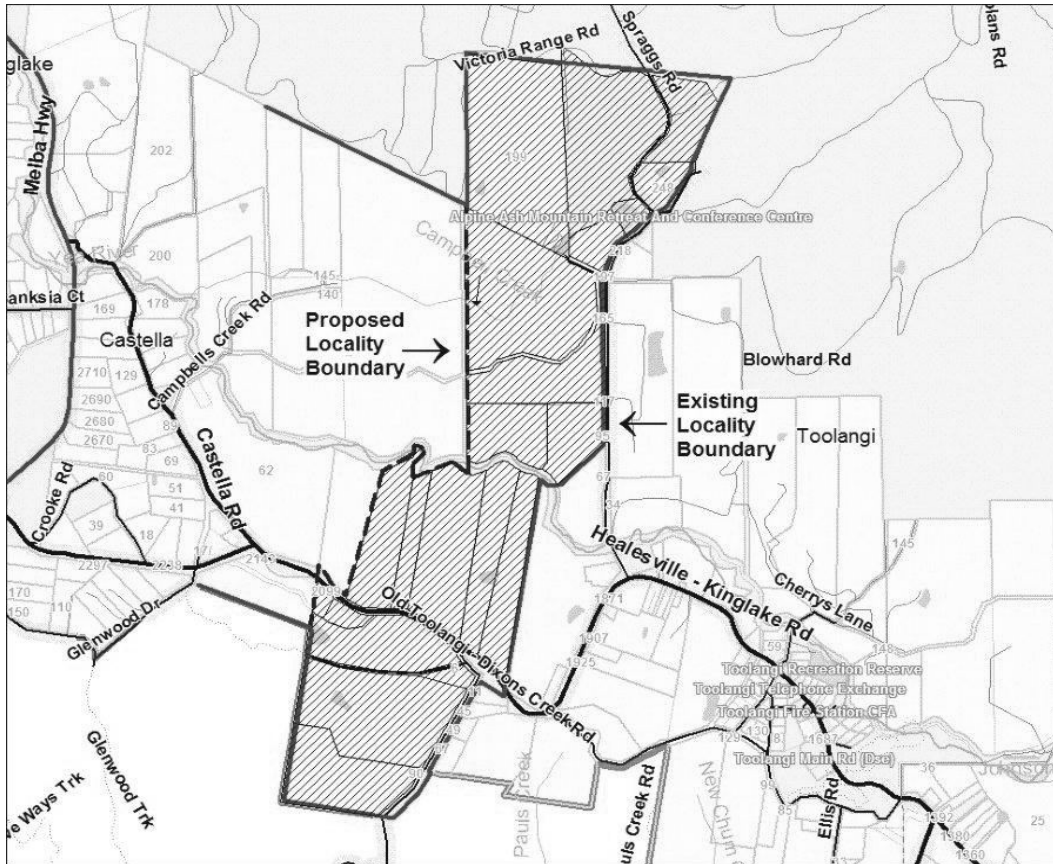
Council is initiating this process in response to requests received from the community and the results of a survey conducted by Council of affected landholders in the area.

Elkanah GARDEN News

HISTORY

Elkanah was formed 40+ Years ago, when a group of Christian businessmen successfully took over the old Marymeadows guesthouse on Buxton Road Marysville. This was a 75 bed, old fashioned building, constructed in 1936 by Eric Dowdle who built a series of guesthouse in Marysville and else-where. These were very popular in the 1920's, 30's, 40's and 50's. Then people bought cars and they favoured motels and caravan parks. The guesthouse model was somewhat lost.

Elkanah, during the 70's to 2009, catered for Christian Camping and Conferences, Missionary conferences and Marriage Enrichment courses. A Christian Counsellor was part of the staff and still is.

The old Elkanah Board of Management tell astounding tales of how they rescued this old building from ruin with black berries and white ant infestation. The results were amazing. People still speak with love, about how their spirit was revived and relationships rebuilt because of the kindness of the Elkanah staff.

Many of the staff were volunteer.

The 2009 Black Saturday Bush Fires engulfed the entire building. Insurance finance rebuilt half of the original accommodation. This is a most stylish building with a stunning entrance, which features a spiral staircase. In fact the whole building is one that gives a feeling of security and beauty. Many people say a feeling of peace descends as soon as you step inside the building. The accommodation is four and a half star with beautiful balconies for every room.

Elkanah's name comes from the Bible meaning "God's Possession". Elkanah is a Not for Profit organisation devoted to guests who need "refreshment", and sometimes private counselling, Marriage Enrichment courses and other conferences are available for all ages. Everybody is welcome. There are employment and training positions for going back into the work force. This is designed for people who lack confidence or have a disability. A government, "Work for the Dole" scheme.

The dining room is superb and provides a large and diverse menu to suit all tastes as well as take away. This is for tourists and residents of Marysville as well as Elkanah guests.

There is a second part of Elkanah called Elkanah Village which consists of several cottages of various sizes for self cater couples and groups. This is in demand. Some of the cottages have yet to be completed.

The new Elkanah is staffed by local residents who have formed a tight and enthusiastic working team. Added to this is the team of Volunteers who support and guide the operation. Old customers have returned to create the old wonderful effect.

The patron of Elkanah is the bionic ear discoverer, Professor Graeme Clarke.

THE GARDEN

As soon as Elkanah was up and running in.....current staff have done a fine job to begin the initial landscaping. In January, volunteers met to create a volunteer gardening team. A master gardener, Landscape Garden Designer..... has taken soil sample and obtained cost price watering gear from.....

The above is an exciting break- through. Many ideas such as a memorial garden, waterways design and terracing have been put forward. We now call on anyone who would like to join the team to come forward.

We are also asking if anyone has any plants to donate. Work will begin 1st

March to begin planting tough plants. Any plants that are frost resistant will be a suitable for Blue Lotus Garden.

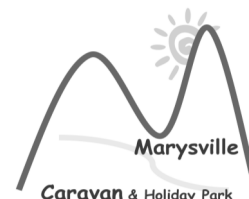

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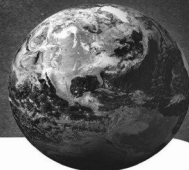

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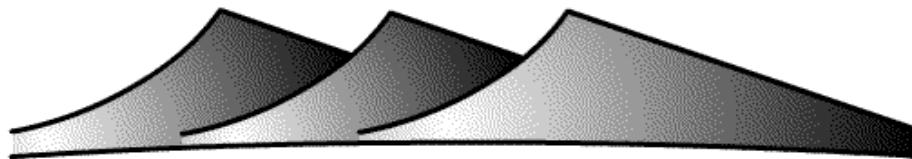
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SOUTH CATHEDRAL LANDCARE GROUP

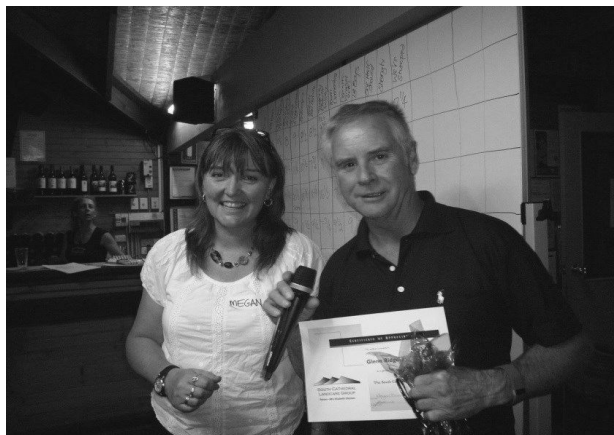
