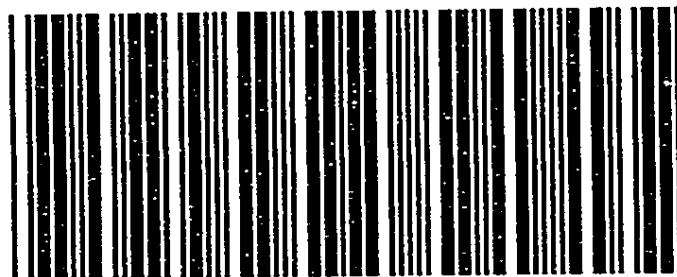

About 5ft 8ins. thin of Sandy complexion, commonly called Syd. He was a mate of mine. At Pozieres we were count attacked on the morning of July 25th 1916, Turner and I with other were sent to reinforce D. Coy, who were being badly pressed, we had just taken up our post when he was "sniped" through the head and killed instantly. He was buried at night by the battalion Pioneers. He was very popular and well liked by all. He came from Brisbane.
