Mayor's Chair Cr Margaret Rae

Lately I have had a number of conversations with our community, both individually and with groups, in which I have had the opportunity to explain the challenges and difficulties that face local government and our Shire in particular, and the approach we are developing to deal with these going forward

The outreach to the community we undertook last year in which we identified a number of options to enable us to bridge our financial gap provided valuable feedback. The strongest preferences were for the introduction of differential rates and for reducing the level of support provided to operate, maintain and renew our assets together with the transfer, closure or sale of identified assets. There was little support for the 'one-off, silver bullet' approach to bridging the gap from anyone, I might add

The discussions that have taken place since have resulted in the development of a framework which applies a mix of the options which we believe will not only address the shortfall but also provide a methodology for mitigating the impact of rates over the longer term.

The approach has four key elements:

- the consideration of new differential rating categories by Council following community consultation;
- the reduction of financial support for a range of assets by transferring support for those assets for which we have no responsibility to their own responsible body, and by the sale of appropriately identified assets;
- engaging with community groups and committees to transfer responsibility for managing and maintaining community assets in order to give our communities a greater say in how community assets – their assets – are managed into the future; and
- the development of a policy in respect of asset renewal which identifies the extent to which renewal for identified assets is assessed as appropriate for their respective communities – reducing commitment to funding renewal at an appropriate level rather than the 100% currently projected in our asset management plans will assist markedly in reducing financial pressure across the board.

These initiatives would need a transition period of one to two years to achieve implementation and we would work closely with the community to achieve the best outcomes. This framework would assist in shaping our Strategic Resource Plan which would then show the benefits of this approach. Notwithstanding the pressures caused by the additional loss of revenue through the freezing of indexation for the Federal Assistance Grants, a reduction in Victorian Grants Commission funding, together with the impact of cost shifting to local government from both State and Federal Governments, we believe we can avoid impacting service delivery by this approach.

We will also have developed a strong case for long term sustainability to take to the Government and/or the Essential Services Commission should that be required in the preparation of future annual budgets.

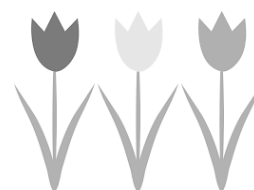

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Councillor Comment

Cr John Walsh—Koriella Ward

Let's get one fact out of the way. In addressing the need to adjust revenue and expenditure to meet the \$1.7 million per year, Council is not just focusing on those who pay a Commercial and Industrial differential rate. The extra funds raised from that proposed differential will be less than 12% of the amount needed by Council and should be seen as a contribution towards the more than \$500,000 annual cost of economic development and tourism and facility support that will continue to be provided to that sector.

For the remainder, we are looking to reduce the bill. Insurance and other costs currently covered by Council for assets we don't own will be handed back to community groups and State Government Departments. Most of those assets are in our small communities who already cover their maintenance, operating and renewal costs. While these savings are small in the overall equation of Council's problems, they will be a major contribution from those communities.

There have been many suggestions that assets are locked up and sold. Usually the suggestions relate to halls and meeting rooms in locations other than the people making the suggestions. There has also been a flavor of *"it's the new assets that have caused the problem so get rid of them"*. The new assets highlighted the need to review all our building related costs and combined with renewal costs for both new and old assets a new approach had to be found by Council.

We have recognised for a while that in many cases, communities with control of their assets can maintain and operate them at a lower cost than Council. Council is often hamstrung by the level of regulation relating to expenditure of public monies. These sometimes result in extra processes that generate increased operating costs. In the coming year, as part of the strategy to meet the \$1.7 million and to provide for reduced annual rate increases in the future, Council will be looking to communities to take management and financial control of Council owned halls, meeting rooms and sporting facilities in their areas. If no-one wants to take on the role then that will also be a good indication of whether the community really wants or needs the facilities thus providing a measure on which assets Council should retain. For some facilities, such as the major halls, we will continue to provide a reduced level of support in recognition that the facility has use beyond the immediate community.

The aim with sporting club-rooms owned by Council is to hand over full responsibility. This may impact some clubs more than others because at the moment Council provides different levels of financial support to different clubs.

Because of problems relating to insurance, OH&S and regulations covering assets like swimming pools, playgrounds and public open space, such facilities are not currently being considered for individual community management.

We will be proposing to the State Government that we provide reduced asset renewal reserves that reflect community needs and don't just perpetuate the current over supply of facilities. The resultant savings together with those achieved through direct community management of assets and on-going Council reviews of organisational efficiency gains will be the major means of covering the \$1.7 million.

Contrary to recent statements, all sectors of the Shire will be contributing to our long term sustainability.

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Operation Chainsaw targets illegal commercial firewood sales

The Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) has launched a statewide operation targeting the illegal commercial sale of firewood sourced from public land.

DELWP Senior Forests Investigator Greg Chant said: "The aim of Operation Chainsaw is to gather information from the community about the illegal sale of firewood from public land and then prosecute anyone found to have broken the law."

"This follows on from last year's Operation Trident which resulted in identifying a large number of people of interest and the prosecution of numerous individuals who were convicted and fined between \$1500 and \$5000 as well as having items such as chainsaws and trailers seized and forfeited to the Crown.

"DELWP regional authorised officers will be conducting investigations to determine the legality of commercial firewood suppliers across Victoria," Mr Chant said.

"We have suspected for numerous years that firewood is being illegally removed from public land and sold. Last year's Operation Trident reinforced that viewpoint. This activity is making a profit from taking firewood that should be available free of charge to the community during the domestic firewood season.

This year's operation will build on experience gained from last year and we will direct our resources efficiently to deter, disrupt and dismantle these illegal activities."

"If you know of anyone who is buying or selling firewood taken from public land illegally we want to know about it. All information provided will be treated in strictest confidence and those persons who supplied information last year are encouraged to do so again by calling DELWP on 136 186."

"Commercial firewood suppliers need to have the appropriate licences and permits to sell firewood obtained from public land. Commercial firewood suppliers must be able to produce their licence or permit to anyone considering buying firewood from them."

"We also want to remind the community that it is illegal to remove firewood from any public land other than a domestic firewood coupe during the designated firewood collection seasons."

"These domestic firewood coupes are not available to commercial firewood sellers."

"By purchasing firewood from unlicensed suppliers, purchasers are undermining legitimate licensed firewood suppliers resulting in increased prices for firewood."

"The illegal sale of firewood is viewed as a serious offence which attracts penalties of up to \$7380 or one year imprisonment or both."

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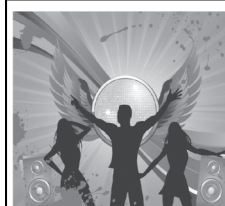


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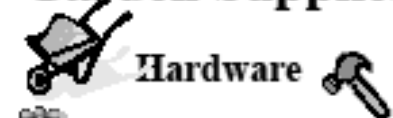
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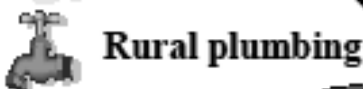
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A BUXTON CHURCH WEDDING
