His latest effort "Allwood" tells the story of the shooting of Henry Hurst by the bushranger Burke, in 1866. "Allwood" was the name of the Hurst property within the area that was later to be named Hurstbridge. Henry died of his wounds and was buried on the property. His grave together with other members of the family is now within an enclosure in the grounds of the Hurstbridge Pre-School Centre. Burke and his accomplices were captured and hanged for their crime.

The cast of the film includes members of Nillumbik Historical Society.

Proposed Williamstown Visit

Contacts between President Kath Stephenson and former members of Williamstown Historical Society now living in Eltham have prompted the idea of a society visit to Williamstown. The area is rich in historical associations and many of its many early buildings have been preserved.

A Noteworthy Death

As a general rule we have not commented in this newsletter of the deaths of local identities. The reasons are numerous and include the obvious problem of selection of appropriate criteria for mention. From time to time we hear of the death of someone which prompts a reaction of obvious noteworthiness in terms of local historical interest.

Grace Evelyn Smith died recently and was buried in the Smiths Gully Cemetary alongside her husband Tom. Special arrangements were required for the burial in the now rarely used Cemetary. It may be that this sad event prompts a new interest in the maintainence of the cemetary which has been somewhat neglected in recent years.

Grace was born in 1884, the daughter of goldminer William Joyce of Smiths Gully. Her grandmother was Grace Hopkinson who operated the store at Smiths Gully during the original gold rush in the area. The several brandhes of the family have strong historical links in the area. Included is the Smith family into which she married and which had earlier provided the name of the local area.

Grace and Tom were married in 1907 at St.Andrews and for some time operated butcher's shops at St.Andrews and Panton Hill. In the 1930's they had a butcher's shop in Kew which is still operated by their son. In recent years Grace has lived at Drouin. It is known that many of Grace's memories of her former home have been passed on to family members. Some of these were recorded by the Society about 2 years ago during an excursion to Smiths Gully attended by members and descendants of the Joyce and Smith families.

It is hoped that the family can record the known information before it fades from memory.

Recent Events

The Society's Annual General Meeting was well attended and those present included a number of new members. The formal business of the meeting included the annual reports of the President, Secretary and Treasurer. Generally these reports indicated a year of achievements and varied activity but of less than desirable interest in terms of attendance at society functions.

Following the formal part of the meeting members joined in a discussion of Eltham memories with Mrs.H.Bird, Mr.F.Burgoyne, Mr.G.Burgess and Mr.J.Read.

All of these people are residents of long standing and were able to provide many interesting anecdoes which were taped for the Society's records.

The walk along the old Maroodah Aqueduct on 22nd March, 1981 was poorly attended. Those members who did come spent an enjoyable afternoon exploring unfamiliar areas of Research and Kangaroo Ground as well as inspecting this important item of more than just local significance.
