Mayor's Chair Cr Margaret Rae

As you read this we will have just enjoyed a long weekend – this time for Labour Day. Though not often reflected on these days, the origins of Labour Day in 1856 have served much to set the framework for our daily lives. It celebrates the achievements of workers and in particular the eight hour day movement, advocating eight hours for work, eight hours for recreation and eight hours for rest. Whilst initially a time for marches and demonstrations, nowadays it is a public holiday – albeit celebrated at different times of the year in different States – when families and friends take the opportunity to relax and spend time together.

However, we should not overlook the fact that the patterns of work have moved over recent years and many find themselves working or volunteering over such holiday breaks, whether in tourism, hospitality or in essential services. So while the eight hour day concept has prevailed, this is now part of a seven day week approach to life rather than the more traditional working week with weekends. Whichever applies to you, work is nevertheless important to all of us. We recognise that we need to work to live, but it is more than that. Work needs to be meaningful, productive and provide opportunity. To achieve that, it needs to be supported by education, technology and resources. For councils, which in many instances are seen to sit between their communities and their aspirations, this is particularly challenging – they know what needs to be done but clearly cannot be the 'doer', as it were.

So they need to take on the role of advocate – something we take very seriously. Whether this involves hosting overseas business delegations, representing community interests and opportunities at regional expos, or giving detailed briefings to parliamentary representatives including lengthy tours of the shire to provide context and examples of what is happening 'on the ground'. Together with a host of other things, much time and effort is spent in building those contacts and conduits to enable our voice to be heard on behalf of all.

And how does all this help, I hear you ask.

The simple answer is – you don't know, at least in the short term, and it is almost impossible to quantify. It is much like advertising – how many of you know what advertising works for you and when? But does it stop you doing it? No, of course not. The real point is that we don't stop trying just because we can't measure every component in a given timeframe. If no-one ever worked for change, change wouldn't happen.

If our predecessors in 1856 had not lobbied so hard for the change they wanted, which took many years to achieve, we may well not be experiencing the more comfortable standard of living we enjoy today with the current recognition of the value of work/life balance in our lives.

Change takes time, effort and commitment. The results ultimately speak for themselves.

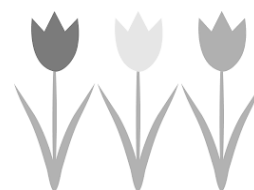

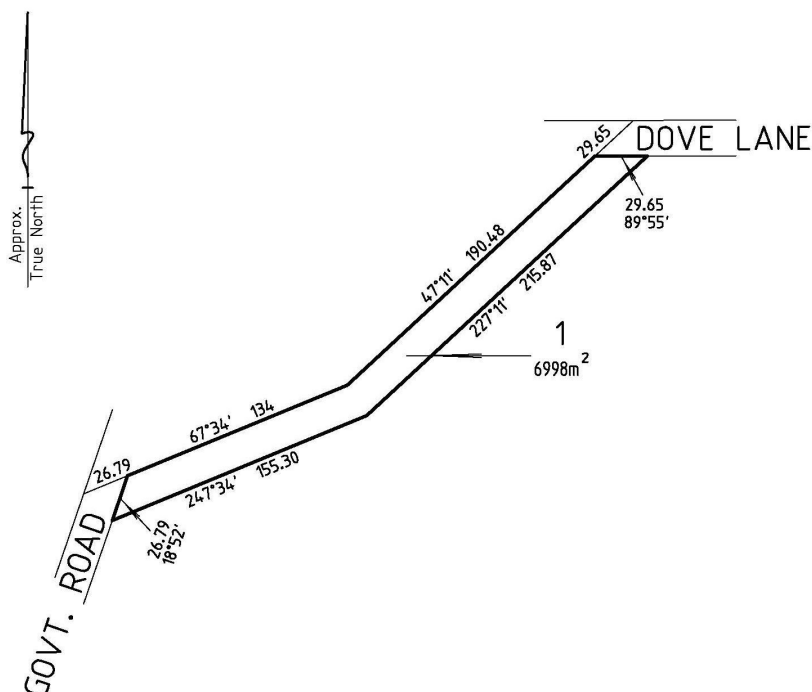

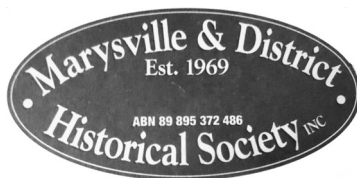
